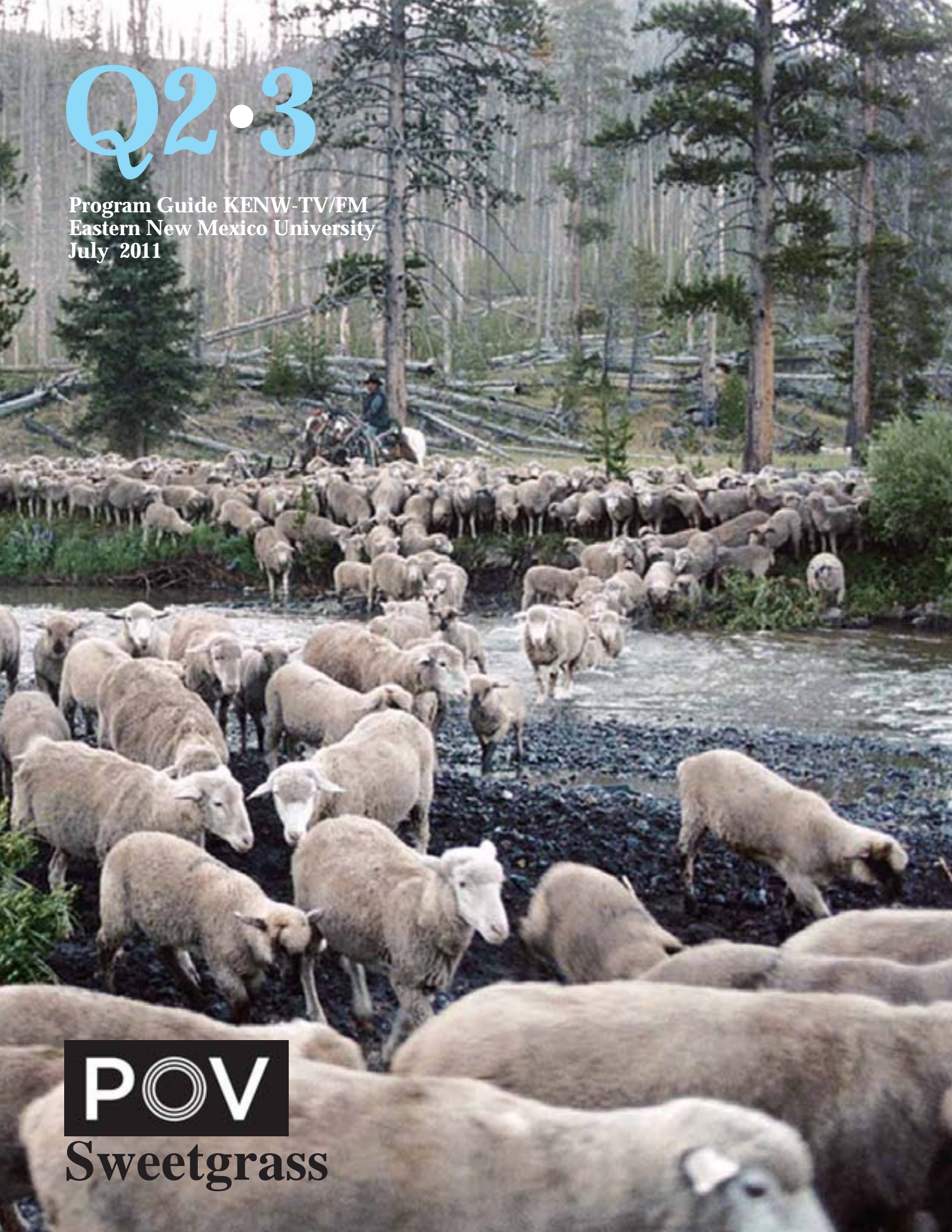

Upholding the law...in his own way *ZEN*

What does an honest cop do when his bosses are on the side of the law-breakers?

Outwitting prosecutors, politicians, mobsters, and run-of-the-mill kidnapers and killers, Detective Aurelio Zen brings justice to modern-day Italy, whether the authorities want it or not, on “Zen,” a trio of spellbinding cases based on the bestselling novels by Michael Dibdin, airing on **Masterpiece Mystery!** this summer.

Dibdin’s “Zen” thrillers are like an Italian vacation gone horribly, crazily wrong. Now they are brought to television in productions that were shot on location around Rome, giving vivid life to the colorful settings, gorgeous women, twisted criminals, and brooding, brilliant hero.

