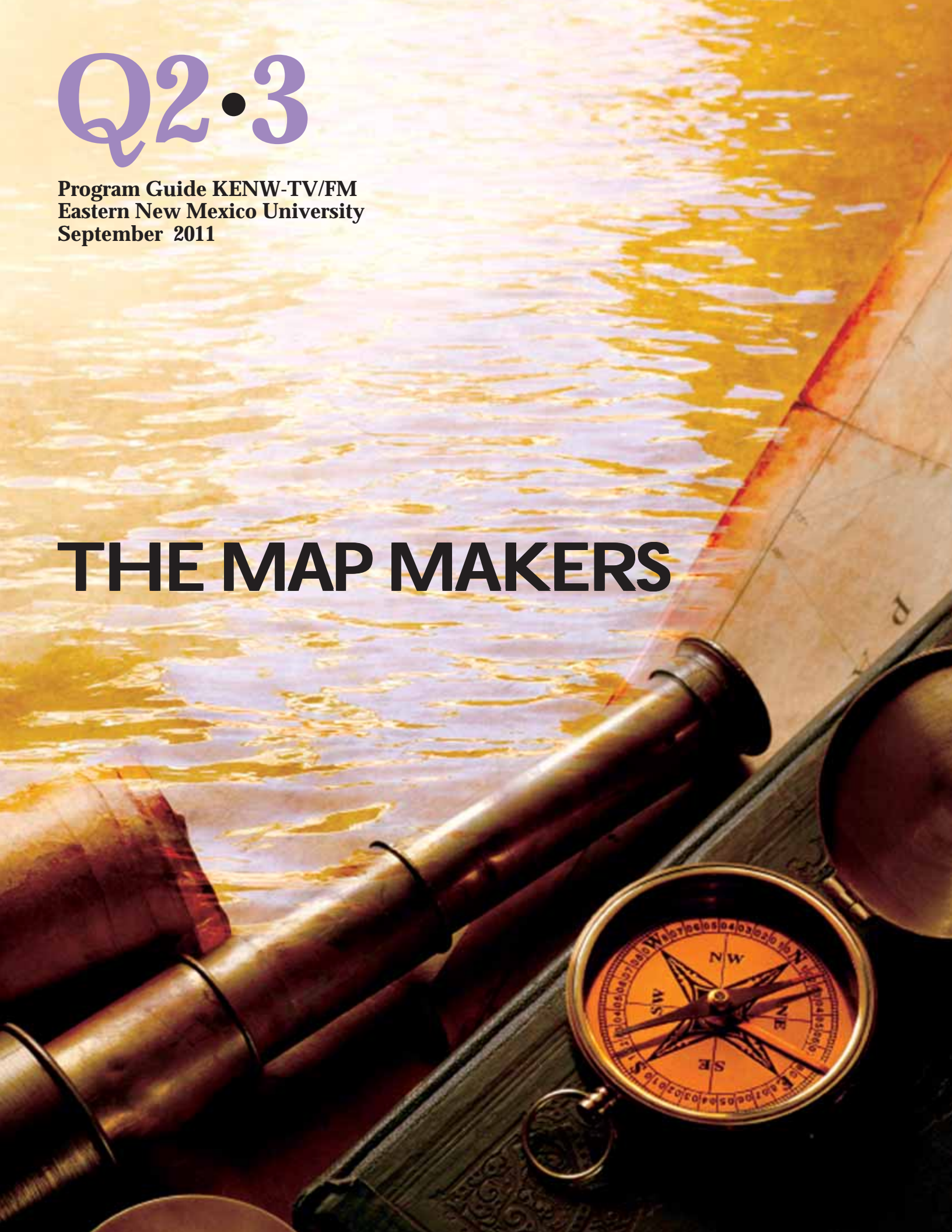

# DOMENICI

**“This is a story about a baseball player, a teacher, and a lawyer. About a father and a patriot. This is about leadership.”** —*Sam Donaldson, Narrator*

From Russia to the Rio Grande, Senator Pete V. Domenici has used his leadership skills to change lives worldwide. Narrated by journalist Sam Donaldson, **Domenici** chronicles the historic career of New Mexico’s longest serving United States Senator through eight presidents and four decades of change. With stories from Bob Dole, Chris Dodd, Howard Baker, Bill Clinton, Lamar Alexander, and many staff and friends, we learn about a man known as “Pete” and discover how he helped New Mexico and the world.

