TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with ENMU President Dr. Steven Gamble about plans for a new \$8 million multi-use sports stadium. Discussed the voting authority that ENMU Board of Regents gave to full-time ENMU students, who will cover part of the costs of the new stadium, and how the Oct. 2-4 voting process will work. Explained the details of how various school groups at ENMU and Portales High School would be able to use a new stadium and why ENMU decided to propose the new construction to replace the old stadium. Discussed the economic impact on the local community if a new stadium is built inside Portales city limits vs. renovating the old stadium located outside the city. Explained other sources of funding for the proposed project.

Explained how the two funding measures on the special election ballot --- a mill levy and a \$14.5 general obligation bond issue --- would impact community residents and where/how the funding would be used. Explained medical service/health needs of community residents in rural eastern NM. Covered voting results and follow-up after the special election. Included interviews with Eddy County Bureau of Elections Chief Deputy Robin Van Natta and Artesia Special Hospital District Chairman of the Board Dennis Maupin.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Jodi Reid, program director for the regional Children's Miracle Network program that serves community members in eastern New Mexico and West Texas. Provided specific information about what types of assistance are available for families with sick children, such as travel grants to regional hospitals, and how to obtain assistance with medical needs for area children. Discussed the newly remodeled pediatric unit at the regional CMN hospital (Baptist St. Anthony Hospital, Amarillo, Texas) that was funded by local triathlon event Tri To Make A Difference, which benefits CMN and provided about \$100,000 worth of new hospital equipment, furniture, blankets, toys and complete renovation of children's hospital rooms and play areas for families in the local region, plus construction of a new children's courtyard in the hospital's pediatric unit.
