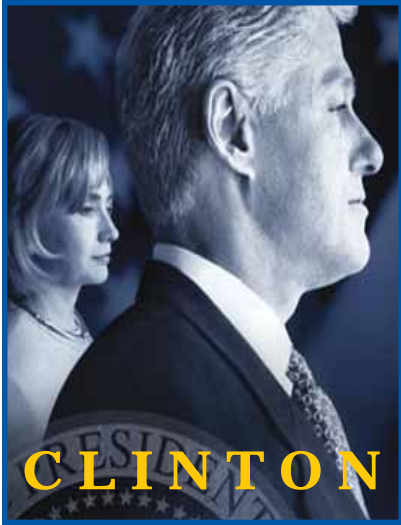

From draft dodging to the Dayton Accords, from Monica Lewinsky to a balanced budget, the presidency of William Jefferson Clinton veered between sordid scandal and grand achievement. In “Clinton,” the latest installment in the critically acclaimed and successful

series of presidential biographies, **American Experience** explores the fascinating story of an American president who rose from a broken childhood in Arkansas to become one of the most successful politicians in modern American history and one of the most complex and conflicted characters to ever stride across the public stage.

The two-part, four-hour program recounts a career full of accomplishment and rife with scandal, a marriage that would make his- tory and create controversy, and a presidency that would define the crucial and transformative period between the fall of the Berlin Wall and 9/11.

It follows Clinton across his two terms as he confronted some of the key forces that would shape the future, including partisan political warfare and domestic and international terrorism, and struggled, with uneven success, to define the role of American power in a post-Cold War world. Most memorably, it explores how Clinton’s conflicted character made history, even as it enraged his enemies and confounded his friends. The program features unprecedented access to scores of Clinton insiders, including White House Press Secretary Dee Dee Myers, White House Counsel Bernard Nussbaum, White House Chief of Staff Leon Panetta, and Deputy Chief of Staff Harold Ickes—staffers from Clinton’s years as governor of Arkansas, as well as interviews with foreign leaders, members of the Republican opposition, childhood friends, biographers, and journalists.

## Underground Railroad: The William Still Story

The compelling story of one of the most important, yet largely unheralded, heroes of the Underground Railroad comes to life in **Underground Railroad: The William Still Story**. It sheds light on the major role Canada played in the complex humanitarian enterprise that helped deliver tens of thousands of men, women, and children from bondage.

The first generation of his family born free, William Still (1821-1902) was determined to get as many runaways as he could across the U.S. border to Canada. After passage of the Fugitive Slave Act, bounty hunters could legally abduct former slaves living in the so-called free northern states, but under the protection of the British, Canada provided sanctuary for fugitive slaves.

Still's detailed diaries of individuals' stories—recognized as the most authentic account of the workings of the Underground Railroad—are used in this program to recreate one of North America's greatest sagas.

## Slavery by Another Name

**Slavery by Another Name** is based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning book by *Wall Street Journal* writer Douglas A. Blackmon. The 90-minute documentary explores the little-known story of the post-Emancipation era and the labor practices and laws that effectively created a new form of slavery in the South that persisted well into the 20th century. Laurence Fishburne narrates.

"The Thirteenth Amendment states that slavery was abolished, except as a punishment for a crime," says Blackmon. "So across the South, laws were passed to criminalize everyday African-American life. It was a crime for a black man to walk beside a railroad, to speak loudly in the company of white women, to do someone's laundry without a license, to sell cotton after dark. But the most damaging statutes were around vagrancy. If you couldn't prove your employment at any moment, you were a criminal."

Once convicted, African Americans were leased to coal mines, brick yards, and plantations and forced to work without pay. They were shackled, imprisoned, and often tortured. Thousands died.

## Cave People of the Himalaya



In **Cave People of the Himalaya**, Dr. Mark Aldenerfer and seven-time Everest climber Pete Athans go on a mission—set within the world's highest mountains—to find ancient mummies and uncover secrets that have been hidden in these cliff-top graves for thousands of years. They risk their own safety to reveal astonishing evidence of a previously unknown 1,500-year-old death ritual high in the Himalayan caves.

A confirmed landlubber, Aldenerfer is not happy performing aerial acrobatics, but he's doing it for science. A dark cave opening looms 700-feet down and the only way inside is to rappel down from above. In ancient times, rock outcrops and probably ladders would have eased access to the caves. Since then, however, erosion has rendered the chambers accessible to only expert climbers. Researchers doubt that the tomb itself would have lasted through one more monsoon.

The remains of 27 ancient men, women, and children are found in these cliffside caves in Nepal. Many of the bones bear cut marks that point to a previously unknown Himalayan death ritual. Nearly 67 percent of the bodies had been defleshed, most likely with a metal knife, say researchers. It is speculated that after the defleshing process, the corpses had been neatly laid to rest on wide wooden shelves. But due to centuries of exposure to the elements, the bones and bunks—and much of the caves themselves—had collapsed by the time the team entered the chambers.

Little is known about the ancient Himalayan groups that defleshed and entombed their dead in these high caves, making the motives behind the rite even murkier. The team has, however, ruled out cannibalism.

## KENW-TV is Now on Both DirecTV and Dish Network Satellite

Both Dish Network and DirecTV Satellite services are now carrying KENW-TV in the Albuquerque-Santa Fe Designated Market Area (DMA). This DMA includes all counties in New Mexico except Roosevelt, Curry, Quay, Union, and Dona Ana. DirecTV is carrying the KENW-TV High Definitions Channel (HD 3-1) on its HD channel 3 and the KENW-TV Standard Definition (SD 3-2) on channel 3. Dish Network is carrying the KENW-TV SD signal on its channel 3.

