Masterpiece Mystery! presents "Grantchester," a six-part drama that focuses on the life of Sidney Chambers, a charismatic, charming clergyman who turns investigative vicar when one of his parishioners dies in suspicious circumstances.

In **The Manners of Downton Abbey**, historical advisor Alastair Bruce has the responsibility of consulting with "Downton Abbey's" actors on how to speak, stand, sit, eat, drink, dress, and keep a stiff upper lip.

5. **American Experience** premieres three epic stories that have shaped America's past and present: "Ripley: Believe It or Not"; "Klansville, U.S.A."; and "Edison."

6. **Frontline** presents "Gunned Down: The Power of the NRA," an investigation into how the NRA has consistently succeeded in defeating new gun control legislation.

The Jewel in the Crown, the beloved drama series based on Paul Scott's epic four novels known collectively as *The Raj Quartet*, returns to PBS.

Independent Lens presents a realistic picture of growing up poor in America in "Rich Hill," then focuses on the regrets of a young bank robber in "Evolution of a Criminal," and finally goes behind closed doors to tell the harrowing story of a young infantryman in Afghanistan, in "The Kill Team."

7. The new season of **Nova** continues with "Big Bang Machine," that joins scientists at the giant atom smashing facility at CERN who are preparing to restart the history-making collider, and then travels the globe in "Sinkholes—Buried Alive," to investigate what it's like to have your world vanish beneath your feet.

Billy Joel: The Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for Popular Music honors the singer-songwriter with musical performances by Tony Bennett, Josh Groban, LeAnn Rimes, John Mellencamp, and others.

The Path Appears, a three-part series, follows celebrity activists around the U.S. and the world to explore gender-inequality and the devastating impact of poverty on women and children.

From descendants of the infamous pirate Blackbeard to heroes of the Holocaust, **Genealogy Roadshow II** uncovers fascinating stories of diverse Americans in the series' second season.

Secrets of the Dead presents "Ben Franklin's Bones," which investigates the mysterious presence of more than 1200 bones discovered buried in the basement of Franklin's long-time London residence.

“Downton Abbey” on **Masterpiece Classic** returns for an epic fifth season of intimately interlaced stories centered on an English country estate—a deliciously entertaining formula that has made it the highest-rated drama in PBS history.

Viewers can expect to follow plot threads left dangling from last season, including Lady Mary’s courtship contest, Lady Edith’s trials as a secret single mom, Thomas’s scheming against Bates, Robert’s battles against modernity, Tom’s quest to be true to his ideals, Violet’s one-line zingers, and much, much more.

One of the recurring themes of “Downton Abbey” is change, from the wrenching consequences of the Titanic disaster in Season 1 to a notorious automobile accident at the end of Season 3—plus World War I, women’s rights, and the new morals, inven-

tions, and fashions of the 1920s, where Season 5 kicks off.

It’s 1924. The United Kingdom has its first Labor Party prime minister. The radio is the latest miracle of the age. And Downton’s traditional ways are besieged on all fronts, as evidenced by this exchange between the head housekeeper, Mrs. Hughes, and the butler, Mr. Carson: “We’re catching up, Mr. Carson. Whether you like it or not, Downton is catching up with the times we live in,” says the forward-thinking Mrs. Hughes. “That’s exactly what I’m afraid of!” the butler retorts.

Grantchester

PBS’s **Masterpiece**, the enduring Sunday night British drama and mystery series, is expanding to include at least 20 more hours in 2015, an approximate 50 percent increase, with new hours being broadcast either before or after the program’s traditional time slot of 8:00 p.m. The enlarged **Masterpiece** footprint kicks off with “Grantchester,” a six-part **Masterpiece Mystery!** following new episodes of “Downton Abbey.”

Already a hit in the UK, “Grantchester” is a detective drama set in the 1950s against the backdrop of the real hamlet of Grantchester near Cambridge. The drama focuses upon the life of Sidney Chambers, played by James Norton, a charismatic, charming clergyman who turns investigative vicar when one of his parishioners dies in suspicious circumstances. Chambers forges an unlikely partnership—which quickly becomes a true friendship—with gruff Detective Inspector Geordie Keating (Robson Green), as each offers a different insight into the crimes they begin to unravel.