“He has made America safer, Russia safer and the world safer,” says former President Bill Clinton, referring to the historic work

at the end of the Cold War. And at home, he may have saved the acequias of New Mexico along with the silvery minnow. “There will never be another Pete,” says Jose Otero of Bosque Farms.

According to Senator Bob Dole who worked with Domenici to balance the federal budget, “If you look back now and see where we are today, had we followed some of Pete Domenici’s efforts way back in 1985, we might be out of this mess.”

The hour-long program highlights Senator Domenici’s remarkable achievements with the federal budget, energy policy, national defense, and non-proliferation, as well as his work as a champion for individuals suffering from mental illness and, of course, his amazing accomplishments in New Mexico. From locations halfway around the world to the shore of the Rio Grande, the documentary captures a piece of history that will live forever at the Domenici Center at New Mexico State University.

“The history is astounding,” says producer/director Chris Schueler. “And this man’s ability to connect with people, ranging from small communities in New Mexico to nuclear scientists in Russia, made it possible for him to do things for our state and the world that affect us all.” The program includes stories very few people know about Domenici—stories that reveal how his leadership shaped New Mexico and the entire country.

**Domenici** will be an integral part of the Pete V. Domenici Archives at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, and the project will serve as background for the living legacy of Senator Domenici in yearly Public Policy Conferences to raise awareness of some of our country’s most challenging problems.

**Domenici** can be seen Wednesday, September 21st at 7:00 p.m. and Monday, September 26th at 9:00 p.m.

A map is more than a geographical representation of a place. It is an image that mirrors a society’s political, religious, and cultural vision of itself. **The Map Makers**, a three-part series, tells the story of maps through crucial events of world history as it explores major developments in map making.

Episode one looks at the first map that included America, which is now housed in the Library of Congress; episode two features the maps from Henry VIII’s era, when cartographers were in huge demand; and episode three details the skills necessary and the dangers faced creating the maps for the critical D-Day invasion during World War II.

“Discovery: The Waldseemuller Map—1507” is the story of a map that changed the way man viewed the world. It is the tale of a map now valued at 10 million dollars which has become known as the “birth certificate of America.” Within the lines marked on its surface can be traced the first discoveries of the “new world,” by 16th century explorers such as Columbus and Amerigo Vespucci. But why were the new lands called America, and who were the men who first named the new continent on the famous Waldseemuller map? The intriguing history behind the map is revealed.



## THE MAP MAKERS

Episode two, “Religion: The Mercator Atlas—1572,” uncovers the shadowy world of espionage in 16th Century Europe, a time when map making and spying went hand in hand. It features Gerard Mercator, the most famous map maker to have lived, who became caught up in a dangerous plot to overthrow Queen Elizabeth I using an invasion map ordered by England’s enemies, the French. It is a story of intrigue, treason, and religious turmoil, with map makers at the heart of the struggle for

power in Europe. Information was power in European royal courts, and fragile maps were the key.

“Power: The D-Day Invasion Maps” focuses on a time in history when thousands of men and women risked their lives to create a set of top-secret invasion maps during World War II. Allied service men and women worked alongside French Resistance members in covert operations to create a “living map” of the Normandy coast. The resulting invasion maps were the most extensive ever to have been created, combining aerial photography and intelligence information. The invasion maps were critical to the success of the D-Day landings, and ultimately the defeat of Hitler’s regime.

**The Map Makers** airs Mondays at 9:00 p.m. beginning September 5th. It repeats Sundays at 9:30 p.m. beginning September 11th.

# Nixon's the One: The '68 Election (And How It Changed America)

The true story of the most stunning comeback in American politics...  
and the divided country it created.



In 1962, Richard Nixon's once meteoric political career lay in ruins. The former vice-president had suffered two bitter losses; one in the 1960 presidential race against John F. Kennedy, the other in a bid for the governorship of his home state of California. Yet, only six years later, Nixon would be elected President of the United States. How did it hap-

pen? Why did it happen?

