First Face of America

On an unlucky day 13,000 years ago, a slightly built, malnourished teenager missed her footing and tumbled to the bottom of a 100-foot pit deep inside a cave in Mexico's

Yucatan. Rising seas flooded the cave and, until recently, cut it off from the outside world. Then a team of divers chanced upon her nearly complete and astonishingly well-preserved skeleton alongside fossils of

extinct Ice Age beasts such as giant sloths and saber-tooth tigers.

"First Face of America" on **Nova** takes you on a spectacular and risky underwater expedition to recover her bones and explores one of science's most controversial riddles: the origins of the first Americans.

Intricate detective work reveals that the young woman's bones are among the earliest known human remains in the Americas. Where did her people come from, and why does she look so distinct from today's Native Americans?

Nova pursues tantalizing new clues that are rewriting the story of the forgotten first people who ventured into our continent.

Great Escape at Dunkirk

As France fell to the German armies in May 1940, 300,000 Allied troops were trapped on the beaches of Dunkirk. Their annihilation seemed certain—a disaster that could have led to Britain's surrender. But then, in a last-minute rescue dramatized in the recently released film "Dunkirk," Royal Navy ships and a flotilla of tiny civilian boats evacuated hundreds of thousands of soldiers to safety across the Channel—the legendary "miracle of Dunkirk."

"Great Escape at Dunkirk" on **Nova** follows a team of archaeologists, historians, and divers as they recover the remains of ships, planes, and personal effects lost during the epic operation.

The team also uncovers the truth behind the myth that the Royal Air Force failed to protect the stranded men from the Luftwaffe's constant bombing of the beaches. Featuring the excavation of a Spitfire wreck, **Nova** debunks the myth and highlights the essential role that the RAF's iconic fighter played in reversing the desperate stakes that played out in the air above the beleaguered men.

"Great Escape at Dunkirk" on **Nova** airs on 3-2 Wednesday, the 14th at 8:00 p.m. and Saturday, the 17th at 10:00 p.m. On 3-1, it airs Thursday, the 15th at 4:00 p.m., Friday, the 16th at 8:00 p.m., and Sunday, the 18th at 4:00 p.m.

Prediction by the Numbers

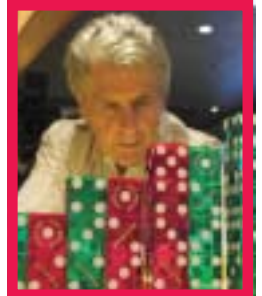
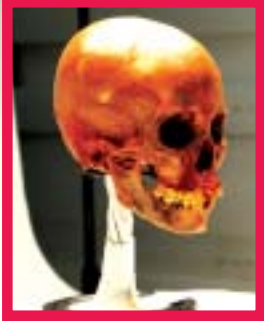
Predictions underlie nearly every aspect of our lives: from sports, politics, and medical decisions to the morning commute. With the explosion of digital technology, the science of forecasting is flourishing. But why do some predictions succeed spectacularly while others fail abysmally?

"Prediction by the Numbers" on **Nova** takes viewers from the glitz of casinos and TV game shows to the life-and-death stakes of storm forecasts and the flaws of opinion polls that can swing an election.

The program explores success stories of statistics in action, including how baseball legend Billy Beane developed the recruiting techniques made famous by "Moneyball." Statisticians discuss probability theory, which arose from games of chance like flipping coins and throwing dice, and demonstrate the power of the Wisdom of Crows...with jelly beans.

Yet advances in machine learning and "big data" models are also posing big questions. How much should we trust predictions made by computers when we don't understand how they arrive at them?

VERMEER, BEYOND TIME

Narrated by Steve Martin, **Vermeer, Beyond Time** focuses on both Johannes Vermeer's work and his family life, covering his conversion to Catholicism, his artistic contemporaries, and the short-lived Dutch Golden Age of the 17th century. The film examines his individual paintings—of which there are only 37 in existence today—and what has come to be known as the Vermeer style—the representation of light, the interplay of color, and the effects of perspective across places and objects.

Vermeer's paintings depict a world inhabited by refined and cultivated women, respectful or troublesome servants, charming young people, and learned men. His ruthless elimination of objects and other details that serve no purpose results in images that suspend time and leave viewers wanting to know more. The documentary adds much to our understanding and knowledge of the painter, while still allowing for the mystery and allure of his art.