Before becoming a priest, Chambers was a soldier in the Scots Guards who fought in the Second World War, likes jazz, drinks, and attracts women.

Based on the James Runcie novel, *Sidney Chambers and the Shadow of Death*, the young vicar is styled after Runcie’s late father, who was Archbishop of Canterbury in the 1980s.

“Grantchester on **Masterpiece Mystery!**” airs Sundays at 9:00 p.m. beginning the 18th. On HD3-1, it airs Sundays at 9:00 p.m. beginning the 18th and repeats Mondays at 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

The Manners of Downton Abbey

Hovering just off camera on the set of “Downton Abbey” is the man who watches the actors’ every move. The director? No, it’s the historical advisor, Alastair Bruce, who is an expert on royal ceremony and custom. Among his responsibilities is to consult with “Downton Abbey’s” actors on how to speak, stand, sit, eat, drink, dress, and keep a stiff upper lip.

The Manners of Downton Abbey, A Masterpiece Special, includes many memorable moments from the series. For example, Hugh Bonneville, who plays Robert, Earl of Grantham, recounts that in one emotional scene during Season 3, he felt the story called for him to embrace Matthew Crawley (Dan Stevens). “But Alastair said, ‘Don’t be ridiculous! You might just shake his hand—just.’” Michelle Dockery, who plays Lady Mary, adds, “I’ve sometimes said to Alastair, ‘Can I lean back in my chair just a little bit’, and he said, ‘Absolutely not—never in front of your grandmother!’” And on the subject of ladies’ proper attire, Laura

Carmichael, who plays Lady Edith, points out a crucial detail from Season 4. “When Edith goes to have dinner at (Michael) Gregson’s flat, she’s not wearing gloves, which was very shocking. She was practically naked!”

The Manners of Downton Abbey is divided into five enlightening sections—How to Eat, How to Marry, How to Behave, How to Dress, and How to Make Money.

Ripley: Believe It or Not

“Ripley” on **American Experience** is the story of the man who popularized the iconic phrase, “Believe it—or Not!”

LeRoy Robert Ripley rose to fame during the Great Depression, transforming himself from a skinny, buck-toothed boy into an entertainer who mesmerized the nation with his razzle-dazzle blend of homespun Americana, colorful exotica, and freakish oddities. Over three decades, his “Believe It or Not!” franchise grew into an entertainment empire, expanding from newspapers to radio, film, and ultimately, television.

At the center of it all was Ripley, whose obsession with the odd and keen eye for the curious made him one of the richest men in the country. At the height of the Depression, his empire was raking in half-a-million a year. Americans not only loved his bizarre fare, but were fascinated by the man himself, and the eccentric, globetrotting playboy became an unlikely national celebrity.

Born in Santa Rosa, California in 1890, Ripley was a loner as a child. He began drawing at an early age and eventually parlayed his artistic knack and wide-eyed enthusiasm for adventure into a job as a sports cartoonist with New York’s *Globe and Commercial Advertiser*. It was at the *Globe* that he created his first sports-themed “Believe It or Not!” and the popular feature took off.

The opportunity of a lifetime soon came when the *Globe*’s editors sent him on a four-month around-the-world cruise, and Ripley’s daily dispatches, chronicling the most bizarre forms of human behavior and the man-made oddities he witnessed, captivated readers.

Klansville, U.S.A.

“Klansville, U.S.A.” on **American Experience** shifts the focus from those who supported the civil rights movement to those who saw integration and social change as a threat to their way of life.

Born in Pulaski, Tennessee in 1865, the Ku Klux Klan was established by decommissioned Confederate soldiers following the Civil War. Initially formed as a fraternal social club, the group quickly became violent, and had begun to dissolve in 1871 under pressure from the federal government.

In 1915, D.W. Griffith’s *The Birth of a Nation* romanticized the Klan, portraying their violence towards African Americans as necessary to restore order in a chaotic South. The film sparked a Klan revival, but bad press and power struggles tore the group apart in the 1930s.

As the civil rights movement grew, the long-dormant Ku Klux Klan gained momentum as well, having reemerged after the 1954 Supreme Court *Brown v. Board of Education* decision. In the summer of 1963, Bob Jones petitioned the United Klans of America for a charter for his home state of North Carolina, and on August 17th, he was chosen to be the group’s first Grand Dragon.

