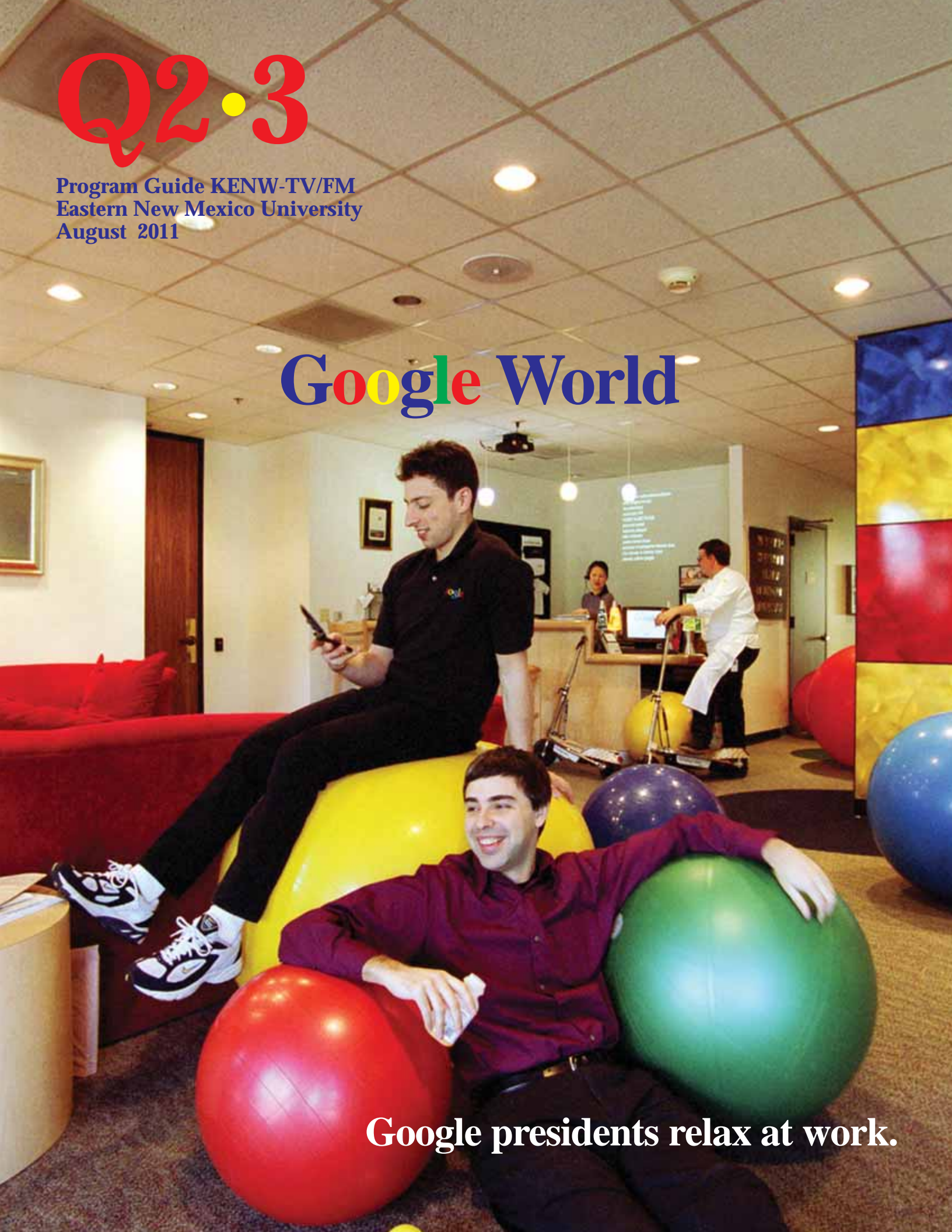

Enola Gay's Navigator: Theodore "Dutch" Van Kirk

Enola Gay's Navigator: Theodore "Dutch" Van Kirk tells the story of the man who was the navigator on the first atomic bomb mission, which took place sixty-six years ago this month. Earlier in his career, Van Kirk had flown 58 missions in England and North Africa. When he returned to the United States, he was assigned to navigation training and in November 1944, became group navigator of the 509th Composite Group training for atom bomb delivery. The unit that dropped the atomic bombs was activated at Wendover Army Air Field, Utah, December 17th, 1944. The crews trained with practice bombs called "pumpkins" because of their size and shape, which was the same as the "Fat Man" atomic bomb.

Quietly, in June 1945, the 509th started moving overseas to the Pacific island of Tinian in the Marianas chain. It was a self-contained unit, with personnel strength of about 1770. At 2:30 a.m. on August 6th, 1945, the Enola Gay lifted off North Field en route to Hiroshima, Japan. At exactly 08:15:15, the world's first atomic bomb exploded. The Enola Gay landed back on Tinian Island at 2:58 p.m. "I knew when we hit the coast of Japan we were well on the way to completing a successful mission and the new bomb we carried would be a great help in shortening the war," Van Kirk said.

After the war, the Group returned to the United States and was assigned to Roswell Army Air Base, N.M. It was redesignated the 509th Bombardment Group in 1946 and the 509th Bombardment Wing in 1947. In the 1990s, the Air Force assigned all of its B-2 bombers to 509th, based at Whiteman AFB, Mo.

KENV-TV is Now on Both DirecTV and Dish Network Satellite

Both Dish Network and DirecTV Satellite services are now carrying KENV-TV in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe Designated Market Area (DMA). This DMA includes all counties in New Mexico except Roosevelt, Curry, Quay, Union, and Dona Ana. DirecTV is carrying the KENV-TV High Definitions Channel (HD 3-1) on its HD channel 3 and the KENV-TV Standard Definition (SD 3-2) on channel 3. Dish Network is carrying the KENV-TV SD signal on its channel 3.

The Nielsen Company decides which counties go into the various DMAs. At the present time, there are 210 DMAs in the United States. In population size, the Albuquerque-Santa Fe DMA is the 45th largest in the U.S. because it takes in most of the State of New Mexico. Nielsen determines the counties in a DMA by which television stations the viewers in that county are watching.

By Nielsen rules, DirecTV and Dish Network subscribers in Union, Quay, Curry, and Roosevelt counties will receive the Amarillo PBS station. In all other counties of New Mexico, except for Dona Ana, subscribers will receive PBS from KENV-TV (Portales) and KNME-TV (Albuquerque). Dona Ana is in the El Paso DMA, and those subscribers will receive PBS from KRWG-TV (Las Cruces) and KCOS-TV (El Paso).


