**Peter Pan from the Milwaukee Ballet** invites viewers to once again join Peter, Tinkerbell, and the Darling children as they soar to Neverland for escapades with the Lost Boys, Tiger Lily, and the infamous Captain Hook. The two-hour production of J. M. Barrie's most famous work features Michael Pink's brilliant choreography on stage and in the air, along with grand sets, a lively score, illuminating costumes, sword-fighting, and a real family story with endearing characters. ## Matthew Bourne's "Sleeping Beauty"

**Great Performances** "Matthew Bourne's "Sleeping Beauty," a timeless fairy tale about a princess cursed to sleep for a hundred years, was adapted into a ballet by Tchaikovsky and choreographer Marius Petipa in 1890. In this program, choreographer Bourne

takes this date as his starting point, setting the story at the end of the 19th century when fairies and decadent opulence fed the gothic imagination.

As the heroine Aurora matures into a young woman, the period shifts to the confines of the Edwardian era. Decades later, awakening from her century-long slumber, Aurora finds herself in the modern day—a world she finds more wonderful than any fairy tale.

## CIVIL WAR THE UNTOLD STORY

With the 1860 election of anti-slavery candidate Abraham Lincoln, the divisions between North and South reached their breaking point. Thirteen states from the South seceded and formed the Confederate States of America. Union military leaders, along with Lincoln himself, realized that ending the rebellion rested on controlling the Western Theater territory, the area between the Appalachians and the Mississippi River.

**Civil War: The Untold Story** examines this well-documented conflict through the lens of the Western Campaign, which dramatically shaped the final outcome of the Civil War.

Narrated by Emmy-nominated actress Elizabeth McGovern (*Downton Abbey*), the five-part series features poignant letters from both soldiers and civilians that provide new insights into the causes of the Civil War, life on the homefront, the politics of war, the issue of slavery, and the relatively unheralded role African Americans played in the conflict.

Filmed at the actual battle sites, **Civil War: The Untold Story** uses hundreds of re-enactors to recreate the epic battles of Shiloh, Vicksburg, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, and Atlanta. Scholars convey the strategy and tactics of the battles while underscoring the relationship between the Western Campaign and the more famous battles waged in the East.

**Civil War: The Untold Story** airs Sundays at 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. beginning April 6th. On HD3-1, it airs Thursdays at 2:00 p.m. beginning April 3rd and Fridays at 8:00 p.m. beginning April 25th.



## ESCAPE IN THE PACIFIC: 1943

**Escape in the Pacific: 1943** delivers a dramatic, gripping account of one of the most remarkable incidents of World War II—the only successful group escape from a Japanese POW camp.

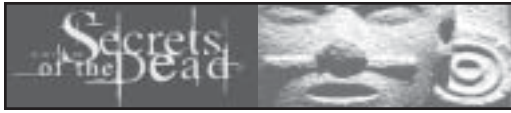
On April 4th, 1943, 10 American prisoners of war—survivors of the infamous Bataan Death March and the Fall of Corregidor—and two Filipino convicts carried out a daring escape from one of Japan's most notorious (and reputedly escape-proof) prison camps. At the Davao Penal Colony located on the southern Philippine island of Mindanao, thousands of American POWs labored alongside Filipino criminals and suffered from tropical diseases and malnutrition, as well as the cruelty of their captors.

The POW's audacious plan? Walking past their guards in broad daylight, unarmed, and equipped with only survey maps to navigate their way out. "The Davao Dozen" trudged through seemingly impenetrable swamps, cut through dense jungle vegetation, and dodged Japanese soldiers high into the mountains as they attempted to reach U.S. troops along the northern coast.

The documentary, based on John Lukacs's book, unfolds through the story of USAF Lt. Col. William Edwin Dyess.

## Carthage's Lost Warriors

Is it possible that America was already discovered in ancient times, 1,500 years before Columbus? That is the central question in “Carthage’s Lost Warriors” on **Secrets of the Dead**.

It’s 146 B.C. and Carthage, the proud capital of the vast Carthaginian Empire, is ablaze. Marauding Romans are mercilessly slaughtering and pillaging. Any survivors face a terrifying fate as slaves on Roman galleys or in their quarries. Escaping the bloody carnage is impossible... or is it? Could some of the once-mighty Carthaginians have got away?

Now, science is suggesting some may have taken refuge thousands of miles away in South America. In addition to the scientific evidence, blonde, blue eyed indigenes suggest that contact with the West occurred long before Columbus ever walked the face of the Earth.

“Carthage’s Lost Warriors” follows a transatlantic ship expedition from the Iberian Peninsula to South America to test how the ancient exodus could have happened, in the very real environment of Brazil and Peru.

**Secrets of the Dead** “Carthage’s Lost Warriors” airs Wednesday, April 2nd at 9:00 p.m. and Sunday, April 6th at 9:00 p.m. On HD-3-1, it airs Wednesday, April 2nd at 9:00 p.m., Thursday, April 3rd at 11:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., and Sunday, April 6th at 3:00 p.m.



**Agging Matters—End of Life** weaves together personal stories of families and interviews with scholars, doctors, and medical ethicists to examine the complicated experience of dying. The program explores the radical transformation of death and dying in the United States over the past 150 years, Americans’ cultural unwillingness to face death, and the efforts in place to change how Americans understand and talk about dying.

### Solitary Nation & Prison State

An estimated 80,000 Americans are in solitary confinement—even people who haven’t committed violent crimes—sometimes for years, or even decades. Some prison officials see it as necessary to keep order and safety, but critics say it is inhumane and counterproductive.

“Solitary Nation” offers viewers an intimate view of life in solitary, through the stories of inmates living in isolation and the prison officers who keep them locked in.

In 2013, on the occasion of the 150th anniversary, Burns and PBS launched **LearnTheAddress.org** that invites people to upload videos of themselves reciting the Gettysburg Address. To date, the site has accepted thousands of submissions from people across the country.





#### USE YOUR COMPUTER & BID ONLINE

This year we will offer TEN days and nights of online bidding. Go to: <http://auction.kenw.org> and start bidding. If you have registered in the past, please double-check your information and make sure it is still current. If you haven’t registered before, go to the website and click on the “Register” link at the top of the page. Fill out the necessary information, and then you’re ready to browse among hundreds of exciting items that will be up for bid from April 21st through April 30th.

There are already over 500 items listed for sale. Check out the list of categories along the left-hand side of the Home Page and you can see what’s available. The online auction is great because you can do your browsing and bidding anytime, day or night, until it closes on April 30th.

**Reserve Bidding:** You can also place proxy or reserve bids and the computer will do your bidding for you. If an item you are bidding on doesn’t get additional bids, you will be the winner at your lowest reserve bid. The computer will continue to place your reserve bids as needed, until your highest bid is reached. Reserve bidding saves you from being tied to your computer, gives you the best chance to get your item at a low bid, and never bids above your highest reserve bid amount.
