Victoria

Jenna Coleman stars as the young Queen Victoria at the outset of her epic reign, which sets the stage for an entire era that would be named in her honor. “Victoria” airs in seven magnificent parts, fit for a queen, on **Masterpiece**.

The drama follows Victoria from the time she becomes Queen in 1837 at the age of 18, through her courtship and marriage to Prince Albert. Famous for her candor and spirit, she was the first woman who seemed to have it all: a passionate marriage, nine children, and the job of being Queen of the world’s most important nation. Victoria’s often tumultuous reign lasted for 63 years; she was England’s longest-serving monarch until Elizabeth II.

“Victoria” depicts what it was like for an ill-educated, emotionally deprived teenager to wake up one morning and find that she is the most powerful woman in the world. That it happened at all was practically a miracle. Victoria was queen only by virtue of ill luck and unfruitful marriages on the part of her uncles, who failed to produce legitimate heirs to the crown. Furthermore, her immediate predecessors were so disliked as kings that the institution of the monarchy seemed to be doomed.

“Victoria” charts how the new ruler rose to the challenge and weathered a series of crises—some of her own making—without ever losing her youthful charm and innate sense of justice, which made her popular with her subjects.

The two-hour premiere of “Victoria” on **Masterpiece** airs on 3-2 Sunday, the 15th at 6:00 p.m. All remaining episodes air Sundays at 8:00 p.m. On 3-1, the series airs Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 15th. See the AtoZ on pages 2 and 19 for additional air dates.



Sherlock 4

“Sherlock” on **Masterpiece** returns with “The Six Thatchers,” the first of three brand-new eagerly anticipated episodes promising laughter, tears, shocks, surprises, and some extraordinary adventures. As season four begins, the nation’s favorite detective, the mercurial Sherlock Holmes (Benedict Cumberbatch), is back once more on British soil, as Doctor Watson (Martin Freeman) and his wife Mary (Amanda Abbington) prepare for their biggest challenge yet: becoming parents.

One mysterious case in particular baffles Scotland Yard, but Sherlock is more interested in a seemingly trivial detail. Why is someone destroying images of the late Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher? Secrets of the Six Wives of Henry VIII

Travel with historian Lucy Worsley back to the Tudor court to witness some of the most dramatic moments in the lives of Henry VIII’s six wives, each of whom found a method of exerting influence. **Secrets of the Six Wives of Henry VIII**, a three-part series, combines drama with historical comment.

“Divorced” examines the happy marriage of Henry VIII to first wife, Katherine of Aragon. Despite her skill and devotion as his queen, she fails to give Henry the son he needs and he falls for Anne Boleyn.

In “Beheaded, Died,” Henry breaks with the Roman Church to marry Anne; he grows tired of her and falls for Jane Seymour. Anne’s fate is sealed; she is executed and Henry immediately marries Jane, who dies soon after she gives birth to a son.

Finally, in “Divorced, Beheaded, Survived,” Worsley presents the last three wives: Anne of Cleves, called “ugly”; young Catherine Howard, whose tragic childhood was abusive; and the far from saintly nurse, Katherine Parr.

Secrets of the Six Wives of Henry VIII airs on 3-2 Sundays at 9:00 p.m. beginning the 22nd. On 3-1, the drama airs Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 22nd and repeats Mondays at 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

Alzheimer's: Every Minute Counts

Alzheimer's: Every Minute Counts is an urgent wake-up call about the national threat posed by Alzheimer's disease. The documentary powerfully illuminates the social consequences for America unless a medical breakthrough is discovered for this currently incurable disease.

There are now five million Americans with Alzheimer's disease. The fact that the onset of Alzheimer's is primarily age-related, the number of those with Alzheimer's is expected to rise 70% by 2030. And by 2050, the Alzheimer's Association estimates that number will explode to 15 million, including half of Americans over 85, unless prevention or a cure is found.

This "tsunami" of Alzheimer's cases will not only be a profound human tragedy for the country, but an economic one as well. Due to the length of time people live with the illness and need care, it's the most expensive medical condition in the nation. Without a medical breakthrough, future costs for Alzheimer's threaten to put in jeopardy Medicare, Medicaid, and the life savings of millions of Americans. It's estimated that when the number of patients triples in the years ahead, the budget to address Alzheimer's will exceed that of the Defense Department.

Mozart in London

Hosted by historian and author Lucy Worsley, **Mozart in London** traces a pivotal period in the young composer's exceptional career.

Composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart came from a musically gifted family: his father Leopold was a court violinist and music teacher in Salzburg, his mother was a gifted keyboardist, and his sister was a talented harpsichord player. Realizing that his children's talents could potentially earn the

family a great deal of money, Leopold brought his family to London in 1764. The city was the ultimate destination for eighteenth century musicians, as it was home to a new class of wealthy merchants eager to support the arts.

