# MASTERPIECE MYSTERY!

## The Lady Vanishes

“The Lady Vanishes” on **Masterpiece Mystery!** is a stylish and suspenseful adaptation of the classic thriller. Adapted from Ethel Lina White’s 1936 novel *The Wheel Spins*—filmed by Alfred Hitchcock as *The Lady Vanishes*—this new production is set against the tense backdrop of the Balkans of the 1930s and weaves together the stories of a colorful trainload of characters brought to life by a stellar international cast.

Returning home on a train from vacation, beautiful young socialite Iris Carr (Tuppence Middleton) is befriended by a seemingly harmless English-woman she knows only as “Miss Froy.” When Iris falls asleep she awakens to find Miss Froy missing. As threatening figures emerge to disprove Miss Froy’s existence, Iris’ unswerving certitude takes on the appearance of madness, and she finds herself struggling for her sanity—and for her life.

“The Lady Vanishes” on **Masterpiece Mystery!** airs Sunday, August 18th at 8:00 p.m. and repeats Friday, August 23rd at 10:00 p.m. On HD3-1, the program airs Sunday, August 18th at 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight. It also repeats Monday, August 19th at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

“Silk,” a three-part, six-hour fast-paced legal drama on **Masterpiece Mystery!** follows the conflicts, passions, and intrigues of criminal law, starring Maxine Peak and Rupert Penry-Jones as rival barristers with very different work styles.

Barrister Martha Costello (Peak) is under pressure to win cases as she aspires to rise to the rank of Queen’s Counsel, also known as “taking silk,” which refers to the fact that the Queen’s Counsel wear a distinctive silk gown when they appear in court. In an effort to boost her Silk application, Martha takes on challenging cases to prove her merit. That Martha’s opposing counsel in a major case is Clive (Penry-Jones), a rival barrister in her chambers, complicates matters further.

The series was created by Peter Moffat (*Criminal Justice*) and is based on his own experiences as a barrister. “I wanted to tell it as it really is,” said

Moffat. “The extreme pressure, the hard choices, the ethical dilemmas, the overlap between the personal and the professional, principles fought for and principles sacrificed, the Machiavellian politics, the sex, the drinking, the whole story—life at the bar is the richest drama territory.”

**Masterpiece Mystery!** “Silk” airs Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning August 25th and repeats Friday nights at 10:00 p.m. On HD3-1, the series begins Sunday, August 25th at 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight, and repeats Mondays at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

## Birdmen: The Original Dream of Flight

**Birdmen: The Original Dream of Flight** chronicles the history of man’s ancient desire of bird-like flight and explains the how and why of arguably the world’s most dangerous sport today.

**Birdmen** is an adrenaline-filled look into B.A.S.E. jumping, the ultimate extreme sport that allows human beings to fly. The program showcases the daring acts of the men and women who step off into thin air to fly like birds, hurtling at impossible speeds and gliding across beautiful, rolling landscapes despite the danger. The film captures their experiences in stunning aerial camera work, to bring viewers as close as possible to the sensation of human flight.

Historically, “birdmen” have always eventually plunged to their death: Otto Lilienthal, Clem Sohn, and Leo Valentin. But now, new developments in wingsuits have made the extraordinary sport a little safer, and it shows signs of becoming increasingly popular.

B.A.S.E. is an acronym that stands for the four categories of fixed objects from which one can jump: buildings, antennas, spans (bridges), and earth (cliffs).

## The Law in These Parts

Can a modern democracy impose a prolonged military occupation on another people while retaining its core democratic values? Since Israel conquered the territories of the West Bank and Gaza Strip in the 1967 war, the military has imposed thousands of orders and laws, established military courts, sentenced hundreds of thousands of Palestinians, enabled half a million Israeli “settlers” to move to the Occupied Territories, and developed a system of long-term jurisdiction by an occupying army that is unique in the entire world.

The men entrusted with creating this new legal framework were the members of Israel’s military legal corps. These legal professionals have faced (and continue to face) complex judicial and moral dilemmas in order to develop and uphold a system of long-term military “rule by law” of an occupied population, all under the supervision of Israel’s Supreme Court, and, according to Israel, in complete accordance with international law.

“The Law In These Parts” on **P.O.V.** explores this unprecedented and little-known story through the testimonies of the military legal professionals who were the architects of the system.