Just two weeks later, American TV sets were filled with images of the undeniable power of the growing civil rights movement at the March on Washington. It took Jones just three years more to grow the North Carolina Klan from a handful of friends to some 10,000 members, more than the Klans of all other southern states combined. In the process, Jones helped give the Tarheel State a new nickname: “Klansville, USA.”

Edison

“Edison” on **American Experience** explores the complex alchemy that accounts for the enduring celebrity of America’s most famous inventor, offering new perspectives on the man and illuminating not only the true nature of invention, but its role in turn-of-the-century America’s rush into the future.

By the time he died in 1931, Thomas Alva Edison was one of the most famous men in the world. The holder of more patents (1,093) than any other inventor in history, Edison had amassed a fortune and achieved glory as the genius behind such revolutionary inventions as sound recording, motion pictures, and electric light.

Born on the threshold of America’s burgeoning industrial empire, Edison’s curiosity led him to its cutting edge—and to the fascination with telegraphy that set him on his course through life. With just three months of formal schooling, he took on one seemingly impossible technical challenge after another. By intuition and persistence, he invariably found the solution. With a group of like-minded men, Edison had an audacious goal: to create one minor invention every ten days and a major one every month.

Driven and intensely competitive, Edison was often neglectful in his private life and could be ruthless in business. His first wife died of a morphine overdose at the age of twenty-nine; his closest friendship ended with a bitter and irrevocable rupture.

Later, challenged by competition, Edison launched an ugly propaganda campaign against his rivals, and used his credibility as an electrical expert to help ensure that high-voltage electrocution became a form of capital punishment.

Gunned Down: The Power of the NRA

In December of 2012, 20-year-old Adam Lanza walked into Sandy Hook Elementary School and killed 26 children and adults with a Bushmaster rifle before taking his own life with a handgun. The tragedy shocked the nation, sparking an outpouring of grief and widespread calls from the public for politicians to “do something” about guns. The moment, it seemed, was gun control advocates’ to seize. But like many times before, they ran into intense opposition from a powerful political force: the National Rifle Association (NRA).

Frontline presents “Gunned Down: The Power of the NRA,” an investigation into the NRA, its political evolution and influence, and how it has consistently succeeded in defeating new gun control legislation.

Drawing on interviews with leading voices on both sides of the gun regulation debate, “Gunned Down” goes inside one of the country’s greatest divides to illuminate how the NRA reinvented itself from a group of gun enthusiasts and sportsmen with minimal political focus, to a powerful lobbying force opposing any perceived infringement of the constitutional right to bear arms. “It really has nothing to do with guns; it has to do with freedom,” former NRA spokesman John Aquilino says. “Do you give your freedom to the government or do you keep it within yourself, within your community, within your family? And that’s the broad appeal.”

The program features firsthand accounts from family members of mass shooting victims, including Newtown, and traces what happened after Newtown and why. “In Washington, they say that the NRA came out of Newtown stronger than ever,” comments **Frontline** filmmaker Michael Kirk. “This is a story for anyone who wonders how that could be.”

As Paul Scott wrote at the beginning of the first volume of *The Raj Quartet*, “This is the story of

a rape, of the events that led up to it and followed it and the place in which it happened. There was no trial in the judicial sense ... but as time went on this rape became the core of a plot and a system that ended with the spectacle of two nations in violent opposition....”

It’s 1942. The Japanese, having conquered Burma, are threatening to invade and Gandhi is calling on the British to ‘Quit India.’ In Mayapore, a young man, Hari Kumar, is arrested and, across the river that divides the city,

Daphne Manners has arrived from England. It is the start of a chain of events binding English and Indians in a web of love, tragedy, and death. And at the center is Ronald Merrick, District Superintendent of Police, a guardian of the British Empire of which India is the “jewel.”

Jewel in the Crown will be broadcast Sundays at 6:00 p.m. beginning the 11th. On HD3-1, it airs Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 11th and repeats Mondays at 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon beginning the 12th.