Vermeer died at the age of 45, sickly and in debt, and his paintings were sold to repay his creditors. More than 200 years later, a revived appreciation for his art gave him the recognition he deserves which continues to this day.

The Gilded Age

Thirty years after the Civil War, America had transformed itself into an economic powerhouse and was fast becoming the world's leading producer of food, coal, oil and steel. But the transformation had created stark new divides in wealth, class, and opportunity. By the end of the 19th century, the richest 4,000 families in the country—less than one percent of all Americans—possessed nearly as much wealth as the other 11.6 million families combined. The simultaneous growth of a lavish new elite and a struggling working class was unprecedented in American life. These disparities sparked passionate and violent debates over questions still being asked in our own time: How is wealth best distributed, and by what process? Should the government concern itself chiefly with economic growth or economic justice?

American Experience presents “The Gilded Age,” a compelling two-hour portrait of an era of glittering wealth contrasted with extreme poverty.

Henry George's best-selling *Progress & Poverty* condemned the growing economic inequality and put forth the premise that poverty was not due to personal failure, but caused by a rigged system. George saw New York as a city in which “on one side a very few men richer by far than is good for men to be, and on the other side a great mass of men and women struggling and worrying and wearying to get a most pitiful living.” Not confined to the nation's cities, farmers in the Midwest—whose wheat, corn, oats, and rye fed the world—were also working dawn until dusk for meager returns.

Throughout the Gilded Age the economy grew at a furious pace, but financial markets were wracked by instability. On May 4, 1893, Wall Street investors saw much of the nation's wealth disappear

due to a serious economic depression. As many as a million workers lost their jobs. People starved to death. A year later, the nation was still reeling when Jacob Coxey, a Midwestern businessman, announced America's first march on Washington to urge the government to take responsibility for out-of-work men. His idea sparked a pilgrimage of thousands of men across the country.

Heading into the presidential election of 1896, the newly wealthy watched in fear as former Nebraska congressman William Jennings Bryan rallied working people behind the Democrats. He ran for the presidency on a Populist platform that supported a federal income tax on the rich and the breakup of powerful monopolies. “There are those who believe that if you will only legislate to make the well-to-do prosperous, their prosperity will leak through on those below,” said Bryan over 120 years ago. “The democratic idea, however, has been that if you legislate to make the masses prosperous, their prosperity will find its way up through every class which rests upon them.”

Bryan faced off against the Republican nominee, former congressman and Ohio governor William McKinley, whose campaign was backed by the considerable cash of men like Andrew Carnegie and J. P. Morgan. McKinley won the presidency, supported by factory workers and the heavily populated region from the Great Lakes through the Northeast.

“The question of wealth versus people ballooned in the Gilded Age,” concludes historian Nell Irvin Painter. “Do our governments represent wealth or do they represent people? This is a fundamental issue, which is with us today.”

The BOMBING of WALL STREET

On September 16, 1920, as hundreds of Wall Street workers headed out for lunch, a horse-drawn cart packed with dynamite exploded in front of Morgan Bank, the world's most powerful banking institution. The blast turned the nation's financial center into a bloody war zone and left 38 dead and hundreds more seriously injured. Financial institutions around the country went on high alert, and many wondered if this was the strike against American capitalism that radical agitators had threatened for so long.

A mostly forgotten act of terror, the bombing helped launch the career of a young J. Edgar Hoover and sparked a bitter national debate about how far the government should go to protect the nation from acts of political violence. Based on Beverly Gage's *The Day Wall Street Exploded: A Story of America in its First Age of Terror*, “The Bombing of Wall Street” premieres on **American Experience**.

The brutal Wall Street attack struck at a moment in history when millions of people around the globe were challenging capitalism as an economic system. The Bolshevik revolution in Russia spurred similar workers movements around the globe, including in the U.S. The so-called Gilded Age had fractured the U.S. into the haves and the have-nots. World War I, which had just concluded a year earlier, had been enormously profitable for capitalists, but had created economic and political divisions that would prove fertile ground for revolt.

