Appendix 3: Supplemental (Non-Vacancy Specific) Recruitment Activities Undertaken by KCCU

Description of Activities:

Job Fairs:

KCCU personnel set-up a booth and had an active presence at the *Red River Career Expo* at Cameron University, Lawton, Oklahoma on February 16, 2017. Various staff members were present at the booth throughout the day to answer questions from interested parties and students and offer advice on careers in the broadcast industry.

KCCU personnel set-up a booth and had an active presence at the OAB / OBEA (Oklahoma Association of Broadcasters / Oklahoma Broadcast Education Association) Student Day and Job Fair at the Hard Rock Hotel in Tulsa, Oklahoma on March 30, 2017. News Director, Clinton Wieden staffed the booth throughout that day, answered questions from interested parties and students and offered advice on careers in the broadcast industry. After the job fair, staff members attended the OBEA Student Awards Ceremony.

College Lectures:

Station Manager and Operations Director, Cynthia Sosa gave a lecture to the Cameron University JRMP 1313 “Basic Radio Production” class on March 7, 2017. During the lectures, she touched on the following topics:

- Discussed with students KCCU’s history and network of stations.
- Discussed career opportunities in broadcasting, television and radio.
- Discussed internship opportunities available at KCCU.
- Discussed opportunities to take book knowledge and get practical experience while taking lab classes and interning at KCCU.
- Discussed opportunities for students to hone vocal communications and improve radio-television presentation and delivery.
- Discussed student opportunities to work on professional equipment and learn various aspects of radio station operation, including public service announcement (PSA) production, news production and news gathering.
- Discussed with students preparation for and participation in all phases of radio possible at KCCU.
- Discussed with students opportunities at KCCU for them to practice writing for broadcast.

Internship / Broadcasting Lab:

As a department of Cameron University, KCCU facilitates the education of Cameron University students by supplying positions for students involved in Cameron University's Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communications.

The mission of the Communications program is to support Cameron University's mission of offering educational opportunities for a diverse student body. The program strives to develop students' intellectual capacities, prepares students for entry into graduate school and communication-related professions, and plays a role in general education.

Each semester, KCCU hosts several students involved in CU's Communications curriculum, including students enrolled in the following courses:

- RTV3911 Radio Lab - Preparation for and participation in all phases of radio and television; may be repeated. Prerequisite: Department permission.
- RTV4923 Practicum - Supervised work experience in a professional setting which relates to the student's career objectives. The internship will allow practical experience in radio/television. May be repeated for a maximum of six hours. Prerequisites: Upper division standing and department permission.

Students are involved in writing and producing PSAs, news writing and production, and other duties as assigned by staff. KCCU staff assigns the students their letter-grade for the course(s).