That is the historical riddle that **Nixon's the One: The '68 Election (And How It Changed America)** examines. Combining elements of biography with an exploration of the larger cultural, political, and historical landscape of the sixties, the film argues that Nixon, far from being an improbable president, was the figure who most expertly exploited the tensions of the era, harnessing them for his own ends.

A story about the political awakening of the sunbelt and of the people Nixon called his "forgotten Americans," **Nixon's the One**

unearths the origins of the Red State-Blue State divide. It's a sobering, wry look at how the sixties divided us, and how one man stepped into the breach to claim the biggest prize of all.

Narrated by Dick Cavett, the program contains archival footage and original interviews with activist Tom Hayden, former Nixon advisor Kevin Phillips, Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist David Maraniss, Nixon biographer Elizabeth Drew, and bestselling author Rick Perlstein (*Nixonland: The Rise of a President and the Fracturing of America*), among others.

**Nixon's the One: The '68 Election** airs Wednesday, September 14th at 7:00 p.m. and Friday, September 16th at 10:00 p.m.

"Perhaps the best place to find out about the real coalition being forged by Nixon in 1968 was at the "control tower" of the effort—John Mitchell's brain trust at 445 Park Avenue, just across the street from the formal headquarters at 450 Park. There, in a cubbyhole next to Mitchell's office, a brilliant young lawyer named Kevin Phillips served as the house expert on ethnic voting patterns... he was in charge of his own specialty, which as he bluntly puts it is "the whole secret of politics—knowing who hates who."

In "Capriccio," Strauss uses the romantic indecision of the widowed Countess who must choose between two suitors—a composer and a poet—and in doing so, pronounce a verdict on their art. The Countess wonders which is more important to musical drama: the music or the written word?

**Top Secret America**

In the years after September 11th, **Frontline** produced more than 45 hours of award-winning films documenting the 9/11 attacks and America's response to them. Now on the 10th anniversary of September 11th, **Frontline** teams up with Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Dana Priest to investigate the dramatic changes that have reshaped America in the last decade.

"Top Secret America" examines the history of the secret side of America's "war on terror." From the creation of black site prisons abroad and super-secret facilities here in America, to targeted killings and covert wars waged by special forces, and the creation of a multibillion-dollar terrorism-industrial complex, **Frontline** and Dana Priest ask how a decade of fighting terrorism has reshaped the country and whether it has made us any safer.

**The Man Behind the Mosque**

It became the most controversial building in America, a mostly derelict property in lower Manhattan made infamous overnight as the Ground Zero Mosque. Going beyond frenzied media portraits at the time, "The Man Behind the Mosque" on **Frontline** tells the inside stories of Sharif El-Gamal, a real estate developer, and of the victims' relatives and anti-Islam activists who helped turn his project into a continuing battle over faith, values, and the meaning of being American.

Also in this hour: a rare interview with former FBI special agent Ali Soufan, one of only eight Arabic-speaking FBI agents. Soufan investigated the U.S. Embassy bombings in East Africa and the USS Cole in Yemen, and conducted interrogations of many of Al Qaeda's captured leaders.

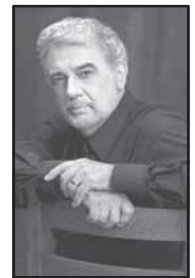
**Plácido Domingo: My Favorite Roles**

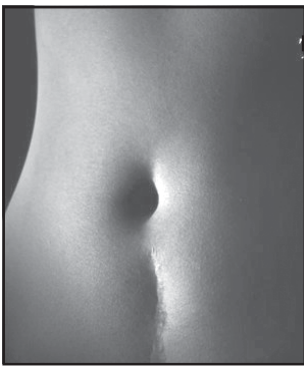
In **Great Performances** "Plácido Domingo: My Favorite Roles," the great Spanish tenor looks back on his illustrious career.

# The Whisper — the silent crisis of ovarian cancer

In **The Whisper—the silent crisis of ovarian cancer**, ovarian cancer survivor and host Sharon Blynn takes viewers on an amazing journey from diagnosis to empowerment against staggering odds.

Every year, more than 21,000 woman learn that they have ovarian cancer, and close to 15,000 die from it, making it the deadliest form of gynecologic cancer in the United States. Its subtle symptoms lead many to refer to ovarian cancer as “the whisper,” but its aftermath is devastating.

