TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Pat Leahan of Las Vegas, NM, a project co-coordinator for a proposed Adult Reintegration Center in San Miguel County in an underserved portion of northeastern New Mexico. Discussion about the local community meetings being held to educate area residents and come up with recommendations for the needs and services of a proposed Adult Reintegration Center in that rural region of New Mexico. Proposed services include programs to address addiction, violence and recidivism among inmates and the lack of substance abuse treatment and detox treatment in northern New Mexico. Recommendations include the need for more services for inmates such as vocational training, job skills training, general education programs, anger management programs, intergenerational education and support programs, family educational programs to address child abuse and domestic violence, and services to address the high rate of inmate recidivism in northeastern New Mexico, which is currently nearly double the national average at about 80 percent.

Discussion about this year's special event, during which volunteers will help build and deliver 342 bicycles to every kindergarten student in Artesia, NM. Previous year's events through the regional Ride For Bikes organization have supplied bicycles to children of all ages throughout rural southeastern New Mexico through various local and regional nonprofit organizations, such as Head Start, Big Brothers Big Sisters and CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates). Additional discussion about the program's requirement for children receiving the bicycles to create holiday cards for military members serving overseas as a community service project. Ride For Bikes also offers a scholarship program for New Mexico students.
