## FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structural strength.

\*\*\*There were two wire ends from the enclosure fencing which were pointing into the entrance of one of the Jungle Cat's shelters. These wire ends were creating sharp points which were protruding into the shelter at the animal's level. These sharp points increase the risk of injury to the animal. The licensee must ensure that all housing facilities are structurally sound and maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals at all times. This noncompliant item was corrected at the time of inspection.

## FACILITIES, GENERAL.

\*\*\*The drainage trough inside the tigers' and liger's shelter facility leads out to the concrete directly adjacent to their primary enclosure. There was an accumulation of animal bedding, food waste, dirt and debris present in the drainage trough, on the concrete adjacent to the animals' fenced enclosure as well as under an access ramp leading into the shelter for the animals. A portion of an old deer carcass, straw and other organic material was observed under the access ramp inside the animals' enclosure. According to the licensee, the straw used for animal bedding inside the shelter had been cleaned out approximately 1 week ago. According to the licensee, the waste trough drains by gravity and the excess waste in the trough, on the concrete and under the ramp is manually scooped up with the last time being at least 2 weeks ago. This accumulation of animal bedding, food waste, dirt and debris increases the risk of odors and disease hazards. The licensee must ensure that the removal and disposal of animal and food wastes, bedding, dead animals, trash and debris are provided as necessary to minimize vermin infestation, odors and disease hazards.
