CAPITOL FOURTH



This July 4th, America's national Independence Day celebration kicks off our country's 240th birthday, as **A Capitol Fourth (2016)** on PBS welcomes back well-known television personality Tom Bergeron to host the festivities.

Broadcast live on PBS from the West Lawn of the U.S. Capitol, the all-star musical extravaganza puts viewers front and center for the greatest display of fireworks anywhere in the nation.

A Capitol Fourth features performances by legendary singer/songwriter Smokey Robinson; recording star Kenny Loggins; singer-songwriter Gavin DeGraw; country vocalist Cassadee Pope; actress and singer Amber Riley ("Glee"); musical prodigy and classical crossover star Jackie Evancho; television star Sutton Foster ("Gilmore Girls"); and the cast of the smash hit Broadway musical *On Your Feet!*, the inspiring true story of Gloria and Emilio Estefan. Alisan Porter, the Season 10 winner of "The Voice," will open the show with a special performance of the National Anthem.

The concert will also feature special segments in celebration of the 75th anniversary of the USO and the 100th anniversary of the National Park Service.

The 36th annual broadcast of **A Capitol Fourth** airs on PBS before a concert audience of hundreds of thousands and millions more

at home, as well as to our troops serving around the world on the American Forces Network.

A Capitol 4th (2016) will be broadcast on 3-2 Monday, the 4th at 7:00 p.m. and again at 8:30 p.m. On HD3-1, it can be seen Monday, the 4th at 8:00 p.m and 12:00 midnight.

Generals at War

Generals at War, a six-part series, takes a fresh approach to the great battles of World War II, examining them through the decisions, dilemmas, and disasters of the generals on both sides of conflict. The series explores their moves and countermoves, utilizing re-enactments of the generals as they attempt to outwit and outfight each other.

The battles featured in the series—Singapore, El Alamein, Kursk, Stalingrad, Midway, and The Bulge—are key turning points in the progress of the war. The generals featured include some of the most charismatic military leaders of all time: Rommel, Model, Montgomery, Chuikov, Yamashita, and Von Manstein. In this contest of skill, bluff and counterbluff, the lives of thousands of men, their own reputations, and those of their political masters are at stake.

The Battle of Singapore – In 1941, General Arthur Percival is the British general tasked with the defense of the wealthy colonies of Malaya and Singapore. General Tomoyuki Yamashita—the Tiger of Malaya—leads the "driving charge" to oust him. Though outnumbered from the start, the Japanese have bluff and bicycles.

The Battle of Midway – In 1942, right after Pearl Harbour, Japanese Admiral Nagumo takes the mighty Japanese fleet to the island of Midway to destroy American aircraft carriers. He lays a trap for U.S. Admiral Fletcher and his decimated forces. Nagumo doesn't know that Fletcher holds a lethal trump card.

The Battle of El Alamein – In 1942, two of the most charismatic generals of all time, Field Marshall Erwin Rommel, the Desert Fox, and General Bernard Montgomery face off over a barren stretch of rocky desert in Egypt. Rommel relies on blitzkrieg tactics of speed, surprise, and daring, while Montgomery tries a different tactic.

The Battle of Starlingrad – In 1942, Hitler becomes obsessed with taking Stalingrad, the city which bears the name of his arch-enemy Joseph Stalin. The German army is led by General Paulus, a meticulous war gamer. Across the map table is Soviet General Chuikov, a hardened fighter, not afraid to get his hands dirty. Paulus is confident he will soon bring the city to its knees; ultimately, Paulus is forced to make the hardest decision of his military career.

The Battle of Kursk – It's 1943 and Germany and Russia clash near the Soviet city of Kursk, as each vies for control of the Eastern Front. The Germans are led by Field Marshal Von Manstein, an aristocratic master tactician. Facing him across the battlefield is the Red Army's Marshal Zhukov, ruthless and opinionated. The two armies eventually meet in the biggest tank battle of all time and the result changes the course of the war forever.

