## The Making of a Lady

Based on the novel by celebrated writer Frances Hodgson Burnett (*The Secret Garden, A Little Prin*cess, Little Lord Fauntleroy), **The Making of a Lady** tells the story of the well-born, educated, but penniless Emily (Lydia Wilson).



During her duties as a lady's companion for Lady Maria (Joanna Lumley), she meets her employer's wealthy widower nephew, Lord James Walderhurst (Linus Roache). Accepting his practical if unromantic marriage proposal, Emily finds solace in the company of Walderhurst's nephew, Captain Alec Osborn (James D'Arcy) and his beautiful Indian wife, Hester (Hasina Haque), after Lord James leaves to rejoin his regiment.

But all is not what it seems as an increasingly contented Emily has no inkling her life is actually in danger. While Walderhurst risks his life overseas, his wife seems powerless to avoid the threat that begins to encircle her. The arrival of Hester's servant, the mysterious Ameerah, only serves to heighten the jeopardy surrounding Emily as she begins to fear for her life.

## Murder on the Home Front

Patrick Kennedy and Tamzin Merchant head up the cast in the new crime drama **Murder on the Home Front**, loosely based on the memoires of Molly Lefebure, who was secretary during the Second World War to the Home Office Pathologist and pioneer of modern forensics, Keith Simpson.

**Murder on the Home Front** is set during the London Blitz of 1940, a world where criminals can use the blackout and devastation to hide their

darkest activities. As the Luftwaffe drops their bombs from above, people below are literally getting away with murder.

Dr Lennox Collins (Patrick Kennedy) is often at the cutting edge of new thinking in pathology, from chemical tests to the controversial inclusion of the study of the psyche. Molly Cooper (Tamzin Merchant) is not



only the first secretary to a pathologist, she is the first woman allowed into a very male world. When together they discover a serial killer at large under cover of the Blitz, they have their work cut out. The novel approach of preserving a crime scene and treating every bit of physical evidence as the key to a break-through may help Lennox and Molly save a seemingly innocent man from the gallows.

**Murder on the Home Front** will be broadcast Sunday, February 16th at 9:30 p.m. on both 3-2 and HD3-1.

## Roman Catacomb Mystery

A new **Nova** forensic investigation opens up insights into the daily life and health of Roman citizens during the heyday of the mighty Roman Empire in "Roman Catacomb Mystery."

Beneath the streets of Rome lies an ancient city of the dead known as the catacombs—a labyrinth of tunnels, hundreds of miles long—a cemetery for the citizens of ancient Rome.

In 2002, maintenance workers stumbled through an opening in one of the tunnel walls and discovered a previously un-

known complex of six small rooms, each stacked floor to ceiling with skeletons. It was a mass grave, locked away for nearly 2,000 years. Who were these people? Why were so many interred in one place, piled atop each other? And most important, what killed them?

## **NOVA** Great Cathedral Mystery

"Great Cathedral Mystery," an all-new **Nova**, focuses on the dome that crowns Florence's great cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore—the Duomo—a masterpiece of Renaissance ingenuity and an enduring source of mystery. Still the largest masonry dome on earth, it is taller than the Statue of Liberty and weighs as much as an average cruise ship.

Historians and engineers have long debated how its architect,

Filippo Brunelleschi, kept the dome perfectly aligned and symmetrical as the sides rose and converged toward the center. More than four million bricks could collapse at any moment—and we still don't understand how Brunelleschi prevented it.



To test the latest theories, a team of U.S. bricklayers will help build an experimental "mini-Duomo" using period tools and techniques.



In an exclusive 90-minute performance recorded at New York City's Public Theater, Sting performs an intimate concert of highlights from the show, joined by a 14-piece band. The evening was filmed on Sting's birthday (October 2nd) at a special fan club performance during a 10-night run of benefit concerts that instantly became one of New York's hottest tickets.

## Spies of Mississippi

"Spies of Mississippi" on **Independent Lens** is the inside story of the Mississippi Sovereignty Commission, a secret state-funded agency created in the 1950s to spy on its own citizens and maintain segregation. Overseen by the governor and a handpicked board of 12 of the most powerful men in the state, the Sovereignty Commission was granted broad powers to investigate individuals and organizations, keep secret files, make arrests, and compel testimony.

To accomplish its goals, the Commission used investigators and informants—including African Americans—to infiltrate civil rights groups. Over time it evolved from a propaganda machine to become the hidden hand of the state's power structure, coordinating state police, county sheriffs, state courts, and private citizens groups to protect white supremacy—at any cost.

"Spies of Mississippi" explores the origins of the Sovereignty Commission, from its early be-

ginnings in the 1950s through its massive expansion during the 1960s as the civil rights movement grew and white citizens demanded that action be taken to "preserve the Mississippi way of life." The program also tracks the commission's hidden role in the integration of the University of Mississippi, the trial of Medgar Evers, and the KKK murders of three civil rights workers in 1964.

## The Buffalo King

The Buffalo King tells the story of James "Scotty" Philip, an immigrant and pioneer South Dakota rancher who is often credited with saving the American Bison from extinction. At a time when train passengers shot thousands of buffalo just for the sport of it, leaving their corpses to rot on the plain, Scotty Philip sensed the urgency of saving the animals quickly facing extinction.

Philip set out to save the buffalo from extinction by buying a small herd of 74 buffalo. By the time of his death in 1911, the buffalo herd had grown to more than 1,000.

Buffalo from his herd have been used to restock herds across the nation, including South Dakota's Custer State Park.

Upon completion, One57 on Manhattan's 57th Street, will rise more than 1,000 feet, making it the tallest residential tower in the western hemisphere and boasting spectacular views of Central Park. "The Billionaire Building" follows the creation of New York's most luxurious residential skyscraper.


