<b>Narrative Text:</b> Companies were dispatched to a structure fire and observed an extremely large column of smoke from the station. On arrival there was evidence of an apparent explosion, a large body of fire and very little of the original fire building (JJ's Restaurant) standing. The fire extended upwards more than 100 feet from the roofline of the fire building and was impinging on a 5 story building to the North/C exposure. The East/B exposure was a 2 story doctor's office/spa. It sustained structural damage from the blast and eventually had fire on 2 floors. Occasionally blue flames were visible emanating from the ground on the West side of the building, indicating natural gas leaking from the ground. Companies found victims of the blast in front of the restaurant lying on the ground or in the process of self-extricating. Witnesses told crews of more victims inside the restaurant, but none were found using a quck search of the collapsing structure. Victims were moved across the street where a medical sector was set up. M36 had responded from their post at Station 19 and was Medical Sector. BC Baker assumed command, ordered a working fire response and filled out the first alarm, ordered police for traffic and ordered C120 as Medical Sector officer followed by a request for a PD for traffic, and a second alarm. Comapanies immediately caught a hydrant and set up for handline and flypipe operations to the original fire building, while M36 and P32 provided medical assistance to victims. Companies entered the C-side exposure and found sprinklers operating and fire inside the structure, those companies had no standpipe and stretched a handline from the pumper to knock fires in the building and later, using a vantage point inside the C-exposure, the original fire building. A third and eventually fourth alarm was struck. DC Grote assumed command and BC Baker was named Operations Chief. Fire was observed in the B-side exposure and P17 and R31 entered to complete a primary and secondary search and extinguish fires on two floors. P19 used used handlines to extinguish fires in the restaurant and cool off a nearby truck containing flammables that construction company reps told crews was being used on the high rise building under construction across the street. Command staff consulted restaurant employees to ascertain number and location of the missing. MGE opened the pavement in 2 locations to close a gas line that was feding the fires and hindering extinguishment. After knockdown and overhaul, companies, assisted by dogs, searched for a missing victim. Much time was spent looking for a victim without success, in deteriorating conditions. There were waist-deep holes full of water and frigid conditions, and		



crews had been operating for several hours. At approximately 0200, command was terminated and all fire crews were in service, leaving police guarding the perimeter. P47 and T8 were later dispatched to oversee the site and were relieved at shift change by C106, P32 and T7. Recovery operations resumed after daylight and a victim was found subsequently.

**Title: Fire Investigator**

**Type: 1 - Incident**

**Narrative Text:**

Upon my arrival on-scene of this incident was at a Second Alarm level having heavy fire out of the involved structure and in the middle of the street on 48th Street east of Belleview. I made contact with Deputy Chief Grote and assisted with man power status and emergency transportation of injured. This incident was upgraded to a Forth Alarm Level. This fire incident was a joint investigation to include Kansas City Police Bomb and Arson Unit; Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATFE) and the Kansas City Fire Department's Fire Prevention Division. EMS reported they transported 7 injured to area hospitals where some were treated and moved to other hospital do to injuries. While check hospitals it was found that 7 patients were self-transported for care to the hospitals.

I observed the involved structure front faced towards the south with the entire roof collapsed down into the building. I observed the west side wall was still standing and the south wall collapsed and lying on the sidewalk and on 48th Street. I observed the east wall had collapsed and the north wall was attached to the north building which received heavy fire damage above the roof line. I observed the north structure was a five-story building with heavy fire damage to the upper exterior wall with the windows out with moderate fire spread inside south side rooms. I was advised that Pumper-19 had responded prior with report of a gas leak on 48th Street and made a request to have the candles and pilot lights on the stove and hot water heater to be shut off for safety of the people inside JJ's Restaurant.

I observed the structure to the east with the west exterior wall façade fallen off the interior wall studs approximately over 25 feet from the south end to the north end of the structure with both the first and second floor levels damaged. I observed the large 12 story building that was under construction located on the south side and across the street had both large and small glass windows broken out or cracked to over 30 windows. I was further advised that fire debris from the explosion had landed on the top of the roof of the building. I observed the structure located to the southwest side across the street had various broken out window panes and that fire crews made force entry by breaking out the doors glass panes to make entry to ensure there was no gas inside the structure. Additional structures may have received damage not visible from the site area and maybe reported later to insurance.

The area fire scene was controlled by KCPD over night to allow the investigation the following morning. The investigation team returned the following morning to the scene and make contact with the owner for his information. I received information along with other information as to the located where the missing female could have been located prior to the collapse of the structure. Information lead to the bar area of the restaurant and fire crews with KCPD began to removed large fire debris and to remove other debris located the remains of a body on the center south section near the bar. A complete interior check using the cadaver dogs was completed finding no other indications of possible more individuals under the fire debris.

A contractor crew was hired to assist our investigation and fire debris along the south side of the exterior wall material was removed from the site. I made contact with the restaurant manager and when I asked him if the fire department advised him to put the flames out on the candles, stove and hot water heater? He stated that they did tell them to put out the candles and the pilot flames on the stove and hot water heater. I asked him if they got all the flames out and he said they only put the candles out and turn the stove off but did not turn out the pilot lights for the stove or hot water heater.

A joint determination cause from the three investigating agency's determined this was an accidental incident caused by an underground gas line being damage that produced a natural gas release outside of JJ's Restaurant with ATFE completing the written report of the incidents investigation. The scene was turned over to Missouri Public Service Regulator Gas Pipeline Safety and OSHA for fully understand of the events that led up to the explosion. Detective Luster of Police Bomb and Arson took a Dead Body report #13012160 for this incident.

Upon arrival a 412 - Gas leak (natural gas or LPG) incident was found.  The primary property use is 161 - Restaurant or cafeteria.  Unit P19, the first arriving unit, arrived at 17:04:37. The last unit on scene, P19, cleared the scene at 17:17:00.  Actions taken by the primary responding units were: 86 - Investigate; 92 - Standby and 00 - Action taken, other.  A total of 1 apparatus and 4 personnel responded to this call.  Upon arrival we were met by construction workers who informed us that they punctured a gas line causing a steady leak. We asked if MGE was notified and they confirmed that they were. We then entered JJ's restaurant to warn management of the situation with the gas leak. Upon entrance of restaurant we could smell gas and told management to put out all ignition sources in the kitchen and throughout the establishment. Staff started to extinguish all candles on tables and the manager informed us that they were shutting down the kitchen and all ignition sources. Mge arrived on the scene and they inspected the gas leak and informed us that equipment was on the way. We asked MGE what he needed us to do, and he stated that the equipment was coming from Raymore and that he had the situation under control. He then advised us that we could leave the scene with him. We then entered JJ's again to notify them that gas service had equipment on the way but it may be a little while before the leak would be fixed. We stressed again that JJ's management should keep all ingition sources off ,and should wait for MGE to notify them of an all clear. We then cleared the scene leaving it with MGE.