Nonetheless, life in Britain was difficult: royal performances were demanding yet poorly paid endeavors and the people of London were less than welcoming. Despite the obstacles, Mozart's time in London would prove to be fruitful; it was the place where the eight-year-old musician composed his first symphony.

MERCY STREET

Mercy Street, the acclaimed Civil War-era drama set in the occupied city of Alexandria, Virginia, returns for a second season. Command and Control

Based on the critically-acclaimed book of the same title by Eric Schlosser, "Command and Control" on **American Experience** recounts, in chilling, minute-by-minute detail, the story of a deadly 1980 accident at a Titan II missile complex in Damascus, Arkansas. The film reveals the unlikely chain of events that caused the accident and the feverish efforts to prevent the explosion of a ballistic missile carrying the most powerful nuclear warhead ever built by the United States—600 times more powerful than the bomb that destroyed Hiroshima.

On the evening of September 18th, 1980, Airmen David F. Powell, a 21-year-old missile technician, and Jeffrey L. Plumb, a 19-year-old technician trainee, were performing routine maintenance at the Titan II silo in Damascus, Arkansas. As the two stood on a platform near the top of the Titan II, a socket fell from Powell's wrench, plummeted 70 feet and, shockingly, punctured the missile. A stream of highly explosive rocket fuel began pouring into the silo.

Nothing like this had ever happened to a Titan II before and the Air Force had no procedures in place to deal with the event. For the next eight hours, the leadership of the Strategic Air Command (SAC) frantically struggled to figure out how to prevent a massive explosion and retain control of the thermonuclear warhead—a weapon so powerful that it could destroy much of Arkansas and deposit lethal radioactive fallout across the East Coast.

This cautionary tale forces viewers to confront the great dilemma that the U.S. has faced since the dawn of the nuclear age: How do we manage weapons of mass destruction without being destroyed by them?

CONTAINMENT

Toxic remnants from the Cold War remain in millions of gallons of highly radioactive sludge, thousands of acres of radioactive land, and tens of thousands of unused hot buildings, some of which are slowly spreading deltas of contaminated ground water. Not a single country has a well-worked out plan for the safe storage of these deadly and long-lived materials.

Filmed at the deep underground repository site in New Mexico and at a weapons plant in Fukushima, “Containment” on *Independent Lens* explores the struggle to keep waste confined over millennia.

In 1979, the U.S. Department of Energy created the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) in Carlsbad, NM, the nation’s only deep geologic repository for nuclear waste. Congress required that the site be clearly marked against accidental future intrusion. “Containment” explores several of the proposed scenarios and potential marker designs.

WIPP was built over a salt bed thousands of feet deep and millions of years old, a site considered particularly invulnerable. But on February 14th, 2014, a waste barrel ignited and burst underground, releasing radiation into the environment. WIPP was subsequently closed for cleanup. A recent *Los Angeles Times* story indicated that the explosion ranks among the costliest nuclear accidents

in U.S. history, with costs that may rise as high as \$2 billion. The closure has backed up thousands of tons of radioactive waste from other states that were waiting to be transported to WIPP.

In March 2011, Fukushima, Japan became a repository for nuclear waste not by design, but through a devastating earthquake and resulting tsunami. As a result of a triple meltdown at the Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant, Fukushima is now a ghost town, where former residents can only briefly visit the homes to which they may never return to live. And at the Savannah River Site, a former nuclear weapons facility in South Carolina, bright yellow signs prohibit fishing amid the radioactive alligators and turtles that live there.

“Containment” includes an excerpt from “Uranium Drive-In,” which follows the emotional debate over a proposed uranium mill in southwestern Colorado.

Liberty & Slavery:

The Paradox of America’s Founding Fathers

Liberty & Slavery explores the paradox of America’s Founding Fathers being champions of liberty and yet simultaneously champions of slavery. They were men yearning for a nation of individual liberty and unprecedented independence. Thomas Jefferson expressed this desire for freedom from England in the Declaration of Independence in 1776 by writing: “We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal. . . .”

The phrase “all men are created equal” is the most powerful ideal that comes out of the American Revolution. But, at the time of the writing of this phrase, the origins of America were already seeded with a cruel paradox because many of the liberty-loving Southern Founding Fathers were also slave owners, including Thomas Jefferson, George Washington, James Madison, and Patrick Henry.

Liberty & Slavery examines this paradox in light of the 18th century culture into which the Founding Fathers were born, and also investigates why anti-slavery-owning Northern Founders compromised with the slave-owning Southern Founders regarding slavery before ratifying the U.S. Constitution.