Airing during Ovarian Cancer Awareness month, **The Whisper**

is designed to make sure that women get the right information, become more aware of their bodies, and recognize that abdominal bloating, abdominal pain, pelvic pain, urinary symptoms, difficulty in eating, and feeling full quickly may not be the norm.

Chances of surviving ovarian cancer improve if it is detected early and confined to the ovaries, but with no reliable screening test available, many women with ovarian cancer are not diagnosed until the disease has spread. Against this daunting reality, the search for a screening test takes on the utmost urgency. Victims of ovarian cancer include President Obama’s mother Ann Soetoro, Coretta Scott King, and comedienne Gilda Radner.

## Better This World



In “Better This World” on **P.O.V.** (point-of-view), two childhood friends from Midland, Texas fall under the sway of a charismatic revolutionary who leads them down a path that changes their lives forever. The story of Bradley Crowder and David McKay, who were accused of intending to firebomb the 2008 Republican National Convention, is a dramatic tale of idealism, loyalty, crime, and betrayal.

**P.O.V.** follows the radicalization of these two young men, under the tutelage of revolutionary activist Brandon Darby. The results: eight homemade bombs, multiple domestic terrorism charges, and a high-stakes entrapment defense hinging on the actions of a controversial FBI informant. The program goes to the heart of the war on terror and its impact on civil liberties and political dissent in post-9/11 America.

Daniel McGowan, a former member of the ELF, faces life in prison for two multimillion-dollar arsons against Oregon timber companies. What turned this working-class kid into an eco-warrior? “If a Tree Falls” provides a nuanced and provocative account that is part coming-of-age story, part cautionary tale, and part cops-and-robbers thriller. Winner of Best Documentary Editing Award, 2011 Sundance Film Festival.

Produced in New Mexico, **Smashed: Youth, Brains and Alcohol** is a half-hour documentary about the effect that alcohol has on adolescent brains. The documentary examines recent brain research that indicates binge drinking during adolescence can have lifelong negative effects. Throughout the program, brain research experts, counselors, and youth discuss the reasons for concern and ways we all can help.

The program highlights how the brain is affected by alcohol assault, the effect of alcohol on athletic performance, and how advertising influences decisions about alcohol consumption.

**Smashed: Youth, Brains and Alcohol** airs Sunday, September 4th at 12:00 p.m., Wednesday, September 28th at 9:00 p.m., and Friday, September 30th at 11:30 p.m.

Hammered. Wasted. Plastered. Drunk. That’s how binge drinkers end up after a night of partying. Young adults drinking too much, too fast is a growing epidemic in both urban and rural areas.



Young adults who binge drink are more likely to fight, have unwanted sex, and have automobile accidents.

In **Binge**, viewers travel to a roadside memorial that marks the spot where a teenager died in a drunk driving accident. Though other teens involved in the accident were grief-stricken, losing a friend wasn’t enough to change the binge drinking behaviors of all of them. The program interviews law enforcement, university officials, and bar owners trying to change the lives of these young people before it’s too late.

### KENW-TV is Now on Both DirecTV and Dish Network Satellite

Both Dish Network and DirecTV Satellite services are now carrying KENW-TV in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe Designated Market Area (DMA). This DMA includes all counties in New Mexico except Roosevelt, Curry, Quay, Union, and Dona Ana. DirecTV is carrying the KENW-TV High Definitions Channel (HD 3-1) on its HD channel 3 and the KENW-TV Standard Definition (SD 3-2) on channel 3. Dish Network is carrying the KENW-TV SD signal on its channel 3.

The Nielsen Company decides which counties go into the various DMAs. At the present time, there are 210 DMAs in the United States. In population size, the Albuquerque-Santa Fe DMA is the 45th largest in the U.S. because it takes in most of the State of New Mexico. Nielsen determines the counties in a DMA by which television stations the viewers in that county are watching.

By Nielsen rules, DirecTV and Dish Network subscribers in Union, Quay, Curry, and Roosevelt counties will receive the Amarillo PBS station. In all other counties of New Mexico, except for Dona Ana, subscribers will receive PBS from KENW-TV (Portales) and KNME-TV (Albuquerque). Dona Ana is in the El Paso DMA, and those subscribers will receive PBS from KRWG-TV (Las Cruces) and KCOS-TV (El Paso).