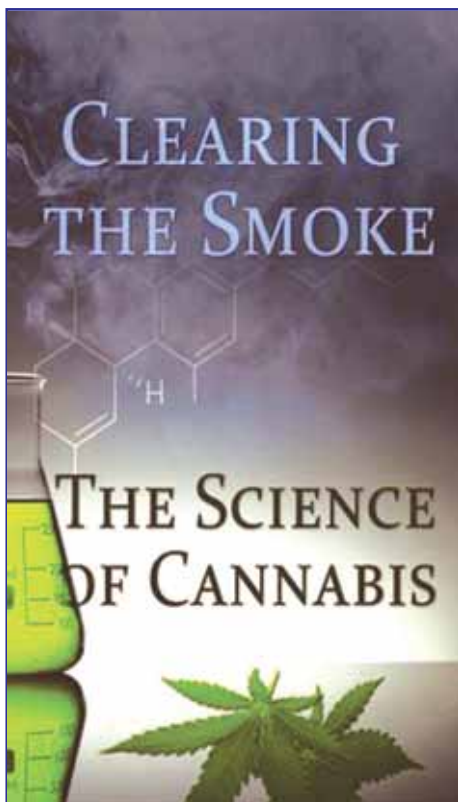
John Denver Rocky Mountain High Live in Japan

John Denver, one of the most beloved American entertainers of the 20th century, obtained international acclaim as a songwriter, actor, environmentalist, and humanitarian. With his trademark blend of acoustic folk, country, and pop, Denver sold more than 40 million albums worldwide and earned two Grammy Awards, an Emmy, two Country Music Awards, and an induction into the Songwriter’s Hall of Fame.

John Denver Rocky Mountain High Live in Japan, an hour-long concert, captures the celebrated musician at the peak of his form in a live 1981 concert from his seven-show tour of Japan.

In front of an enthusiastic crowd, Denver thrills the audience with a set-list of hits and favorites from his remarkable career. Included in the performance are favorites such as “Take Me Home, Country Roads,” “Leaving on a Jet Plane,” “Thank God I’m a Country Boy” and “Rocky Mountain High,” as well as “Starwood in Aspen,” “Follow Me,” “Eagle and the Hawk” and “Goodbye Again.” Denver closes this unforgettable concert experience with three of his greatest hits, “Annie’s Song,” “Calypso” and “Sunshine on My Shoulders.”

Clearing the Smoke: The Science of Cannabis looks beyond the controversies surrounding Medical Marijuana programs and instead, investigates the science. The program reveals how the plant’s chemical compounds act on the brain and the body to potentially treat a myriad of difficult conditions and diseases. Personal stories of relief from pain, nausea, and epileptic seizures frame a scientific discussion of both the therapeutic potential and the very real side effects of cannabis as a medicine.

The documentary details the government restrictions and financial difficulties of doing research on the plant, but it also highlights the legitimate work being done by scientists across the nation, including one South Carolina researcher who is uncovering its potential to treat auto-immune diseases and certain types of cancer.

The Forgotten War: The Struggle for North America

Some 250 years ago an epic struggle for the fate of North America played out right here in our own backyards. We call it the French and Indian War. **The Forgotten War: The Struggle for North America** tells the many powerful stories that make this war so fascinating.

For five years—from 1755 to 1760—France, Britain, and the native peoples of North America fought to decide who would control the Ohio River Valley, the gateway to the west, and the crucial highway of rivers and lakes between New York and the city of Montreal. The rivalry between the French and British for this vast continent had been simmering for a century when war finally erupted in western Pennsylvania.

The British and their colonial militias had the advantage of numbers, while the French had a more important edge: the support of the Indian nations in the region. However, there was one man on the British side—Richard Rogers—who understood how to wage war the way the Indians did. Rogers created a new type of warrior and new rules of warfare. Considered the father of the Special Forces, Rogers established the Rangers—an elite corps of exceptional woodsmen who could fight as well and as fiercely as the native peoples they opposed.

A celebrity in his own time, Rogers was considered a hero by the colonials, an upstart by the British, and the “White Devil” by his Indian enemies. The story of Robert Rogers and his Rangers brings to life the passion, the brutality, and the violence of the fight for North America.

Edward & Wallis — A Story of Love and Destiny

Edward VIII was one of the 20th century's first celebrity superstars—handsome, charming, and adored all over the world. By the age of 30, this British prince was the most desirable bachelor on the planet, an heir to a throne with the magnetism of a Hollywood film star. Instead of accepting his role as the next king, however, Edward chose to give up the throne to marry his twice-divorced American mistress, Wallis Simpson, in a scandal that would shake England to its very foundation.

Edward and Wallis — A Story of Love and Destiny recounts a familiar tale, but from a fascinating new perspective—exploring warning signs that were evident in Edward from an early age that ultimately led to years of scandal and controversy in the 20th century British monarchy.

