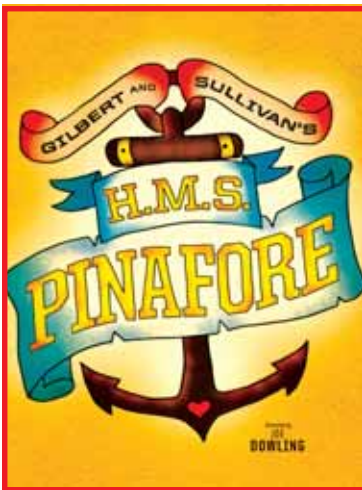

Beginning Friday, October 14th, and continuing every Friday night into December, the **PBS Arts Fall Festival** raises the curtain on a range of performances that transport the stage into America's living rooms.

The **PBS Arts Fall Festival** opens with the premiere of **PBS Arts from Minnesota: Gilbert and Sullivan's HMS Pinafore**. Gilbert and Sullivan's first blockbuster is among the most crowd-pleasing comic musicals in history, loved for its dynamite songs, gleeful entertaining story, and saucy satire. The captain's daughter is in love with an ordinary sailor, but her father has a more sophisticated suitor in mind.

Filled with Sullivan's memorable melodies, **HMS Pinafore** is pure joy and sensational entertainment for everyone, young or old.

**Gilbert and Sullivan's HMS Pinafore** airs Friday, October 14th at 8:30 p.m. It repeats Sunday, October 16th at 1:00 p.m.

Next is **PBS Arts from Seattle: American Masters Pearl Jam Twenty**, carved from over 1,200 hours of rarely and never-before-scene footage and central to a year-long celebration of Pearl Jam's 20-year history.

## Case Histories

### From the Bestselling Mysteries by Kate Atkinson

An ex-cop from Yorkshire jogs across the hills overlooking Edinburgh, listening to mournful American country singers and mulling over his tangled life. It's private investigator Jackson Brodie, played by Jason Isaacs (*Harry Potter*), in a trio of exciting mysteries based on Kate Atkinson's bestselling novels: *Case Histories*.

Atkinson's first novel in the Jackson Brodie series, *Case Histories*, was hailed by Stephen King as the best mystery of the decade after its publication in 2004. She followed it with *One Good Turn* and *When Will There Be Good News?* Each of

the three novels has been adapted in a two-hour episode on this **Masterpiece Mystery!** series.

The authors signature style is to entangle her hero in a web of cases, some involving Jackson's work as a sleuth for hire and others dealing with crimes he chances across in his gritty encounters with Edinburgh's seamier side.

# PROHIBITION

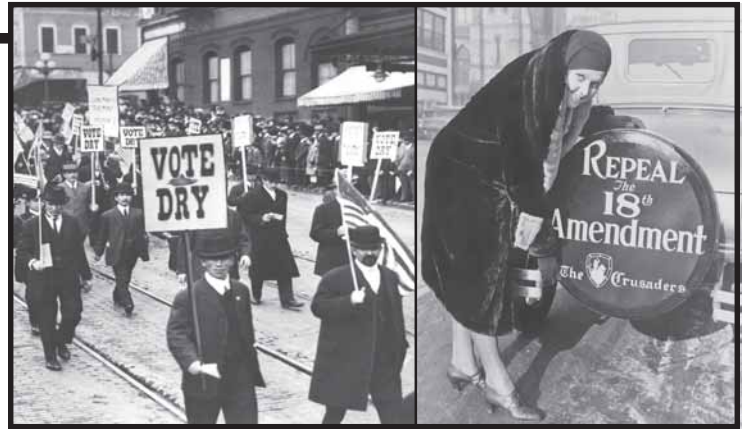
In Ken Burns and Lynn Novick's **Prohibition**, viewers discover the true story of America's "Nobel Experiment." The three-part series goes beyond the oft-told tales of gangsters, rum-runners, flappers, and speakeasies to experience the rise, rule, and fall of the 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, outlawing alcohol.

Since the early years of the American Republic, alcohol has been embedded in the fabric of American culture. But by 1830, the average American over 15 years old consumed nearly seven gallons of pure alcohol a year, three times as much as we drink today. Alcohol abuse wreaked havoc on the lives of many families.

Part one of **Prohibition** is entitled "A Nation of Drunkards." As a wave of spiritual fervor for reform sweeps the country, many women and men begin to see alcohol as a scourge. After the Civil War, the country's population swells with immigrants, who bring their drinking customs with them. The temperance campaign ignites, spearheaded by the Woman's Christian Temperance Union, and the Anti-Saloon League (ASL) forms to push for an amendment to the Constitution, outlawing alcohol nationally.

Most politicians dare not defy the ASL, and in 1917 the 18th Amendment sails through both Houses of Congress; it is ratified by the states in just 13 months. In 1920, prohibition goes into effect, making it illegal to manufacture, transport, or sell intoxicating liquor.

Episode two, "A Nation of Scofflaws," examines the problems of enforcement, as millions of law-abiding Americans become law-breakers overnight. Drys had hoped prohibition would make the country a safer place, but the law has many victims. Honest policemen are killed on the job, unlucky drinkers are poisoned by adulterated liquor, and overzealous federal agents violate civil rights just to make a bust. Alcoholism still exists, and may even be increas-



ing, as women begin to drink in the speakeasies that replace the male-only saloon.

