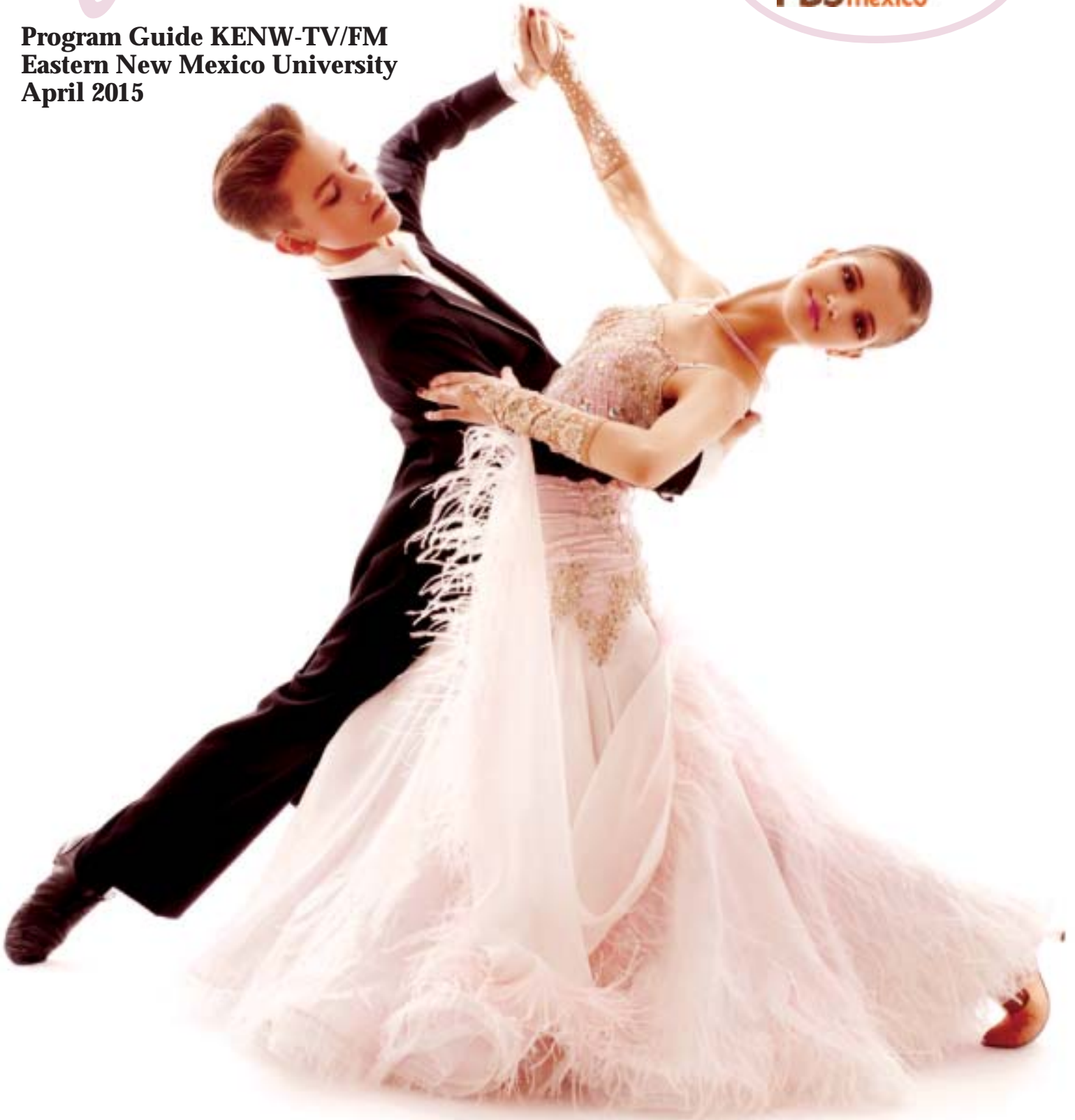

- Independent Lens** presents "**Little Hope Was Arson**," the riveting story of how the burning of 10 churches in one month led to the largest manhunt in East Texas history, and "**The Homestretch**," an enlightening story about three of America's 2.3 million homeless children and their struggles to complete their education. First conceived in 1791 by French-born artist Pierre L'Enfant, **The National Mall—America's Front Yard** highlights the decades of struggle to make the Mall a reality and the extraordinary people who helped to create it.