Only those who knew him best knew the dark truth about Edward, Prince of Wales. During his childhood, his father, King George V, and mother, Queen Mary, were remote figures. Ultimately, Edward was a man unable to face up to his destiny. In his old age, King George V saw this possibility and became convinced that if his son succeeded him, the monarchy would be “in ruins within 12 months.”

Edward and Wallis also explores the events that occurred before Edward ascended the throne, beginning with a chance meeting in 1930 that led to his illicit love affair. The strength of Edward's feelings for Wallis sparked the great Abdication crisis of 1936, and the crown passed to George VI, the current Queen's father. Instead of a coronation in 1937, Edward married Wallis and, as the Duke and Duchess of Windsor, the couple embarked on a lifetime of exile as celebrities outside the monarchy.

Rigoletto from Mantua

Giuseppe Verdi's "Rigoletto"—recorded in the Renaissance splendor of Mantua, Italy, in the actual places and hours of the day specified in the libretto—was broadcast live around the world, or as close as time zones would allow, on September 4th and 5th, 2010. Now, this critically acclaimed broadcast comes to **Great Performances**.

"Rigoletto from Mantua" stars Plácido Domingo in the baritone title role of Rigoletto; Julia Novikova as his innocent daughter, Gilda; Vittorio Grigolo as the womanizing Duke; and Ruggero Raimondi as the assassin Sparafucile. Domingo has a special relationship to "Rigoletto." It was the first opera he ever heard and the character of Borsa was his first operatic role.

Now, Domingo gives voice and soul to Rigoletto, a court jester, who after publicly ridiculing a nobleman, Count Ceprano, is tragically punished by the courtiers for his unforgivable insolence. Gilda, the attractive, sheltered daughter of Rigoletto, pays a heavy price for the errors of her father and the mistaken love for the cynical Duke of Mantua, a powerful and handsome man, intoxicated and driven by the taste of female conquest.

The 2-1/2 hour production of "Rigoletto from Mantua" on **Great Performances** will be broadcast Friday, July 15th at 8:30 p.m.

Iphigénie en Tauride

Gluck's rarely performed masterpiece, "Iphigénie en Tauride," starring Plácido Domingo, Susan Graham, and Paul Groves airs on **Great Performances at the Met**. Prior to the premiere of the production in 2007, which also featured Domingo, Graham, and Groves, the Met hadn't performed Gluck's final opera since 1917.

"Iphigénie en Tauride" ("Iphigenia in Tauris"), based on the Greek myth about a priestess facing the aftermath of her family's violent history, is often considered the culmination of Gluck's life ambition to achieve a perfect union of music and drama.

The 2-hour "Iphigénie en Tauride" on **Great Performances at the Met** can be seen Sunday, July 31st at 1:00 p.m.

On a Wind and a Prayer

On a Wind and a Prayer is the story of one of the most bizarre, obscure, and forgotten stories of World War II—attacks on America from balloon bombs launched from Japan. In late 1944, as World War II came to a close, Japan launched more than 9,000 unmanned bomb-carrying balloons which travelled on prevailing winds across the Pacific Ocean to North America, a three to five day journey. In a last desperate assault, it was hoped that the balloons would start forest fires and cause general panic among the population.

The Japanese Fugo Balloon Bomb Offensive resulted in the first-ever aerial attack on the continental United States by the first-ever intercontinental ballistic missile. Never before in the history of flight had the North American continent been under attacks launched directly from an enemy shore. The balloons reached Alaska, Canada, Mexico, and 16 U.S. states, travelling as far east as Michigan and Texas. One bomb took the lives of six Americans, the only victims of World War II on American soil.

On a Wind and a Prayer presents an in-depth look at the Japanese Fugo Balloon Bomb Offensive and highlights its place in World War II history.

TELLING Amy's Story

Mariska Hargitay

The statistics on domestic violence in this country are staggering. One in three women will experience physical or sexual abuse in her lifetime. More than 32 million Americans are affected by domestic violence each year. And three women—women from every walk of life—are murdered by their intimate partners every day.

Hosted by Mariska Hargitay, probably best known for her role as Detective Olivia Benson in *Law and Order: Special Victims Unit*, and told by Detective Deirdri Fishel, **Telling Amy's Story** follows the timeline of a domestic violence homicide that occurred in 2001. While you watch the 50-minute film, another 700 women will be abused.

According to Hargitay, "I learned about domestic, intimate-partner and sexual violence when I started working on *Law & Order: SVU*. Viewers started sending me letters: 'Hi, my name is Sarah. I'm 42 years old. My husband has been beating me for seven years, and I have never told anyone.'"

Telling Amy's Story lays bare one woman's story and the many missed opportunities to alter its outcome. It is recounted to educate, heal, empower, and—most importantly—save lives.