The Battle of the Bulge – In 1944 Adolf Hitler plays his last trump card, a gigantic offensive in the West. Field Marshal Walther Model, a ruthless commander and loyal servant of Hitler, leads the charge. Model sends his armoured spearheads crashing through the weakly defended American lines of U.S. General Omar Bradley, who is caught completely off guard.

Generals at War will be broadcast on 3-2 Fridays at 9:00 p.m. beginning the 1st and Mondays at 10:00 p.m. beginning the 4th. The series will be broadcast on HD3-1 in August.

The Trials of Muhammad Ali

“The Trials of Muhammad Ali” on **Independent Lens** explores the extraordinary and complex life of the legendary athlete outside the boxing ring. From joining the controversial Nation of Islam and changing his name from Cassius Clay to Muhammad Ali and his refusal to serve in the Vietnam War in the name of protesting racial inequality to his global humanitarian work, Ali remains an inspiring and controversial figure.

Focusing on some of the most noteworthy and provocative aspects of the legendary athlete’s life, the 90-minute film explores his lifelong journey of spiritual transformation. From his Louisville roots through his years in exile to receiving the Presidential Medal of Freedom, Ali’s path was that of poet to pariah to global ambassador for peace.

In 1964, when the 22-year-old Olympic gold medalist won his first heavyweight championship, he shouted, “I shook up the world!” But his earthshaking had only begun. Soon he announced he had become a Muslim with a new name: Muhammad Ali.

In 1967, after being denied conscientious objector status, Ali refused military induction. Convicted of draft evasion, he was sen-



tenced to five years in prison and his passport was revoked. Stripped of his title and banned from boxing, Ali faced an American public enraged by his opposition to the Vietnam War and unwilling to accept his conversion to Islam. Vilified in many corners at home, he became an international symbol of opposition to an unjust war.

Filing round after round of legal appeals all the way to the Supreme Court, he supported his family via a nationwide speaking tour across a country divided over the war abroad and racism at home.

Archival scenes highlight the forces that supported and opposed him, including his spiritual mentors, Malcolm X and Elijah Muhammad, and critics of his stance, such as Jackie Robinson and Joe Louis. What emerges is the hidden history and a complex portrait of Muhammad Ali.

Thomas Paine’s To Begin the World Over Again

Founding Father of America, he was one of the world’s most provocative writers and worst politicians, a very nearly deadly combination. But he lived by the creed that “one must always speak the truth as one sees it, no matter the consequences.”

Thomas Paine changed the face of the world through his writings. *Common Sense* inspired the American Revolution; *Rights of Man* defined the French Revolution; and *The Age of Reason* called on us to use our ability to reason as the basis for our beliefs and morality.

The man who ignited revolutions would die largely ignored and disdained, but when he was writing his books he was at the epicenter of world events, literally transforming nations through the power of his words. Ironically, though largely forgotten, Paine is quoted by all and every political faction in America today. His ideas are universal and speak to humanity’s desires for equality, true freedom of religion, an end to the war machine, and all prejudice.

All the triumphs and tragedies of Paine’s life are in **Thomas Paine’s To Begin the World Over Again**, a live performance of the acclaimed one-man play featuring Ian Ruskin as Paine and Elliot Gould as the narrator. For those who know his work, Thomas Paine’s vision of a just society serves as both an inspiration and a call to action.

Thomas Paine’s To Begin the World Over Again will be broadcast on 3-2 Sunday, the 31st at 10:30 p.m. On HD3-1, it can be seen Tuesday, the 5th at 7:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

A Ride Along the Lincoln Highway

The Lincoln Highway was established in 1913 as America’s first transcontinental highway. It started in Times Square in New York City, then passed through New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Nebraska, Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, and California, ending in Lincoln Park in San Francisco.

An attentive driver with the right books and guides (and software) can still travel its route from New York City to San Francisco (or vice versa) and get a fascinating view of this land and its people, seeing things that one could never spot along an interstate.

The route of the Lincoln Highway tried to follow the fastest and most direct route across America from one ocean to the other—and early riders often ceremonially dipped their car tires in the surf at both ends of the journey.