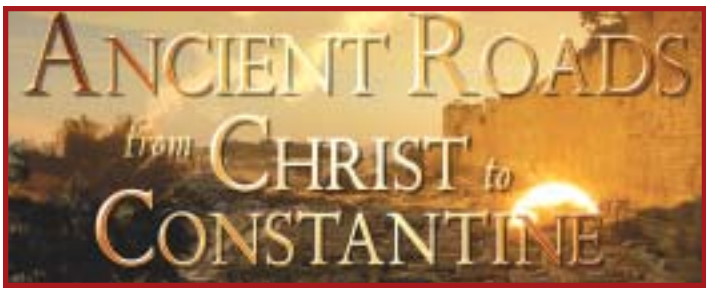

Join author and distinguished history professor Jonathan Phillips of Royal Holloway, University of London, as he takes viewers on a spectacular and dramatic twelve thousand mile journey of a lifetime, traveling the ancient roads to the very places where Christianity was born and grew from a small movement called “The Way” to its place as the official religion of the Roman Empire.

Ancient Roads from Christ to Constantine is a captivating adventure through four centuries and seven countries in the Middle East, North Africa, and Europe. In six extraordinary episodes, viewers experience the sights and sounds of the past, revealing the passionate stories, struggles, and triumphs of the early Christians.

BIRTH OF FAITH – Hour one begins its journey in Bethlehem and travels throughout the Holy Land. With the Gospels as a guide, host Jonathan Phillips traces the incredible journey of Jesus from his birth, ministry, passion, and resurrection.

THE GREAT MISSIONARY – Episode two introduces the man whose transformation is one of the most compelling in history, the Apostle Paul. **Ancient Roads** re-traces Paul’s bold quest to bring the Christian message to Asia and Europe, a quest which would see him imprisoned, beaten, and on the brink of death.

AGE OF THE APOSTLES — Hour three follows Paul’s third and final missionary journey as the Apostolic Age comes to an end. The remaining apostles, except for John, are martyred for their unwavering beliefs. In Rome, Paul and the Apostle Peter will both meet their fate in the hands of one of the cruelest tyrants in history.

FROM APOCALYPSE TO HERESIES — The city of Jerusalem will be rocked by war in hour four. Then we travel to Patmos Island where John was exiled and visit the cave where John wrote the most enigmatic book of the New Testament, Revelation. Powerful heretics claiming special knowledge of Jesus threaten to distort, divide, and even to destroy the Christian faith.

PAGANS AND THE CULT OF MARTYRS — This episode travels to North Africa to tell the story of Perpetua, a young Christian martyr, whose extraordinary story still resonates today. Viewers also visit the places where Christians faced unimaginable violence because of their beliefs, where the Roman Empire threatened everything that Christians stood for with their pagan temples, emperor cult, and vicious tortures.

CONSTANTINE — In the final hour, we see how Rome exerted its fullest effort to eradicate Christianity. But both emperors and empires had fallen exhausted, while the faith grew stronger. It would be the conversion of one man that would fully transform the fortunes of the Christian Faith. He is known as Constantine the Great. This is his incredible story.

Ancient Roads from Christ to Constantine airs Sundays at 10:00 p.m. beginning the 5th and Sundays at 10:00 a.m. beginning the 12th. On HD3-1, the series airs Sundays at 4:00 p.m. beginning the 5th.