The Nielsen Company decides which counties go into the various DMAs. At the present time, there are 210 DMAs in the United States. In population size, the Albuquerque-Santa Fe DMA is the 45th largest in the U.S. because it takes in most of the State of New Mexico. Nielsen determines the counties in a DMA by which television stations the viewers in that county are watching.

By Nielsen rules, DirecTV and Dish Network subscribers in Union, Quay, Curry, and Roosevelt counties will receive the Amarillo PBS station. In all other counties of New Mexico, except for Dona Ana, subscribers will receive PBS from KENW-TV (Portales) and KNME-TV (Albuquerque). Dona Ana is in the El Paso DMA, and those subscribers will receive PBS from KRWG-TV (Las Cruces) and KCOS-TV (El Paso).

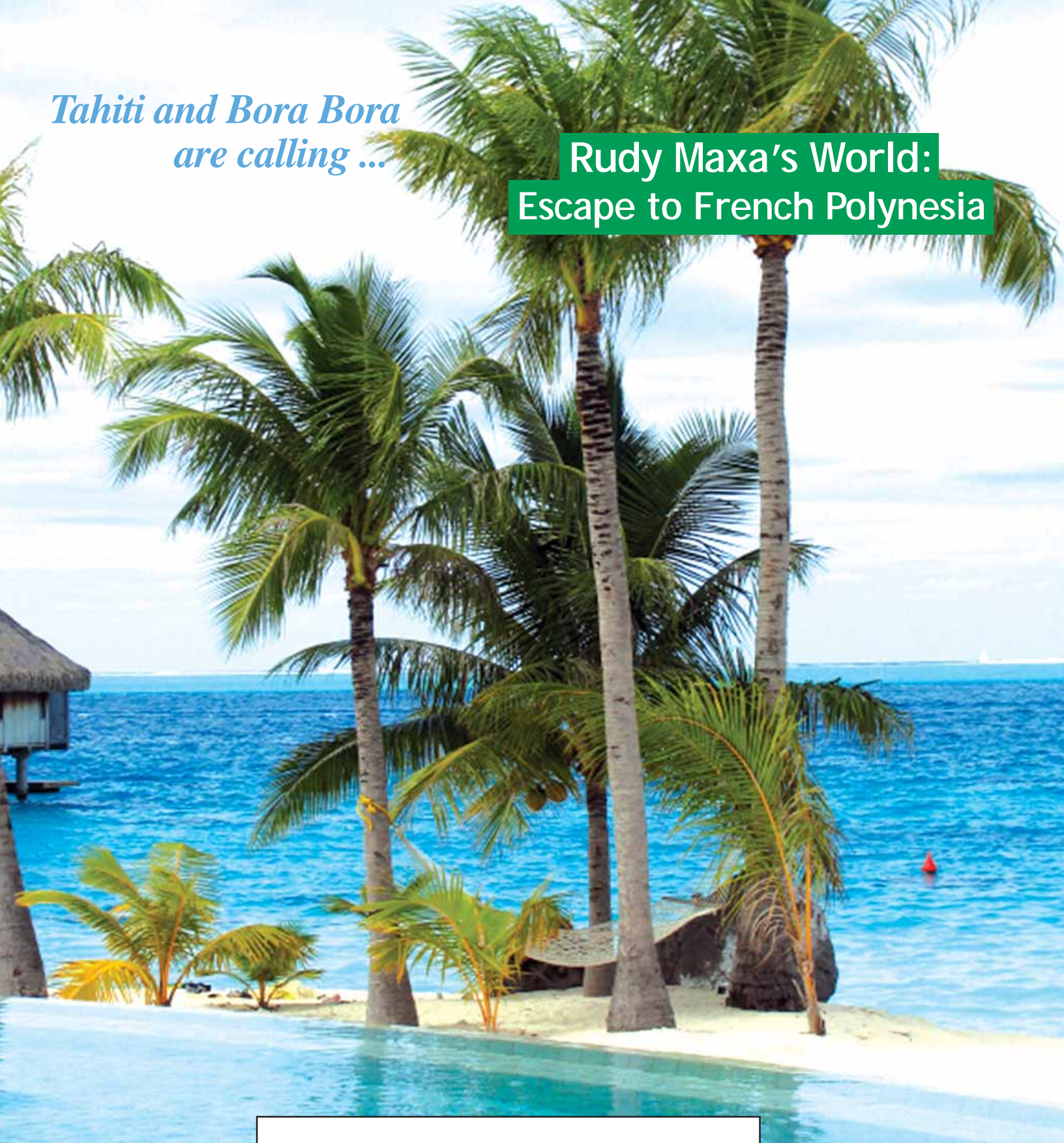

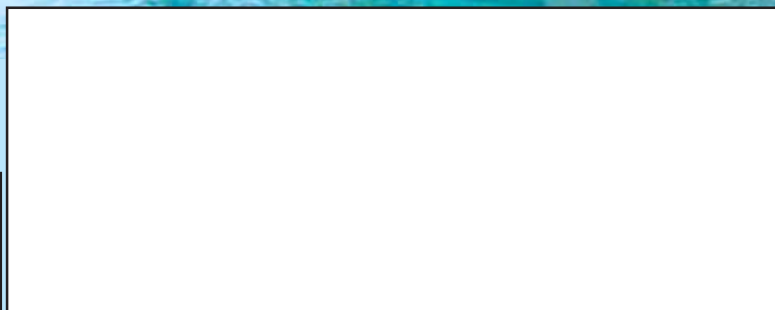