When the federal government began giving numbers to highways in the late 1920s, the Lincoln Highway was broken up into U.S. 1, U.S. 530, U.S. 40, and U.S. 50.

Nearly two-thirds of the Lincoln’s length was designated U.S. 30.

While recounting the history of the route, **A Ride Along the Lincoln Highway** incorporates footage of cross-country journeys with unexpected encounters that make traditional two-lane traveling so rewarding.

The program includes stops at the Lincoln Café in Mount Vernon, Iowa; a cool little gas station in Grand Island, Nebraska; and the General Store in remote Ibapah, Utah.

THE TEST

The Test examines the history of atomic testing in Nevada, atomic tourism, and the consequences of being in Nevada's "atomic backyard."

Following World War II, as the United States plunged into the Cold War, scientists raced to keep the nation secure in the nuclear age. They lacked a full understanding of atomic weaponry's destructive scope and knew the bomb had to be tested further. Ultimately, atomic testing sites, including one in Nevada, were established.

The one-hour documentary delves into the testing in Nevada and the rise of "atomic culture." Highlights include the elaborately constructed "doom towns" and descriptions of "atomic tourism"—how nuclear testing became a main event in Las Vegas as residents and visitors alike lined up to watch "the show." The film also details the history leading up to the 1996 Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty, still in effect today.

Additionally, **The Test** examines the role that the former test site serves today in preparing first responders for the fight against terrorism and other dangers.

The Incredible World War II Escape of Major Damon "Rocky" Gause

Filmed in Bataan, Corregidor, and in Manila, **War Journal: The Incredible World War II Escape of Major Damon "Rocky" Gause** tells the amazing true story of one of the most impossible escapes in World War II. American airman Damon "Rocky" Gause escaped a prison camp on the Bataan Peninsula in 1942, swam to nearby Corregidor Island, and then sailed with U.S. serviceman William Lloyd Osborne in a leaky 20-foot fishing boat from the Philippines to Australia.

Fifty-two days and 3,200 miles later, the two service men reached freedom. Despite facing typhoons, constant threats from Japanese ships, submarines, and airplanes, and a lack of water and food, both Gause and Osborne survived to recount their ordeal.

The White House: Inside Story opens the door to America's most famous address. Viewers experience the precision with which the Executive Mansion operates—as a private home and a workplace where military and economic decisions shape and affect history.

The White House: Inside Story features new interviews with First Ladies Michelle Obama, Laura Bush, Barbara Bush, and Rosalynn Carter, reminiscing about their families' place in the 200-year history of 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. These personal stories are interwoven with historical facts about the "house that George Washington built."

The Kitchen Wisdom of Cecilia Chiang

The Kitchen Wisdom of Cecilia Chiang is a new cooking mini-series documenting the amazing life story of chef and restaurateur Cecilia Chiang, known as "the Julia Child of Chinese food in America."

In the 1950s, Chinese food in the U.S. was mostly westernized Cantonese food, such as chop suey and chow mein. Then, along came restaurateur Cecilia Chiang. Never having cooked professionally, Cecilia launched the legendary Mandarin Restaurant in 1961, "called the best Chinese restaurant in America." She mentored the likes of Julia Child, James Beard, and a young Alice Waters (before her *Chez Panisse* fame). In the process, she introduced Szechuan, Hunan, and Beijing cuisine, and revolutionized Chinese cooking in America.



In this six-part series, top chefs of the Bay Area invite Cecilia—who is still active and well into her 90s—into their kitchens to recreate some of the Mandarin's classic dishes. It's a cooking series with an incredible story to tell, and a grande dame to tell it.

PERVERT PARK

Explores the Lives of Sex Offenders

There are currently more than 800,000 convicted sex offenders in the United States, and the country has seen an estimated 15% increase in registered sex offenders over the past five years. “Pervert Park” on **P.O.V.** offers a challenging look at this deeply stigmatized category of criminals.