"A Nation of Hypocrites," the final episode, reveals how support for prohibition diminishes in the mid-1920s. By criminalizing one of the nation's largest industries, the law has given savvy gangsters a way to make huge profits, and as they grow in power, rival outfits wreak havoc in cities across the country.

By the late 1920s, many American women believe that the "Noble Experiment" has failed. Wealthy Pauline Sabin unifies women of all classes and denounces the law itself as the greatest threat to their families. Sabin and others argue that repeal will bring in tax revenue and provide desperately needed jobs.

After the election of Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1932, Congress easily passes the 21st Amendment, which repeals the 18th, and the states quickly ratify it. In December of 1933, Americans can legally buy a drink for the first time in 13 years.

**Prohibition** will be broadcast on three consecutive evenings, Sunday through Tuesday, October 2nd–4th at 7:00 p.m. with a repeat at 9:00 p.m. the same evening. Each episode is two hours. The series will air again Sundays at 10:00 p.m. beginning October 16th.

## Finding Life Beyond Earth

Scientists are on the verge of answering one of the greatest questions in history:

Are we alone?

Combining the latest telescope images with dazzling CGI, "Finding Life Beyond Earth" on **Nova** immerses audiences in the sights and sounds of alien worlds, while top astrobiologists explain how these places are changing the way we think about the potential for life in our solar system.

We used to think our neighboring planets and moons were fairly boring—mostly cold, dead rocks where life could never take hold. Today, however, the solar system looks wilder than we ever imagined. Powerful telescopes and unmanned space missions have revealed a wide range of dynamic environments—atmospheres thick with organic molecules, active volcanoes, and vast saltwater oceans. This ongoing revolution is forcing scientists to expand their ideas about what kinds of worlds could support life. And if we do find primitive life forms elsewhere in the solar system, it may well be that life is common in the universe—the rule, and not the exception.

"Finding Life Beyond Earth" on **Nova**, a two-hour special, airs Wednesday, October 19th at 8:00 p.m. It repeats Saturday, October 22nd at 10:00 p.m. and Sunday, October 23rd at 12:00 midnight.

**Nova** defrosts the ultimate time capsule. He's been dead for more than 5,000 years and probed by scientists for the last 20. Yet today, Otzi the Iceman, the famous mummified corpse



p u l l e d from a glacier in the Italian Alps nearly two decades ago, continues to keep many secrets.

Now, a new autopsy yields fresh clues to his way of life and the mysterious circumstances of his murder. If he was a warrior or a hunter, what was he doing so high up in the mountains, armed with an unfinished bow and useless arrows? If he was fleeing for his life, why did he eat a big meal less than an hour before he was killed? Besides clues to this original "cold case," Otzi's frozen remains reveal intriguing details of his life and times in the ancient Copper Age.

## NATURE Radioactive Wolves

What happens to nature after a nuclear accident, and how does wildlife cope with the world it inherits after the human inhabitants have fled? That is the provocative subject

of “Radioactive Wolves,” the 30th season premiere of **Nature**. PBS has moved **Nature** from its traditional Sunday evening slot; new episodes will now lead PBS primetime on Wednesdays.

“Radioactive Wolves” examines the health of wildlife populations in Chernobyl’s exclusion zone, the area around the reactor that remains too dangerously radioactive for human habitation 25 years after the meltdown of the nuclear power plant on April 26th, 1986. The program focuses on the status of the native wolf population as an indicator of the effects of radioactivity across all of the contaminated countryside.

After everyone living in the exclusion zone was evacuated, a no-man’s land was left to its own devices. Remarkably, in the interim, forests, marshes, fields, and rivers have reclaimed the land, returning everything to its natural state.

In the absence of people, the “dead zone” has become a surprising post-nuclear Eden, populated by beaver and bison, horses, and birds, fish, and falcons—and ruled by wolves. Though it may be too soon to tell about more long-term effects, the animals seem to have found an ironic safe haven here.

## THE WAR OF 1812 EXPLORES THE TRUTH AND MYTHMAKING OF HISTORY



Nearly two centuries after it was fought, the two-and-a-half year conflict that forged the destiny of a continent comes to public television. **The War of 1812** is a comprehensive two-hour documentary that reveals little-known sides of an important war. From 1812 to 1815, Americans battled against the

British, Canadian colonists, and Native warriors; the outcomes shaped the geography and the identity of North America. Some of the War of 1812’s battles and heroes became legendary, yet its blunders, fiascos, and cowards were just as prominent.

**The War of 1812** witnessed dozens of battles fought on land in Canada and in the northern, western, southern, and eastern parts of the United States. There were crucial naval battles on Lakes Erie and Champlain, and a wide-ranging maritime struggle with many episodes off Virginia, Massachusetts, Nova Scotia, Cuba, Ireland, the Azores, the Canaries, British Guyana, and Brazil. The U.S. proved surprisingly successful against the great British navy, but the War of 1812 also saw American armies surrender en masse.