Amy Homan-McGee, a 33-year-old mother of two, was killed by her husband when she decided to leave him after suffering years of abuse. While Amy's four-year-old and seven-month-old sons waited in the car with her mother, Amy entered her home to retrieve some of her belongings. Her husband, Vincent McGee, was waiting for her and fatally shot her in the head. The victim's parents and co-workers, law enforcement officers, and court personnel share their perspectives on what happened to Amy in the weeks, months, and years leading up to her death.

Telling Amy's Story can be seen Sunday, July 10th at 10:30 p.m. and Monday, July 11th at 9:00 p.m.

From Cheyenne to Pendleton: The Rise and Fall of the Rodeo Cowgirl

From Cheyenne to Pendleton explores the 25-year rise and fall of the western rodeo cowgirl through the lives of Idaho's Bonnie McCarroll, Colorado's Bertha Blancett, and Washington's Mabel Strickland. The 90-minute film follows their lives and achievements while it goes outside of the rodeo to discover where these talented women came from and what led to their eventual removal from the rodeo arena.

The film opens in 1904 as 21-year-old Bertha arrives in Cheyenne, Wyoming, for the 8th annual Frontier Days Rodeo—the first year women were allowed to compete in the bucking bronco competition. The tragic and avoidable death of Bonnie McCarroll at the 1929 Pendleton Round-Up marks the end of the era.

Many historians point to the death of Idaho's beloved cowgirl Bonnie McCarroll in 1929 as the reason for the expulsion of women from the rodeo arena, but in reality, the tide had turned against the cowgirls many years earlier. Throughout the 1920s, the rodeo cowgirl was losing ground to the Rodeo Queen, an invention of the Pendleton Round-Up, which was viewed as the more "appropriate" role for women.

In 1924, Mabel Strickland, a petite 98-pound steer roper, set the world's record at Frontier Days and her accomplishment was written up in newspapers and magazines across the country. Afterwards, both the Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo and the Pendleton Round-Up barred Strickland from competing against the cowboys. By the spring of 1929, the newly formed Rodeo Association of America had already announced that 1929 would be the last year for women in the rodeo.

The film explores a variety of issues: urban vs rural, changing social mores, the Hollywood film industry and, of all things, the price of wheat and cattle. Odd as it may seem, commodity prices reveal a great deal about the level of women's participation in the rodeo.

"Sweetgrass" on **P.O.V.** may well be the last real Western. It offers an unprecedented record of a cowboy way of life at the moment of its disappearance, and a magnificently filmed portrait of a world in which nature and culture, animals and humans are on intimate terms—and sometimes violently at odds.

Lawrence Allestad and family were among the last of the traditional sheepherders of the American West. Under a public grazing permit that had been handed down in his Norwegian-American family for generations, Allestad was the final rancher to drive his herds into Montana's rugged Absaroka-Beartooth range north of Yellowstone to fatten on sweet summer

grass. The family members and their hired hands conducted the drives much as their pioneer forebears had—on horseback, with dogs for herding and guarding, and armed with rifles to frighten away bears and wolves. Over the years, better gear took some of the edges off a hard life, but still the work remained exhausting and dangerous for both men and animals.

By 2001, Allestad realized that not only was he the last old-time sheep rancher, but he was also about to make his last old-time sheep drive. Without narration, "Sweetgrass" lets the camera, often at sheep-level, reveal the drama of the last drive into mountains.



KENW-TV is Now on Both DirecTV and Dish Network Satellite

Both Dish Network and DirecTV Satellite services are now carrying KENW-TV in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe Designated Market Area (DMA). This DMA includes all counties in New Mexico except Roosevelt, Curry, Quay, Union, and Dona Ana. DirecTV is carrying the KENW-TV High Definitions Channel (HD 3-1) on its HD channel 3 and the KENW-TV Standard Definition (SD 3-2) on channel 3. Dish Network is carrying the KENW-TV SD signal on its channel 3.

The Nielsen Company decides which counties go into the various DMAs. At the present time, there are 210 DMAs in the United States. In population size, the Albuquerque-Santa Fe DMA is the 45th largest in the U.S. because it takes in most of the State of New Mexico. Nielsen determines the counties in a DMA by which television stations the viewers in that county are watching.

By Nielsen rules, DirecTV and Dish Network subscribers in Union, Quay, Curry, and Roosevelt counties will receive the Amarillo PBS station. In all other counties of New Mexico, except for Dona Ana, subscribers will receive PBS from KENW-TV (Portales) and KNME-TV (Albuquerque). Dona Ana is in the El Paso DMA, and those subscribers will receive PBS from KRWG-TV (Las Cruces) and KCOS-TV (El Paso).