“Pervert Park” takes place at Florida Justice Transitions in St. Petersburg, Fla., founded in 1996 by Nancy Morais, the mother of a sex offender who had difficulty finding a place to live after his conviction. It looks like your average trailer park, but this is the place 120 residents call home.

Their lives are heavily regulated: Offenders are forbidden by law from living within 1,000 feet of any place children congregate. The residents are required to check in with the Florida State Police twice a year, are monitored by satellite surveillance, and are listed in a sex-offender registry easily available online as a phone app. All of the program’s staff are convicted sex offenders as well.

The documentary includes adult content: candid discussions of the unspeakable offenses committed by the residents, as well as their own harrowing stories of being sexually abused.

“These are the crimes that are often too painful or uncomfortable to discuss,” say filmmakers Frida and Lasse Barkfors. “These are the people no one wants to live amongst. These are the neighbors we wish away and, through sex offender laws and labeling, literally and figuratively move to the outskirts of our towns and our lives. And yet there they are, 1,000 feet away from our schools and our parks and playgrounds and churches.”

“Pervert Park” raises significant questions. Should America give these criminals a second chance? If we hope to curb the cycle and culture of sexual violence, is there value in exploring the lives of sex offenders, regardless of how heartbreaking and difficult it might be?

Valentino’s Ghost: Framing the Arab Image

In the 1920s Hollywood, the Arab was a hero, as played by the iconic actor Rudolph Valentino in his “Sheik” movies (right). By the 1970s, Arabs and Muslims were depicted as embodiments of evil, not only in Hollywood films, but in children’s cartoons, TV sitcoms, the news, and even on radio. What happened?



Narrated by actor Mike Farrell, **Valentino’s Ghost**, a *New York Times* Critics’ Pick, exposes the way America’s foreign policy agenda in the Middle East influences Hollywood and the U.S. media’s portrayals of Arabs and Muslims. The documentary lays bare the truth behind subjects not often pursued by mainstream American media: “why they hate us”; “why we hate them”; why we were attacked on 9/11; the U.S.-Israeli relationship; and more.

Polls show that 46 percent of Americans hold negative views of Islam. **Valentino’s Ghost** invites viewers to examine history and Western entertainment from the Arab perspective, a rare point of view in the United States.

The film tackles one of the most controversial subjects in America today: U.S. support for Israeli occupation of Palestinian territories. It features riveting and often stunning perspectives from scholars of history, religion, media studies, and politics, including the late American writer Gore Vidal; John Mearsheimer, author of *The Israel Lobby*; celebrated British war correspondent Robert Fisk; Pulitzer Prize winning journalist Anthony Shadid; Harvard and Oxford historian Niall Ferguson; TV star Tony Shalhoub; and media expert Jack Shaheen.

In the words of Philip Giradi, former CIA officer and executive director, Council for the National Interest in Washington, D.C., **Valentino’s Ghost** exposes widespread bigotry and the deliberate shaping of a narrative against Arabs while also providing considerable insights into why American foreign policy continues to fail in an important part of the world.”

Viewers may disagree with many of the observations in this documentary. There are no Israeli officials or Pentagon spokesmen in this film. It is simply an engrossing and illuminating examination of American perceptions of Arabs and the Arab world that might be worth thinking about.

Madama Butterfly

Anthony Minghella’s breathtaking production of Puccini’s classic “Madama Butterfly” airs on **Great Performances at the Met**. Kristine Opolais brings her heartbreaking interpretation of the title role and Roberto Alagna sings Lieutenant Pinkerton, the callous officer who crushes Butterfly’s dreams of love.

The opera takes place at the turn of the last century in the Japanese port city of Nagasaki, one of the country’s few ports open to foreign ships. Temporary marriages for foreign sailors were not unusual. The title character of Madama Butterfly—a young Japanese geisha who clings to the belief that her arrangement with a visiting American naval officer is a loving and permanent marriage—is one of the defining roles in opera. The lyric beauty of Puccini’s score, especially the music for the thoroughly believable lead role, has made Butterfly timeless.