This episode of **P.O.V.** airs Monday, August 19th at 9:00 p.m. and Sunday, August 25th at 10:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Monday, August 19th at 8:00 p.m. and Tuesday, August 20th at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.



Young people in the United States are entering the youth justice system in shocking numbers, and many seem to come out worse than when they went in. America's rate of juvenile incarceration is the highest among developed countries. The staggering costs and the fact that more than half of incarcerated kids are likely to recommit crimes after being released, have led people to wonder if there is a better way to deal with youth offenders and if exposure to the system itself could in fact be perpetuating a life of crime.



## Fixing Juvie Justice

While only about 25 percent of juvenile cases involve violent acts, the system is also sweeping up kids who have committed minor infractions. From cops to judges to families, many are urgently seeking alternatives to the juvenile justice system.

In **Fixing Juvie Justice**, a group of innovators in Baltimore turns to the wisdom of the indigenous Maori culture in New

Zealand—which brings victims and offenders together to resolve disputes for a possible solution. In Baltimore, Dr. Lauren Abramson adapts the Maori model and starts an organization that facilitates community conferences as a youth justice alternative, in order to give hope to those disgruntled with a broken system.

Viewers see how people come together to resolve conflict in their own communities and all of the drama that unfolds when everyone is given a chance and encouraged to let emotions out. Can a community-based approach to justice derived from a structure conceived centuries ago in New Zealand give hope to the mean streets of the United States? **Fixing Juvie Justice** has some answers.

**Fixing Juvie Justice** can be seen Tuesday, August 13th at 8:00 p.m. on both 3-2 and HD3-1. On 3-1, it repeats Wednesday, August 14th at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

## Bystanders: Ending Bullying

Being bullied can cause long term trauma and affect lives for years. “I had people tell me to go kill myself and that I was a freak, and that I didn’t belong anywhere and ...they would, they would throw food at me...” says a New Mexico high school student. Three in ten middle school students and two in ten high school students in New Mexico say they too have been bullied on school property.

With only 15% of the school population being either the aggressor or the target, 85% are the bystanders and hold the key to ending bullying. That is the primary message in **Bystanders: Ending Bullying**, a documentary that explores the causes, effects, and ultimate solutions to the issue of bullying.

## Assassination: Idaho’s Trial of the Century

“The eyes of the world are upon you, upon you twelve men of Idaho tonight. Wherever the English language is spoken, or wherever any foreign tongue known to the civilized world is spoken, men are talking and wondering and dreaming about the verdict of these twelve men that I see before me now.”

—Clarence Darrow, during his closing argument in the trial of William Haywood.

Considered one of history’s most fascinating trials, the 1907 murder prosecution of union leader William “Big Bill” Haywood had all the makings for great theater: A famous detective, a mass murderer turned state’s witness, a radical and feared union leader, and one of America’s most brilliant defense attorneys, Clarence Darrow.

Haywood, the secretary-treasurer of the Western Federation of Miners, stood charged with ordering the assassination of former Idaho governor Frank Steunenberg. The trial, which featured many of the era’s legal giants, captured the nation’s attention and shed light on the violent struggle—including bombings, murders, intimidation, greed, and crooked government officials—that had been raging between unionized miners and western mine owners for over fifteen years.

Relying on the day-to-day accounts of dozens of national and international journalists who attended the eleven-week-long trial, the world followed breathlessly as Haywood’s life hung in the balance.

**Assassination: Idaho’s Trial of the Century** provides a brilliant reenactment of Haywood’s trial and offers an incomparable perspective on some of America’s greatest attorneys as they engage in a struggle for both Haywood’s life and, as some would later recount, “the soul of America.”

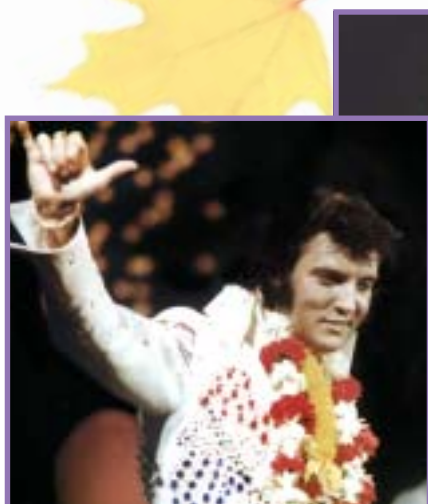