In April and May of 1919, 30 bombs targeting bankers and government officials were mailed to arrive on May Day. Attorney Gen-

eral A. Mitchell Palmer, an ambitious man with his eye on the White House, ordered the Justice Department's Bureau of Investigation to draw up a list of possible suspects. When, a month later, a bomb—and the bomber—exploded on Palmer's very own doorstep, he retaliated with a broad campaign targeting anyone connected to revolutionary organizations.

Palmer created “The Radical Division” at the Bureau and appointed an ambitious 24-year-old, J. Edgar Hoover, to run it. In its first year of operation, the unit amassed more than 200,000 files on radical activities but, to Palmer's critics, it was not enough. He silenced them on November 7, 1919, with a massive raid that resulted in the deportation of 249 Russian immigrants. Additional raids struck across the country and suspected radicals were sent to detention centers and many more were deported. Palmer's tactics quashed any chances he had of winning the Democratic nomination for president at the 1920 convention. Three months later, he would oversee the investigation of the Wall Street bombing.

Impossible Builds

Impossible Builds showcases the creation of some of the world's most ambitious and technologically advanced buildings. From subaquatic homes to futuristic towers and pencil thin skyscrapers, see how these previously impossible structures are taking shape.

"The Scorpion Tower" travels to the heart of downtown Miami, where a skyscraper like no other is rising. The curvaceous design is radical and the method of construction is nothing short of revolutionary. The Scorpion Tower, a 62-story luxury residence, features an insect-like external skeleton where the supporting columns are on the outside of the building. The design is so radical, construction experts have turned to glass fiber reinforced concrete, a building material never before used in skyscraper construction.

The Scorpion Tower's fluid columns will be formed from close to 5,000 individual panels, each one made 8,000 miles away in Dubai. To support the 700-foot-tall tower, the construction team will have to mastermind one of the deepest foundation systems of its kind in Miami's history.

"Europe in the Desert," part two, follows the story of six sand islands in the Persian Gulf near Dubai, and their transformation into hopefully the most luxurious holiday destination on earth.

Finally, "The Floating House" follows a team in Dubai as they attempt to construct a multi-million dollar floating home that sits above and below the water.

Do Not Resist

In "Do Not Resist" on **P.O.V.**, Craig Atkinson, the son of a SWAT team member in Detroit, gives viewers a boots-on-the-ground look at American policing, along with a comprehensive look at a chilling new trend—the unprecedented militarization of local police forces since 9/11.

Since 9/11, the federal government has given police departments more than \$40 billion in military-grade equipment. Most grants include no stipulations on how that equipment should be deployed or any reporting requirements. Atkinson and his crew watched as departments throughout the county adapted the technologies under the pretense of fighting domestic terrorism, but often used the equipment on a day-to-day basis to serve search warrants.

"Do Not Resist" opens with riveting footage of protesters in Ferguson, Missouri, facing tear gas and cops wearing riot gear and riding in imposing military vehicles. Senator Rand Paul insists that such equipment is "not supposed to be used for riot suppression," in a hearing on U.S. military equipment "donated" to municipal police departments.

In another excerpt from the film, a retired colonel in the Marine Corps speaks out, "What's happening is we're building a domestic military because it's unlawful and unconstitutional to use American troops on American soil... We're building an army over here, and I can't believe people aren't seeing it."

Also in the film is Dave Grossman, an American author who has specialized in the study of the psychology of killing, and who is a retired lieutenant colonel in the United States Army. Grossman addresses an audience of law enforcement professionals: "You fight violence. What do you fight it with? Superior violence. Righteous violence, eh?" and "You are men and women of violence. You must master it, or it will destroy you."

Yet at a different conference, then Chicago police chief Garry McCarthy implores restraint on the use of force in law enforcement. "What happened in Ferguson—the actual practice of how the demonstrations were handled—I think we're all embarrassed by it, quite frankly, in law enforcement... The simplest issue of the use of tear gas: in my book, if you fire tear gas, you've got a riot now."

With sexual harassment at the forefront of the national conversation, **#Me Too, Now What?** aims to take the discussion to another level, engaging both women and men from all generations and walks of life in dialogue about these difficult issues.

