TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with several college students from around the United States who are members of the national Pi Kappa Phi fraternity cycling through New Mexico and West Texas as part of a cross-country Journey of Hope to raise awareness for people with disabilities. The students ride their bicycles from Long Beach, California, to Washington, D.C., and make frequent stops along the way to provide educational events about people with disabilities, as well as to interact with children and adults of all ages with disabilities. The Journey of Hope students stopped overnight in Portales, NM, home of the KENW studios.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Stephanie Pointer at United Blood Services in Lubbock, Texas, which serves the KENW listening audience region in eastern New Mexico and West Texas. Discussion of the increased need for blood donations in the summer months for all types of blood, especially negative blood types, while many college students and other area residents are on summer vacation and may not donate blood as often. Provided educational information about the process and procedures for donating blood, including eligibility requirements, advantages of the Double Red Blood Cell donation process and the simplicity of the whole blood draw process. Provided information about summer blood drives throughout eastern New Mexico, specifically in the Clovis/Portales area, and how to learn more about helping others by donating blood.

Provided information about the 3-day public community event, including the presentation of the "Last Escape of Billy The Kid Pageant," which gives visitors a look at the historical significance of Lincoln County in southeastern New Mexico and features information about the historic Lincoln County War, during which Billy The Kid made his escape from the Lincoln County Courthouse. Discussion about public tours available of the famous courthouse and period buildings still in existence, as well as other exhibits featured at area museums open all weekend to the public during Old Lincoln Days, including free admission on Sunday for NM residents.

<i>We ran the following program to address it</i> (Title): A Southwest Spotlight (with KENW News Director Janet Lyn)		
Date: 8/6/14 & 8/8/14	Time of Day: 9:20AM & 2:20PM	Duration: 5:00
TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with U.S. Rep. Steve Pearce of New Mexico, who represents the state's 2 nd Congressional District in southern and southeastern New Mexico, about the current U.S. immigration issues facing New Mexico. Discussion of the current immigration center being operated in southeastern New Mexico, where the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Artesia, NM, is being used to house 600-700 immigrant women and children who traveled to the United States largely to escape violence in their home countries in Central America. Discussion about the legal aid being provided to any of the immigrants seeking asylum in the United States and the legal process involved, including streamlining the legal process for immigration cases to be as timely as possible. Explanation of the current health issues at the immigration center in Artesia, specifically two cases of chickenpox that caused the center to be quarantined and resulted in a temporary halt to deportations from the immigration center. Additional discussion of the reactions, responses and opinions about the immigration center from community residents in that part of New Mexico.

All of the proceeds from the annual USAT-licensed athletic event support the Children's Miracle Network in the KENW listening audience region of eastern New Mexico and West Texas. During the past nine years, the TTMAD event has raised more than \$600,000 to assist children with medical needs and their families in the KENW region.
