United States of Secrets

Last year, Edward Snowden downloaded tens of thousands of top-secret documents from a highly secure government computer network. The revelations that followed touched off a fierce debate over the massive surveillance operations conducted by the National Security Agency. Now, in a special two-part **Frontline**, “United States of Secrets” investigates the secret history of the unprecedented surveillance program that began in the wake of September 11th and continues today.

Through exclusive interviews with intelligence insiders, cabinet officials, and government whistle-blowers, part one of “United States of Secrets” reveals how the U.S. government came to monitor the communications of millions of Americans and to collect billions of records on ordinary people around the world.

In the second part, **Frontline** explores the role of Silicon Valley in the National Security Agency’s dragnet. As big technology companies encouraged users to share more and more information about their lives, they created a trove of data that could be useful not simply to advertisers, but also to the government. The revelations of NSA contractor Edward Snowden would push Silicon Valley into the center of a debate over privacy and government surveillance.

The Trial of Edward Snowden

What if Edward Snowden didn’t flee to another country and was held for trial?

The case of NSA contractor Edward Snowden has divided America: to some he is a hero; to others a traitor. In **The Trial of Edward Snowden**, a well-placed contractor for the NSA exposes a massive surveillance program but then doesn’t flee the country to avoid prosecution. A panel of experts convene to imagine what might happen if such a case were brought to trial, in effect putting Snowden (renamed “Snowman”) on trial in absentia.

Panelists include former U.S. Attorney Joseph P. Russoniello; Pulitzer-Prize winning *New York Times* reporter and expert on the NSA, Charles Savage; and Abbe D. Lowell of Chadbourne & Parke in Washington, D.C., who takes on the role of Snowman’s defense attorney. Other panelists include Michael Hayden, retired Air Force general and former director of the CIA and NSA; Georgetown University constitutional law professor David D. Cole; and Harvard law professor and former federal judge Nancy Gertner.

The discussion begins with how the press and the NSA deal with leaks; how the government approaches the prosecution of such leaks; and how the defense plans for trial. Other topics include whether or not someone in Snowman’s position is guilty of espionage or perhaps treason, i.e., giving aid and comfort to the enemy.

If anyone wants to know exactly why the Snowden affair divides the nation, you’ll find the answer here as panelists argue passionately for their viewpoints.

Escape from Nazi Alcatraz

Colditz Castle, a notorious prisoner of war camp in Nazi Germany, was supposed to be escape-proof. But in World War II, a group of British officers dreamt up an escape plan: in a secret attic workshop, they constructed a two-man glider out of bed sheets and floorboards. The plan was to fly to freedom from the roof of the castle, but the war ended before they could put it to the test.

Now, in “Escape from Nazi Alcatraz,” a two-hour **Nova**, a team of aero engineers and carpenters rebuilds the glider in the same attic using the same materials, and they’ll use a bathtub full of concrete to catapult the glider off the roof.

As the hair-raising launch 90 feet up draws near, the program explores the Colditz legend and exposes the secrets of other ingenious and audacious escapes. Then, after a 70-year wait, the team finally finds out if the legendary glider plan would have succeeded.

“Escape from Nazi Alcatraz” on **Nova** airs Wednesday, May 14th at 8:00 p.m., Saturday, May 17th at 10:00 p.m., and Sunday, May 18th at 12:00 midnight. On HD3-1, it airs Wednesday, May 14th at 8:00 p.m. and Thursday, May 15th at 8:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.



D-Day’s Sunken Secrets

On June 6th, 1944, the Allies launched an armada to invade the Normandy beaches and liberate Europe from the Nazis. In less than 24 hours, more than 5,000 ships—the largest armada in history—crossed the English Channel, along with thousands of tanks and land craft and 200,000 men. Hundreds of ships sank while running the gauntlet of mines and bunkers, creating one of the world’s largest underwater archaeological sites.

Now, **Nova**, in the two-hour “D-Day’s Sunken Secrets,” has exclusive access to an extensive survey of the seabed bordering the beachheads. Dive teams, submersibles, and underwater robots identify key examples of the Allied craft that fell victim to German shellfire, mines, and torpedoes.

The program presents a blow-by-blow account of D-Day events and reveals how the Allies’ intricate planning and advanced technology were vital to assure the success of the most ambitious and risky military operation ever launched.

“D-Day’s Sunken Secrets” on **Nova** will be broadcast Wednesday, May 28th at 8:00 p.m. and repeats Sunday, June 1st at 12:00 midnight. On HD3-1, it airs Wednesday, May 28th at 8:00 p.m. and Saturday, May 31st at 10:30 p.m.



A Simple Piece of Paper

What happens when a state provides adopted citizens access to their original birth certificates?



Most adoptees in the America are never allowed to have the record of their own birth. But in the last fifteen years, a number of states have reversed sealed record laws. From Oregon to Maine, thousands of adoptees have now received their records, and a number of states are considering similar legislation. Opponents have argued that birthmothers were promised confidentiality, but there is no statutory guarantee of privacy—and upwards of 98% of birthmothers indicate that they would welcome contact and/or the sharing of information.

In 2011 Illinois passed State House Bill 5428. It allowed Adult Adopted Persons to finally have a copy of their original birth certificates, making Illinois the largest state to reverse sealed record laws. While opponents of the Bill managed to include a “firewall,” letting birth parents opt out of revealing their names, the law opened the door for 350,000 adoptees to access much desired and sometimes very important personal details.

A Simple Piece of Paper follows over a dozen individuals as they apply to the State of Illinois to discover the truth about their origins. Whether from a desire to know their biological family or the need to know genetic medical history, the film charts this pivotal moment in their lives. Thought-provoking and ultimately joyful, this film demonstrates how **A Simple Piece of Paper** can forever alter the course of a life.

A Fragile Trust: Plagiarism, Power, and Jayson Blair

“A Fragile Trust: Plagiarism, Power, and Jayson Blair” on **Independent Lens** tells the shocking story of the most infamous serial plagiarist of our time, and how he unleashed the massive scandal that rocked *The New York Times* and the entire world of journalism.

In 2003, Jayson Blair was caught plagiarizing the work of other reporters and supplementing his own reporting with fabricated details in dozens of stories published in the *Times*. The ensuing media frenzy left a major blemish on the history of the “Old Grey Lady,” which just a year earlier won a record seven Pulitzer Prizes for its coverage of 9/11. It was a spectacular fall for both Blair and the paper.



The Jayson Blair scandal brought the *NY Times* to a low-point in the 152-year history of the paper.

The fact that Blair is African American was emphasized again and again as accounts of the “Blair Affair” served up sordid details in a soap-opera style tale of deception, drug abuse, racism, mental illness, hierarchy, white guilt, and power struggles inside the hallowed halls of the *Times*.

“A Fragile Trust” follows Blair as he slowly unravels in the face of mounting

pressures and distractions after his plagiarized article ultimately leads to his undoing. The Jayson Blair scandal is an important chapter in the history of journalism, but also a complex story about power, ethics, representation, race, and accountability in the mainstream media.

Featuring exclusive interviews with everyone involved, including former Executive Editor Howell Raines and Blair himself, “A Fragile Trust” tells the whole sordid story of the scandal while exploring these deeper themes. With more and more publications moving to online-only formats and with plagiarism on the rise, this cautionary tale about the slippery slope of ethical transgressions is more relevant than ever.


