



BILLY THE KID



LAST STAND



As part of its Wild West Collection airing throughout January, American Experience premiers "Billy the Kid," the story of the orphan teen who became the most wanted man in the West.

On April 28th, 1881, 21year-old Henry McCarty, alias Billy the Kid, just days from being hanged for murder, outfoxed his jailors and electrified the nation with the latest in a long line of daring escapes. Just

a few weeks later, the notorious young outlaw was gunned down by the ambitious sheriff Pat Garrett. Demonized by the lawman who killed him, the Kid was soon mythologized by a never-ending stream of dime-store romances and later, big-screen dramas. But in all the narratives, Billy the Kid's real story has been obscured.


Born to impoverished Irish immigrants, the Kid led a hardscrabble, itinerant life that became harder still when his mother died of tuberculosis. He came of age in a lawless corner of New Mexico, where an Irish immigrant ring held a viselike grip on all money-making endeavors and the Mexican population was frequently cheated out of their property without recourse to the courts.

Caught in the middle of a many-centuries-old Irish-English conflict playing out on the plains of the Southwest, the Kid captured national attention with his reckless violence. His fascination with Mexican culture, his flair for Spanish, and his disdain for the Anglo authorities made him a hero of sorts to the Hispanic community, who hid him when the law came looking and mourned him when he was gone.

"Billy the Kid" on American Experience airs Tuesday, January 10th at 8:00 p.m. It repeats Monday, January 16th at 9:00 p.m.

The Wild West Collection on American Experience includes "Custer's Last Stand," the final act of General George Custer's larger-than-life career played out on a grand stage with a spellbound public engrossed in the drama.

On June 26th, 1876, near the Little Bighorn River in Montana Territory, General George Armstrong Custer ordered his soldiers to drive back a large army of Lakota and Cheyenne warriors. The battle pitted two larger-than-life antagonists against one another: Sitting Bull,

the charismatic and politically savvy leader of the Plains Indians, and Custer, one of the Union's greatest cavalry officers and a man with a reputation for fearless and often reckless courage.

By day's end, Custer and nearly a third of his army were dead. This biography of one of the most charismatic and contradictory American leaders of the 19th century takes viewers on a journey from Custer's memorable charge at Gettysburg, which turned the tide of the battle, to his lonely, untimely death on the windswept plains of the West. Along the way, viewers learn how, time and time again, the supremely ambitious son of a blacksmith ricocheted from triumph to disaster, from battlefield heroism to impetuous escapade.

In the end, Custer's reputation was saved by the wife he adored, who almost single-handedly turned the Battle of the Little Bighorn into one of the most iconic events in American history and mythologized Custer's role, turning it into a tale of heroic sacrifice against all costs in the service of a country with only the most noble of motives.

"Custer's Last Stand" on American Experience can be seen Tuesday, January 17th at 7:00 p.m. It repeats Sunday, January 22nd at 9:00 p.m.



The Renaissance of Mata Ortiz

The Renaissance of Mata Ortiz is the amazing story of how an intrepid American adventurer and a brilliant self-taught Mexican artist transformed a dying desert village into a home for world-class ceramics.

When anthropologist Spencer MacCallum walked into a second-hand store in Deming, New Mexico, in 1976 and bought three pieces of pottery, he had no idea that he was about to embark on a journey that would lead to the revival of an ancient art form.

Finding his way to Mata Ortiz, México, MacCallum partnered with self-taught artist Juan Quezada and slowly they created an industry that today is known world-wide for its interpretations of a centuries-old style of ceramics and for stunning post-modern works as well. Not only did MacCallum help Quezada create great art, but Mata Ortiz, population 2500, now has 400 working potters. The economic development that has occurred in the village has allowed parents to climb out of poverty and send their children to school instead of work.