Topics to be explored include the impact of popular culture on women in the workplace, how race and class factor into the discussion, the social costs of pay inequity and gender discrimination, how men can be engaged in this discussion, and, ultimately, how we begin to chart a path forward.

The American Creed is a statement of the defining element of American identity, first formulated by Thomas Jefferson and elaborated by many others, that includes liberty, equality, individualism, populism, and laissez faire.

Winnie

Winnie Madikizela-Mandela is one of the most misunderstood and intriguing of contemporary female political figures. Her rise and seeming fall from grace bear the hallmarks of epic tragedy. “Winnie” on **Independent Lens** explores her life and contribution to the struggle to bring down apartheid from the inside, with intimate insight from Winnie herself, those who were closest to her, and the enemies who sought to destroy her.

While her husband Nelson Mandela was jailed for 27 years, Winnie lived a tumultuous life far from the safety of exile abroad. She came to symbolize the oppression of her people, and during the long years in which the African National Congress (ANC) languished in exile and incarceration, her fearlessness incited them to get organized.

During the long struggle, Winnie remained her husband’s eyes and ears on the ground and was his closest advisor. But her often militant stance did not sit well with the powers that be. She became the target of a government-sponsored smear campaign. Her inner circle was infiltrated with spies. And she was eventually betrayed by many of those she most trusted. Her marriage to Mandela was torn apart, with significant consequences for Winnie, and the future of the country as a whole.

Tell Them We Are Rising: The Story of Black Colleges and Universities

The rich history of America’s Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) began before the end of slavery, flourished in the 20th century, and profoundly influenced the course of the nation for more than 150 years—yet remains largely unknown. With “Tell Them We Are Rising” on **Independent Lens**, the powerful story of the rise and influence of HBCUs comes to life.

A haven for Black intellectuals, artists, and revolutionaries, HBCUs have educated and cultivated leaders in every field while remaining unapologetically Black. These institutions have nurtured some of the most influential Americans of our time, from Booker T. Washington to Martin Luther King, Jr., W.E.B. Du Bois to Ralph Ellison, Toni Morrison to Oprah Winfrey, Alice Walker to Spike Lee.

For African-American students, HBCUs were a place of freedom and a refuge from the rampant racism that raged off campus. With the return of African American soldiers from the front after WWI, more HBCUs were founded and these institutions graduated doctors, lawyers and professionals who created the first Black middle class.

Rat Film

“Rat Film” on **Independent Lens** uses the rat to burrow into the dark, complicated history of Baltimore. The film explores how racial segregation, discriminatory lending practices known as “redlining,” and environmental racism built today’s Baltimore.

In Baltimore, just as in many other urban areas, rats are part of the daily lives of residents. Some have learned to live with them, domesticating rats as pets. Others hunt them for sport, using blowguns and fishing rods. But what begins as an examination of our interactions with rats—portraits of rat-afflicted citizens, as test subjects in labs, the development of rat poison—becomes a deeper exploration of Baltimore.

The film investigates the history of the city, and the systemic racism that established the low-income and predominantly black neighborhoods that are still plagued by rats today. In one of the film’s most shocking sequences, 2015 Baltimore city statistics are superimposed over old redlining maps, exposing a haunting correlation to present-day urban issues and the neighborhoods formed decades ago.

Despite the title, the core of “Rat Film” is deeply human—an unflinching anthropological look at the racial injustices entrenched in the city’s past.

Fighting on Both Fronts: The Story of the 370th

Fighting on Both Fronts: The Story of the 370th tells the little-known story of a unit of African American soldiers from Illinois, largely from Chicago’s Bronzeville neighborhood, who fought in combat for the United States under the French during World War I. They fought on two fronts: the war against the Germans and the war against racism and inequality.

During a period when African Americans struggled tirelessly for basic human and civil rights, these soldiers marched off to war to show their patriotism and loyalty to the United States. But when they returned from war they realized that, despite their sacrifices, the country still denied them civil rights.

The 370th had the distinction of being the only Black regiment completely staffed with Black officers. For its actions during the war, members received 21 Distinguished Service Crosses, one Distinguished Service Medal, and 68 Croix de Guerre.

Archival material also sheds light on the social conditions and historical events that conspired to make Pittsburgh one of the world’s leading contributors to the legacy of jazz music.