WOLF HALL

Those Who Are Made Can Be Unmade

Award-winning actors Mark Rylance and Damian Lewis star in the six-hour miniseries adapted from Hilary Mantel’s best-selling novels: *Wolf Hall* and its sequel, *Bring Up the Bodies*. The novels present an intimate portrait of Thomas Cromwell, the brilliant consigliere to King Henry VIII, as he maneuvers the corridors of power at the Tudor court. **Wolf Hall on Masterpiece** brings both of these works to life.

Mark Rylance portrays the enigmatic Thomas Cromwell, a brutal blacksmith’s son who rises from the ashes of personal disaster, and deftly picks his way through a court where ‘man is wolf to man.’ Damian Lewis is King Henry VIII, haunted by his brother’s premature death and obsessed with protecting the Tudor dynasty by securing his succession with a male heir to the throne.

Told from Cromwell’s perspective, **Wolf Hall on Masterpiece** follows the complex machinations and back room dealings of this pragmatic and accomplished power broker who must serve

king and country while dealing with deadly political intrigue, Henry VIII’s tempestuous relationship with Anne Boleyn, and the religious upheavals of the Protestant reformation.

This unromanticized re-telling lifts the veil on the Tudor middle class and the internal struggles England faced on the brink of Reformation. At the center of it all is Cromwell, trapped between his desire to do what is right and his instinct to survive.

Wolf Hall on Masterpiece can be seen Sundays at 9:00 p.m. beginning the 5th and repeats Fridays at 11:00 p.m. beginning the 10th. On HD3-1, it will be broadcast Mondays at 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. beginning the 13th.

INSIDE THE COURT OF HENRY VIII

Part Renaissance prince, part medieval tyrant, Henry VIII is the most famous of English kings. **Inside the Court of Henry VIII** ventures beyond the facade of his glamorous court to uncover the danger and intrigue that routinely cost courtiers their heads.

When young Henry came to power in 1509, he was regarded as Europe’s most promising and enlightened prince—young, handsome, and learned. Yet by 1547, his swollen 400lb frame was putrid with ulcers and sores, and his country was as broken as his body. The coffers of the nation had been bled dry while the very fabric of the nation had been torn apart in his quest for an heir and his overthrow of the centuries-old religious certainties. Decades of religious persecution and bloodshed would follow his reign.

Under Henry’s reign the court was no longer only a place for nobles as once it had been. Two men in particular, Thomas Wolsey and Thomas Cromwell, a butcher’s son and a blacksmith’s, would rise to great heights. But as easily as Henry could elevate men, he could cut them down.

NOVA

The Great Math Mystery

Underlying civilization's stunning advancements and technological achievements is something deep and mysteriously powerful: mathematics. But where does math come from and why does it work so well to explain our physical world? Is it humankind's clever trick, or the deeply embedded language of the cosmos?

In "The Great Math Mystery" on **Nova**, a colorful cast of the world's top mathematicians, physicists, and engineers embark on a provocative exploration of math's astonishing power as it has evolved over the centuries—to ponder a profound question: is math an invention or a discovery?

Nova spins through stunning examples of math's power that permeate history, drawing on Pythagoras, Galileo, Sir Isaac Newton, Albert Einstein, and more—and taps into the world's top modern-day minds, who continue to puzzle over whether math's tremendous potency is the hidden language of the universe or all in our heads.

Mario Livio, a notable astrophysicist who helps operate the Hubble Space Telescope, shows viewers how centuries old, simple mathematical equations on falling bodies and gravity by early scientists such as Galileo and Newton *still* permeate the universe as laws of science that can be applied to distant galaxies.

Nova also looks at various patterns in nature and whether plants and animals have a fundamental ability to perceive numbers. The film looks at the intriguing series of numbers known as the Fibonacci sequence. Statistically, these occur frequently in botany, in the spirals on the bottom of pinecones, in the two sets of spirals in the seeds on sunflower heads, in the number petals on various kinds of daisies (e.g., 3, 5, 8, 13, 21, 34, 55).