The Renaissance of Mata Ortiz tells the improbable story of how Quezada (without a kiln or a potter's wheel and using only found materials) and MacCallum both experienced creative and personal breakthroughs which led to dazzling, innovating works by Quezada and a passing of the torch to younger, award-winning artists, such as Diego Valles.

The Renaissance of Mata Ortiz airs Sunday, January 1st at 10:00 a.m. and Monday, January 23rd at 9:00 p.m.

Deadliest Volcanoes

Are scientists getting close to predicting volcanic eruptions, potentially saving thousands of lives? On the front lines of volcano research, scientists use new tools and techniques that are starting to reveal what makes a volcano tick. In "Deadliest Volcanoes," **Nova** travels with scientists who are attempting to discover how likely volcanoes are to erupt, when eruptions might happen, and how deadly they could prove to be.

Millions of people around the world live in the shadow of active volcanoes. Under constant threat of massive volcanic eruptions, their homes and their lives are daily at risk from these sleeping giants. From Japan's Mount Fuji to the "Sleeping Giant" submerged beneath Naples to the Yellowstone "supervolcano" in the United States, scientists from around the world reveal the spectacular danger posed by the world's deadliest volcanoes.

"Deadliest Volcanoes" on **Nova** airs Wednesday, January 4th at 8:00 p.m., Saturday, January 7th at 10:00 p.m., and Sunday, January 8th at 12:00 midnight.

Bombing Hitler's Dams

In 1943 a squadron of Lancaster bombers staged one of the most audacious raids in history—destroying two gigantic dams in Germany's industrial heartland and cutting the water supply to arms factories—with a revolutionary bouncing bomb invented by British engineer Barnes Wallis.

Wallis and the pilots of 617 Squadron—a lively mix of Britons, Australians, Americans, and Canadians—were hailed as heroes and dealt a mighty blow to the German war machine.

In "Bombing Hitler's Dams," a two-hour episode, **Nova** recreates the extreme engineering challenges faced by Wallis and the pilots with the aid of six spectacular experiments. A crack team of experts including dam engineers, explosives specialists, mechanics, and aircrew step into the shoes of the Dambusters and attempt to overcome each obstacle in turn.

"Bombing Hitler's Dams" on **Nova** will be broadcast Wednesday, January 11th at 8:00 p.m. The program repeats Saturday, January 14th at 10:00 p.m., and Sunday, January 15th at 12:00 midnight.

3D Spies of WWII

During World War II, Hitler's scientists developed terrifying new weapons of mass destruction. Alarmed by rumors about advanced rockets and missiles, Allied intelligence recruited a team of brilliant minds from British universities and Hollywood studios to a country house near London. Here, they secretly pored over millions of air photos shot at great risk over German territory by specially converted, high-flying Spitfires.

Peering at the photos through 3D stereoscopes, the team spotted telltale clues that revealed hidden Nazi rocket bases. The photos led to devastating Allied bombing raids that were crucial setbacks to the German rocket program and helped ensure the success of the D-Day landings.

With 3D graphics that recreate exactly what the photo spies saw, **Nova**'s "3D Spies of WWII" tells the suspenseful, previously untold story of air photo intelligence that played a vital role in defeating Hitler.

"3D Spies of WWII" on **Nova** can be seen Wednesday, January 18th at 8:00 p.m., Saturday, January 21st at 10:00 p.m., and Sunday, January 22nd at 12:00 midnight.

Mystery of a Masterpiece

In October 2009, a striking portrait of a young woman in Renaissance dress made world news headlines. Originally sold two years before for around \$20,000, the portrait is now thought to be an undiscovered masterwork by Leonardo da Vinci worth more than \$100 million. How did cutting edge imaging analysis help tie the portrait to Leonardo?

In "Mystery of a Masterpiece," **Nova** introduces a new breed of experts who are approaching "cold case" art mysteries as if they were crime scenes, determined to discover "who committed the art," and follows art sleuths as they deploy new techniques to combat the multi-billion dollar criminal market in stolen and fraudulent art.

