ISSUE: PROVIDING FREE SUMMER MEALS FOR CHILDREN TO ADDRESS FOOD INSECURITY		
<i>We ran the following program to address it (Title):</i> Southwest Spotlight

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): Interview with David Briseno of La Casa Family Health Centers about the regional/statewide/national program that provides free breakfast and free lunch daily Monday-Friday throughout the summer while school is out to address food insecurity and ensure that children have nutritious food free of charge. The summer food service program is available to all children and teenagers 18 and under with no application or paperwork necessary and regardless of need. In the Clovis-Portales area of rural eastern New Mexico, the local summer food service program serves an estimated 2,500-3,000 children and teenagers every weekday during the summer at several sites in both cities, such as public parks, to make the free meals accessible.

The event is held in Portales and Clovis, NM, at several sites where people do their annual back-to-school shopping during the weekend in August that is New Mexico's annual tax-free Back-To-School Shopping Weekend, in order to encourage people to buy extra school supplies to donate to kids in need.

The health fairs offer free and low-cost health information, wellness exams and sports physicals and necessary immunizations for young students for back-to-school. The health fairs also offer lots of information and resources for the local communities in rural eastern New Mexico in a fun setting.		
ISSUE: PROTECTION OF WILD HORSES IN SOUTHEASTERN NEW MEXICO

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): Interview with southeastern New Mexico rancher Matthew Midgett about the seizure of a herd of wild horses from the Ruidoso/Alto area of New Mexico by the New Mexico Livestock Board and the efforts of community residents in that region to get the 12 mares and foals returned to the wild in the mountains, where they had lived and generations of similar wild horses had lived undisturbed for decades as part of the community's history and Southwest culture. Subsequent interviews with updates on the status of the horses and the legal process in court to determine whether the horses can be officially classified as wild so they cannot be sold and could ultimately be returned to southeastern New Mexico. On 9/27/2016, the horses were finally returned to the Alto, NM, area but with several restrictions, including a mandatory 21-day quarantine for the entire herd of horses and a waiting period while the legal process continues to determine the horse herd's official status.		
ISSUE: CYCLING AS A WAY TO ENCOURAGE HEALTH, COMMUNITY AND HELP LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): Interview with Dale Moebus, president of Bicycle Ruidoso, a local group in southeastern New Mexico that organizes a Tour de Ruidoso Century Bicycle Ride to help a variety of local non-profit organizations in Lincoln County, NM. The ride also offers shorter distances of 100-kilometers (62 miles) and 45 miles to make it accessible for cyclists of varying abilities. The Bicycle Ruidoso group and the annual bicycle ride, which has been held for 10 years, also helps build, maintain, improve and protect trails in the SE New Mexico mountains.

State lawmakers are also discussing the New Mexico governor's push to reinstate the death penalty in New Mexico and strengthen several other criminal justice laws addressing child abuse and the "3 Strikes Law."

The Food Bank is actively working to increase its outreach to feed area children through a Backpack for Kids program that provides backpacks full of nutritious food to kids in need for weekends when they don't have access to school meals.