Big Bang Machine

On July 4th, 2012, scientists at the giant atom smashing facility at CERN (the European Organization for Nuclear Research) announced the discovery of a subatomic particle that seems like a tantalizingly close match to the elusive Higgs Boson, thought to be responsible for giving all the stuff in the universe its mass. Since it was first proposed nearly 50 years ago, the Higgs has been the holy grail of particle physicists: finding it completes the “standard model” that underlies all of modern particle physics.

In “Big Bang Machine” on *Nova*, CERN’s scientists are now preparing for the Large Hadron Collider’s second act, when they restart the history-making collider, running at higher energy—hoping for the next great discovery that will change what we know about the particles and forces that make up our universe.

Sinkholes—Buried Alive

In Tampa, Florida, in February 2013, a giant hole opened up under the bedroom floor of Jeffrey Bush, swallowing the 36-year-old as he slept. His body was never found. Bush was a victim of a sinkhole—a growing worldwide hazard that lurks wherever limestone and other water-soluble rocks underpin the soil.

When carbon dioxide in the air dissolves in rainwater, it forms a weak acid that attacks the soft rocks, riddling them with holes like Swiss cheese. Sinkholes can occur gradually when the surface subsides into bowl-shaped depressions, or suddenly, when the ground gives way—often catastrophically. Sinkholes have swallowed highways, apartment buildings, horses, camels, even golfers, with monster-size holes cracking the earth from Siberia to Louisiana.

In “Sinkholes—Buried Alive,” *Nova* travels the globe to investigate what it’s like to have your world vanish beneath your feet.

In part two, Jennifer Garner returns to her native West Virginia to visit families enrolled in Save the Children’s Early Steps program, which introduces books and early learning to children living in poverty.

The third part focuses on the fact that in the United States, domestic violence claims more than three lives a day on average.

Secrets of the Dead

Ben Franklin’s Bones

For eighteen years, Ben Franklin, the great American inventor and diplomat, lived in a four story Georgian house at 36 Craven Street in London. As ambassador from the colonies, he entertained, lived, and even allowed other intellectuals of the time to stay at the house while he lived there from 1757 through 1775.

In 1997, nearly 225 years later, as the house stood on the brink of collapse, the “Friends of Benjamin Franklin House” decided to renovate the building and turn it into a museum honoring one of America’s Founding Fathers.

It was only a month into the renovation, when a construction worker made a grisly dis-

covery in the basement: A human thigh bone sticking out of the dirt. Further excavation revealed more than 1200 other bones all dated about 200 years prior. People wondered if Franklin might have had a darker side as the bones had been meticulously cut and drilled.

Medical historians suspect that Franklin was aware of the bodies in his basement, but did he know the extent of what was going on and why?



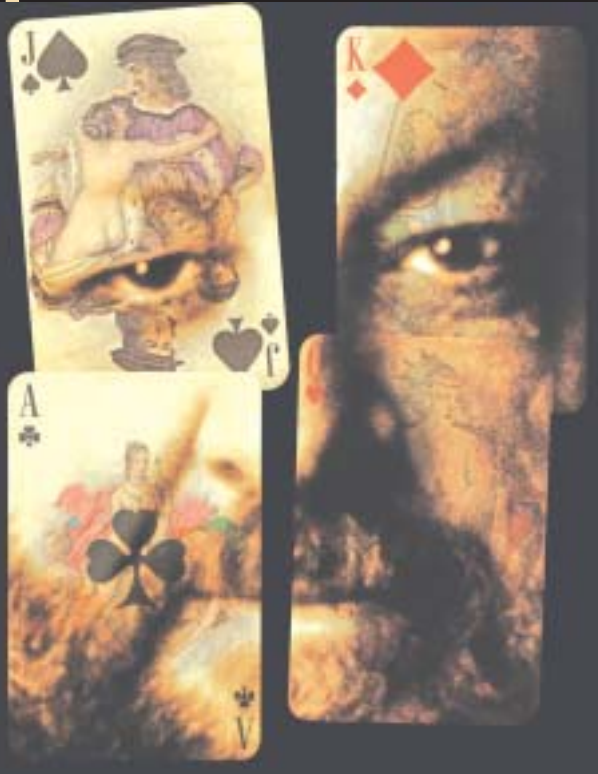