"Mystery of a Masterpiece" on **Nova** can be seen Wednesday, January 25th at 8:00 p.m., Saturday, January 28th at 10:00 p.m., and Sunday, January 29th at 12:00 midnight.





Martin Luther

Iconic Figure of the Protestant Reformation

Martin Luther, a two-part series, recounts how Luther's attack on the all-powerful Catholic Church was a knife to the heart of an empire that had endured for more than a thousand years. Nailing his treatise to the doors of Wittenberg Cathedral, this previously obscure German monk changed the world forever, unleashing forces that plunged Europe into war and chaos.

In 1483, Martin Luther is born into a world dominated by the Catholic Church. After entering the monastery, Luther becomes increasingly doubtful that the church can actually offer him salvation. His views crystallize further when he travels to Rome and finds the capital of Catholicism swamped in corruption. Wracked by despair, Luther finds release in the pages of the Bible, discovering that his own individual faith will guarantee his salvation. In his famous 95 Theses, he attacks the practice of selling Indulgences, putting himself on an irreversible path to conflict with the most powerful institution of the day.

In part two, the Catholic Church uses all of its might to try to silence Luther. Protected by his local ruler, Frederick the Wise, Luther continues to write radical critiques of the church. In the process, he develops a new system of faith that places the freedom of the individual believer above the rituals of the church. Aided by the newly invented printing press, his ideas spread rapidly. Risking torture and execution, Luther proclaims his inalienable right to believe what he wishes. His stand inspires revolution across Europe, overturning the thousandyear-old hegemony of the church.

Filmed across Europe—from rustic rural Germany to the opulence of Vatican City—**Martin Luther** is the dramatic story of the collapse of the medieval world and the birth of the modern age. Liam Neeson narrates.

E gypt's Golden E mpire

The three-part series **Egypt's Golden Empire** tells the story of the Egyptian empire from its beginning in 1560 BC to its collapse in 1080 BC.

In part one, "The Warrior Pharaohs," it's 1570 BC and Egypt lies divided among foreign rulers. But Ahmose, one of the last Egyptian princes, rises to defeat the Hyksos and the Nubians and reunite Egypt into the New Kingdom. After Ahmose dies, Hatshepsut becomes the first female Pharaoh.

In "Pharaohs of the Sun," the Egyptian empire stretches from northern Syria to the Sudan in Africa, and Amenhotep III presides over a golden age of wealth, power, and prosperity.

In part three, Ramses II defeats the Hittites at Kadesh. But foreign powers once again threaten, and some provinces begin to question their allegiance. After Ramses' death, the great tombs are systematically looted and civil war ensues.



KENW-TV is Now on Both DirecTV and Dish Network Satellite

Both Dish Network and DirecTV Satellite services are now carrying KENW-TV in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe Designated Market Area (DMA). This DMA includes all counties in New Mexico except Roosevelt, Curry, Quay, Union, and Dona Ana. DirecTV is carrying the KENW-TV High Definitions Channel (HD 3-1) on its HD channel 3 and the KENW-TV Standard Definition (SD 3-2) on channel 3. Dish Network is carrying the KENW-TV SD signal on its channel 3.

The Nielsen Company decides which counties go into the various DMAs. At the present time, there are 210 DMAs in the United States. In population size, the Albuquerque-Santa Fe DMA is the 45th largest in the U.S. because it takes in most of the State of New Mexico. Nielsen determines the counties in a DMA by which television stations the viewers in that county are watching.

By Nielsen rules, DirecTV and Dish Network subscribers in Union, Quay, Curry, and Roosevelt counties will receive the Amarillo PBS station. In all other counties of New Mexico, except for Dona Ana, subscribers will receive PBS from KENW-TV (Portales) and KNME-TV (Albuquerque). Dona Ana is in the El Paso DMA, and those subscribers will receive PBS from KRWG-TV (Las Cruces) and KCOS-TV (El Paso).