Nova also looks at Pi as just one example of a vast interconnected web of mathematics that seems to reveal an often hidden order to our world. Pi doesn't only have to do with circles, but appears in many phenomena with wave-like characteristics. Pi tells us which colors should appear in a rainbow and how middle-C should sound on a piano; Pi shows up in apples in the way cells grow into spherical shapes or in the brightness of a supernova.

The affinity between music and math is also demonstrated by an acclaimed jazz bassist who demonstrates on her upright bass the discovery by 6th century Greek scholar Pythagoras related to simple ratios in vibrating strings of varying lengths. To him, these simple mathematical relationships produced the most beautiful, harmonious musical tones.

The amazing *predictive* power of mathematics is borne out all around us in the daily devices we use that require invisible waves of energy to communicate: televisions and TV remotes, radios, cell phones, satellites, baby monitors, Wi-Fi, garage door openers, and GPS. All of these are a result of a set of mathematical equations published in the 1860s by a Scottish mathematical physicist, which then inspired the work of Guglielmo Marconi, who later ushered in the era of the wireless telegraph and radio.

Many of the world-class mathematicians and physicists featured in the film acknowledge that math feels more like an inherent truth that they discover, rather than an invention. Others go a step further, arguing that mathematics *is* our physical reality. Several others fall more into the Einstein camp, who thought math to be a prod-

uct of human thought, even though he wondered how it did so well in explaining the universe as we see it.

The cost of child maltreatment and neglect is enormous to both our government and society. Thousands of children grow through adulthood with the effects of trauma touching every aspect of their lives and often repeat the cycle with their own children. The one-hour documentary focuses on five solutions designed to save millions of dollars and thousands of young lives in New Mexico.

"Child maltreatment is arguably the most significant cause of every social ill in New Mexico" says producer Diane Berger. "It is absolutely crucial for our state and for every one of us to not only understand how and why it happens, but more importantly to be concerned enough to take action."

The long-term effects of child maltreatment are supported by international research and the testimony of experts in the field. In the words of Victor Veith, JD, author of the book *Unto the Third Generation*, a call to end child abuse in three generations, "This should be your number one priority because

whatever else you care about, whatever social ill you care about; you want to reduce juvenile delinquency, you want to reduce crime, you want to reduce drug usage, you want to reduce alcohol usage, you want to reduce poverty. We know from a very significant body of research that child abuse feeds in to every social ill."

Many of the solutions are currently available and working in New Mexico, just not at the level needed to end the problem. "It's 100% preventable. The parents in New Mexico need more support. They need education and support and we know how to do those two things," concludes Esther Devall, PhD, who helps oversee the Child Protection Training Center at New Mexico State University. It is hoped that the viewers who watch **Everyone's Business** will share the information and take action.

He looked like a non-Muslim Westerner in his 40s and had connections to a Chicago-based company that could serve as a front while he did reconnaissance in India. With his background and passport, he could effectively walk through every screen that the Indian government had thrown up to keep out Lashkar operatives.

Among the highlights are:

The remarkable story of the Washington Monument, which survived financial ruin, the Civil War, and a 24-year work stoppage to become the world’s tallest building. It remains the tallest freestanding stone structure ever built.

The Lincoln Memorial, which resembles an ancient temple sitting on a hill, but is really more like a skyscraper on stilts. Lying beneath the structure is a vast open space that resembles a modern-day cathedral, and reveals the secret of the memorial’s construction.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial, built in 1982. From the time it opened, the Wall inspired a spontaneous response from many who visited—leaving items at the base of the wall. The program presents the story of one item—a scrapbook left in 2013—that traces the life of a man whose name is on the wall.

The nearly 4,000 Japanese cherry trees that burst into bloom every spring. Behind the spectacle of the blossoms is a little-known story of disappointment and near failure.