**The War of 1812** recollects defining moments that are more familiar: the burning of Washington, D.C., and First Lady Dolley Madison’s rescue of a portrait of George Washington from the White House; Andrew Jackson’s total victory at the Battle of New Orleans; and the birth of the American national anthem, penned by Francis Scott Key during the Battle of Baltimore at Fort McHenry.

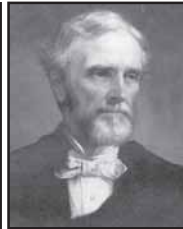

## Jefferson Davis: An American President

**Jefferson Davis: An American President** is the story of perhaps the most misunderstood and maligned figure in United States history.

Jefferson Davis—soldier, Mexican War hero, U.S. Congressman, U.S. Senator, U.S. Secretary of War, and President of the Confederate States of America—was an American patriot who helped shape the United States in the 19th century.

Before the Civil War, Davis was almost universally admired throughout the United States. His leadership during the great conflict itself has been subject to many interpretations, but all agree that he was a man of great intelligence and enormous personal honor. Born in Kentucky in 1800, his long life spanned virtually the entire 19th century, and its epic course ranged from the genuinely heroic to the truly tragic.

Davis was perhaps the greatest Secretary of War in American history. Yet, despite the fame that has always surrounded him, Davis is the least known of all the important Civil War leaders.

## MUHAMMAD: *Legacy of a Prophet*

Muhammad was born in the year 570 in the town of Mecca in western Arabia. In the year 610, while resting in a cave on top of Mt. Hira, he was visited by an overpowering presence and instructed to recite words of such beauty and force that he later became convinced they came from God. He was commanded to preach the messages he was receiving.

In 622, Muhammad and his few hundred followers traveled to Yathrib. Here he continued to receive further revelations, as he had on Mt. Hira. These were memorized and written down by scribes and later would be codified as the Qur’an, Islam’s sacred book.

## LINUS PAULING

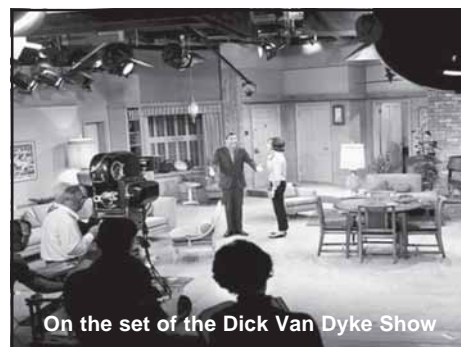
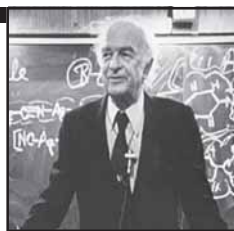
**Linus Pauling** documents the life and work of one of the greatest chemists of the 20th century and the only person in history to win two unshared Nobel Prizes—for chemistry in 1954 and Peace in 1962. Pauling received his doctorate in Chemistry at the California Institute of Technology where he made revolutionary discoveries in chemistry, physics, molecular biology, and medicine.

During the 1950s and 60s, Pauling became one of the most visible scientists and peace activists. For his efforts, he was labeled a Communist, had his name dragged through the mud, and endured more than 20 years of FBI investigation.

In the mid-60s, Pauling's attention turned to studying how mega doses of vitamins and micronutrients could improve health, and in 1970 he wrote the controversial best seller, *Vitamin C and the Common Cold*. The book and Pauling were heavily criticized by the FDA and the medical establishment. Many called Pauling a quack and a kook, a label that followed him the rest of his life.

Over a career that spanned nearly the entire 20th century, Pauling never backed down from his beliefs. He died in 1994.

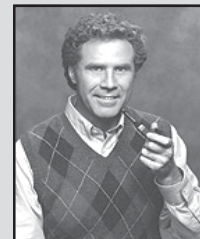



### KENW-TV is Now on Both DirecTV and Dish Network Satellite

Both Dish Network and DirecTV Satellite services are now carrying KENW-TV in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe Designated Market Area (DMA). This DMA includes all counties in New Mexico except Roosevelt, Curry, Quay, Union, and Dona Ana. DirecTV is carrying the KENW-TV High Definitions Channel (HD 3-1) on its HD channel 3 and the KENW-TV Standard Definition (SD 3-2) on channel 3. Dish Network is carrying the KENW-TV SD signal on its channel 3.

The Nielsen Company decides which counties go into the various DMAs. At the present time, there are 210 DMAs in the United States. In population size, the Albuquerque-Santa Fe DMA is the 45th largest in the U.S. because it takes in most of the State of New Mexico. Nielsen determines the counties in a DMA by which television stations the viewers in that county are watching.

By Nielsen rules, DirecTV and Dish Network subscribers in Union, Quay, Curry, and Roosevelt counties will receive the Amarillo PBS station. In all other counties of New Mexico, except for Dona Ana, subscribers will receive PBS from KENW-TV (Portales) and KNME-TV (Albuquerque). Dona Ana is in the El Paso DMA, and those subscribers will receive PBS from KRWG-TV (Las Cruces) and KCOS-TV (El Paso).
