<i>We ran the following program to address it</i> (Title): A Southwest Spotlight (with KENW News Director Janet Lyn)

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Charles Anderson, who has served since 1972 with the Portales, NM-based New Mexico Christian Children’s Home, which was first established in March 1954. Discussion of the home’s residential program for children of all ages from across the United States and how the NMCCH serves those children, who primarily come from dysfunctional family situations. Discussion about the NMCCH programs that provide children with a positive family living environment in cottage homes with houseparents and give the children opportunities to succeed through attending schools in the local community and participating in extracurricular activities with children from the local community, such as 4-H and sports, so the children can develop a sense of personal responsibility and achieve their goals and have hope for their future.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Bill Marshall and Charles Anderson from the New Mexico Christian Children’s Home in Portales about the home’s Single Parent Program, which provides extensive assistance for single parents who are struggling but trying to better themselves and improve their situations in order to better care for themselves and their children. The NMCCH single parent program, which has been in existence for 30 years in New Mexico, provides qualified single parents with rent-free housing, groceries and other physical needs in order to allow the single parents to obtain a college education and/or job training and pursue better job opportunities. Discussion with Marshall, who is director of the NMCCH Single Parent Program, about how the program helps single parents set goals and achieve them through learning responsibility and accountability in order to provide for their children.

Discussion concerning how after Maggie the Bear was orphaned in Missouri when she was 1-month-old, she was cared for by a wildlife rehabilitator and then brought to the zoo/park in Carlsbad, NM, when she was 5 months old. In addition to caring for the bear, zoo personnel taught Maggie the Bear how to paint using her feet as a rehabilitation activity. Every January, the zoo holds a public birthday party where children and adults can learn about Maggie the Bear’s history and artistic talents, participate in activities such as crafts and storytelling, featuring a book about Maggie written by a zoo docent, and watch Maggie in her home at the zoo/park in southern NM.

<i>We ran the following program to address it (Title):</i> A Southwest Spotlight (with KENW News Director Janet Lyn)		
Date: 1/22 & 1/24/14	Time of Day: 9:20AM & 2:20PM	Duration: 5:00
TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Dan Ware, the fire prevention and outreach program manager for the New Mexico State Forestry Division, about the prolonged drought in New Mexico and West Texas and the related potential for dangerous wildfires in the region, including practical steps people and businesses can take to prepare and clean up homes and yards in order to take preventative measures to reduce potential exposure to wildfires. Discussion included the lack of significant moisture in the region, the continued dry pattern for regional weather and the combination of an abundance of dry vegetation and brush, extremely high winds and dry conditions that contribute to the potential for wildfires in New Mexico and West Texas.
