The EMPEROR of All MALADIES

Ken Burns presents **Cancer: The Emperor of All Maladies**, a three-part, six-hour documentary based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning book of the same name by Siddhartha Mukherjee, M.D. The series tells the comprehensive story of cancer, from its first description in an ancient Egyptian scroll to the gleaming laboratories of modern research institutions. The film interweaves a sweeping historical narrative with intimate stories about contemporary patients, and an investigation into the latest scientific breakthroughs that may have brought us, at long last, within sight of lasting cures. The film comprises the following three two-hour episodes:

Magic Bullets: The search for a “cure” for cancer is the greatest epic in the history of science. It spans centuries and continents, and is full of its share of heroes, villains, and sudden twists. This episode follows that centuries-long search, but centers on the story of Sidney Farber, who, defying conventional wisdom in the late 1940s, introduces the modern era of chemotherapy, eventually galvanizing a full-scale national “war on cancer.”

The Blind Men and the Elephant: This episode picks up the story in the wake of the declaration of a “war on cancer” by

Richard Nixon in 1971. Flush with optimism and awash with federal dollars, the cancer field plunges forward in search of a cure. In the lab, rapid progress leads to the revolutionary discovery of the genetic basis of cancer. But at the bedside, where patients are treated, few new therapies become available. It is not until the late 1990s that the advances in research begin to translate into precise therapies.

Finding an Achilles Heel: The final episode picks up the story at another moment of buoyant optimism in the cancer world. Scientists believe they have cracked the essential mystery of the malignant cell and the first targeted therapies have been developed, with the promise of many more to follow. But very quickly cancer reveals new layers of complexity and a formidable array of unforeseen defenses. But by the second decade of the 2000s, the work of scientists pays off, and the bewildering complexity of the cancer cell, so recently considered unassailable, yields to a more ordered picture, revealing new vulnerabilities and avenues of attack.

Cancer: The Emperor of All Maladies will be broadcast Monday through Wednesday, 30th–April 1st at 8:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Monday through Wednesday, 30th–April 1st at 7:00 p.m. and repeats the next day at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.



Call the Midwife, Season Four

PBS is poised to deliver another dose of newborns, cobbled streets, and homespun charm with the premiere of **Call the Midwife**, season four.

Join the nurses and midwives as they welcome a new decade and a new nurse, Barbara Gilbert. Gilbert arrives at Nonnatus and, after a disastrous start, earns the respect of her colleagues by helping a new mother overcome

difficulties. Trixie faces one of the most emotionally draining cases of her career, and the Turners broker a domestic deal that breaks the mold for the 1950s and 60s. Sister Evangelina finally agrees to undergo tests for her abdominal pain.

According to Heidi Thomas, the eloquent writer behind the period drama, the series is no longer based on the memoirs of midwife Jennifer Worth; they had to run out at some point. But as the result of a great deal of historical research, a strong relationship with the original nuns, and interviews with many midwives from the period, Thomas has had little difficulty coming up with new, touching and engaging tales, or “memorials to how life was lived at the time,” as she puts it.

Call the Midwife IV airs Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 29th. On HD3-1, it airs Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 29th and repeats Mondays at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Mr. Selfridge, Season Three

Jeremy Piven continues his role as “Mr. Selfridge” on **Masterpiece Classic**, the drama inspired by the life of charismatic American entrepreneur Harry Gordon Selfridge, whose business in London’s Oxford Street is even today a successful institution. But for its founder, Selfridge, things were very different. His story was a rollercoaster ride that didn’t end all that well.

The third season of “Mr. Selfridge” picks up in 1919 just after the end of World War I, the point at which his life really begins to unravel.

Zoë Wanamaker (Harry Potter films, Agatha Christie: Poirot) joins the series cast to play trouble-making Russian Princess, Marie de Bolotoff.

“Mr. Selfridge, III” on **Masterpiece Classic** airs Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 29th. A Friday repeat on April 3rd is TBA. On HD3-1, it airs Sundays at 9:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight beginning the 29th.

Pasquale Esposito Celebrates Enrico Caruso

Pasquale Esposito Celebrates Enrico Caruso blends a stunning concert recorded live on the 13th Century Castello Giusso on the Amalfi Coast in Italy with travel footage shot in Caruso's Naples and Sorrento as well as the United States. Italian tenor Pasquale Esposito, born and raised in Caruso's neighborhood, performs several of Caruso's most famous songs and arias.

Enrico Caruso was the world's first international recording star, taking opera to the masses. He was the first Classical Cross Over artist, blazing the way for Luciano Pavarotti, Placido Domingo, and Andrea Bocelli, and other great international artists of the 21st Century.

Pasquale Esposito Celebrates Enrico Caruso airs Sunday, the 8th at 8:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Sunday, the 15th at 7:00 p.m.

Gospel legends and all-star guests come together in **Rock My Soul**, a celebration of one of America's most popular and influential musical genres.

Born of fevered rural tent revivals and urban clapboard churches, gospel music was made for the concert stage.
