TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with 9 th Judicial District Attorney Andrea Reeb, who serves people in Curry and Roosevelt counties in eastern New Mexico, about National Crime Victim Rights Week and the local/regional events and activities planned to honor crime victims, support survivors of crime and educate the public about the resources and programs, such as counseling, available to assist victims/survivors of crime and their families. This year's events in New Mexico, which were organized to honor the 30 th anniversary of the National Victim Rights Act, included a 5K Run/Walk in Clovis, NM, and special speakers at an all-day event there designed to educate more people about what victims/survivors of crime go through and make people aware of the resources available to help them cope with the trauma and navigate the court process.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Traci Tuttle van der Ploeg, coordinator of the New Mexico Ag in the Classroom nonprofit educational program, which is part of the NM Farm and Livestock Bureau. New Mexico Ag in the Classroom sends agriculture representatives and educators into classrooms across the state of New Mexico to speak with students from pre-kindergarten through 12 th grades about the importance of agriculture in daily life and careers and opportunities available in the agriculture field. NM Ag in the Classroom provides various programs and topics designed for different age levels and school grade levels, such as "Food and Fiber and Farms" for younger students and STEM-related topics (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) for older students. NM Ag in the Classroom also offers mobile "Workshops on Wheels" that brings agriculture-related education programs and agriculture-related teaching assistance to educators across New Mexico, instead of requiring teachers to travel to attend agriculture education seminars.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Kathryn Bertine, an internationally recognized professional women's cyclist, author, speaker, journalist, activist and documentary filmmaker. Bertine, who was speaking at the Tour of the Gila professional cycling race for men and women in Silver City, NM, discussed how she and several other professional female athletes have been advocates for working for more equality in women's pro sports, especially pro cycling. Bertine and her colleagues fought to obtain a pro cycling race for women at the 2014 Tour de France on July 27, 2014, which will be a 1-day event in Paris, France, called La Course by Tour de France. That will mark the first time in over 25 years that women pro cyclists have had an opportunity to race during Le Tour de France. Bertine, who began her own cycling racing as an amateur in 2007 at Tour of the Gila in New Mexico, also was showing the new documentary film she directed and produced about women's pro cycling and vying for equality in the sport, "Half the Road," which was crowd-sourced and funded by men and women in 16 countries around the world and is now being shown around the world.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Tiffany Laur, executive director of The Hope and Healing Place in Amarillo, Texas, a nonprofit organization which serves people in 26 counties in the West Texas Panhandle. The Hope and Healing Place provides free counseling, support groups and other assistance and resources free of charge to children, adults and families in the local region who are experiencing any type of grief, loss and/or trauma. The Hope and Healing Place offers age-appropriate support programs, such as "Journeys" for adults dealing with loss and HOPE CAMP, a summer day camp for elementary school-age children in kindergarten through 6 th grades who have experienced grief, loss and/or trauma. Additional discussion of The Hope and Healing Place Half Marathon on Mother's Day Sunday (May 11, 2014), the center's major fundraising event that allows anyone to take part in running and/or walking a 13.1-mile half marathon route in Amarillo, Texas, and raise the money required to allow the center to continue providing support services free of charge to anyone in the local region who needs help dealing with grief, loss and/or trauma.

As part of the CAFB Open House and Air Show, CAFB military personnel help educate the public about all the aircraft flown at Cannon AFB and provide static displays of the aircraft, as well as offer special activities, such as aerial demonstrations by the famous U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds squadron and the Wings of Blue, the U.S. Air Force Academy parachute team.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Joan Hultman, who works with the Food Bank of Eastern New Mexico, which serves children and families in a 5-county, 12,000-square-mile portion of eastern New Mexico, including Curry, Roosevelt, DeBaca, Guadalupe and Quay counties. Discussion about the increasing need to feed more families in New Mexico, which repeatedly ranks among the top states in the nation for the number of food insecure families. The Food Bank of Eastern New Mexico provides food to children and families through partnering with local agencies, regular food distributions in local communities and mobile food pantries. Additional discussion about the Food Bank of Eastern NM's annual 5K Run/Walk fundraising event in Clovis, NM, (on June 7, 2014), and the continual need for more food donations and volunteers at the Food Bank.

This year's project involved recruiting volunteers to build low-cost, homemade air conditioners using simple, common materials such as a 5-gallon painter's bucket, PVC pipe, foam insulation and ice that are effective enough to provide cooling for people in the summer heat.
