## NATIONAL MEMORIAL DAY CONCERT

**The National Memorial Day Concert** returns live from the West Lawn of the U.S. Capitol, co-hosted by Joe Mantegna and Gary Sinise. The broadcast marks the tenth anniversary that the acclaimed actors, who have dedicated themselves to veterans' causes, co-host the event.

The all-star line-up includes: distinguished American leader Colin L. Powell USA (Ret.); multi Grammy Award-winning music legend Gloria Estefan; "The Voice" 2014 winner Tessanne Chin; classical crossover artist Katherine Jenkins; and world renowned tenor Russell Watson.

The concert showcases courageous American heroes disabled for life. There are over 4 million living disabled American veterans, a visible reminder of the toll of America's wars through the decades. A new national memorial in Washington, DC to pay tribute to these courageous American heroes disabled for life was dedicated in October 2014. The program features the poignant stories of two veterans from different eras severely injured in war and living with life-altering disabilities.

The concert also shines a spotlight on Gold Star children, those who have lost a parent to war. We learn how their lives are changed forever.

This summer marks 70 years since the end of hostilities in both Europe and Asia. As the world commemorates the 70th anniversary of the end of World War II, the deadliest war in human history, the concert honors the sacrifices of America's Greatest Generation, and remembers the estimated 60 million men, women, and children worldwide whose lives were brutally ended in the war.

**The National Memorial Day Concert** will be broadcast Sunday, the 24th at 7:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. On HD3-1, it can be seen Sunday, the 24th at 11:00 p.m.

## The Homefront

More than two million men and women serve in America's all-volunteer military force, and another three million are their husbands, wives, sons, and daughters. Yet over the course of two long wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, the stories—and the service—of these military families have often been overlooked. **The Homefront** brings the true stories of these military families to a PBS audience. The two-hour film creates a series of intimate portraits—following families through the difficulties of deployment, the joys of homecoming, and the challenges of reintegrating as a family.

General Martin Dempsey, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, recalls a time when the military's view on families was summed up by the phrase, "if the Army wanted you to have a family, they would have issued you one." Now, he says, "the strength of the armed forces of the United States is as much about its families as it is about its combat capability."

Viewers meet a cross-section of America's military community: Soldiers,



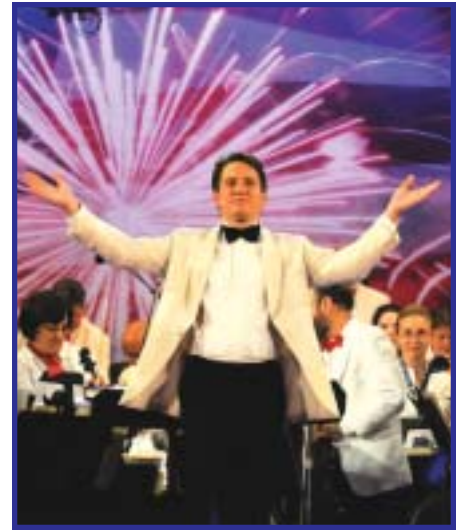

Sailors, Marines, and Airmen, some in the active duty force, and some in the National Guard and Reserve. Representing many ranks, and drawn from across the country, these families illustrate what it means to serve.

From an Army Staff Sergeant torn between family and military duty, to a Marine Gunnery Sergeant struggling to reconnect with his wife and children after a long deployment, to a Navy Command Master Chief whose husband has given up his own career to raise their children,

## Nazi Attack on America

Everyone has heard of Pearl Harbor and 9/11, infamous attacks that are seared deeply into our nation's collective memory. But how many Americans are aware of the far deadlier underwater attacks that once raged on our shores?

Launched by German U-boats barely a few miles off our coastline, Operation Drumbeat began in the early days of 1942, inflicted devastating blows to the U.S., and operating so close to U.S. shores that crew members could see the cars driving on American roadways. **Nova** investigates this forgotten battlefield on our doorstep in "Nazi Attack on America."

In the program, renowned explorer and Titanic discoverer Robert Ballard and his team make a remarkable find on the wreck of U-166, which unravels a 72-year-old mystery about how the sub was destroyed, restores honor to a discredited U.S. naval officer, and re-writes this chapter of WWII history.

The investigation centers on a nearly forgotten Nazi battlefield, over 4500 miles from Europe, on the doorstep of New Orleans. Ballard and his team set out aboard his Exploration Vessel Nautilus, surveying

the sunken relics using remotely operated vehicles. More than 50 wrecks litter the floor of the Gulf of Mexico, sunk by Nazi U-boats. Over three and a half years, German U-boats sank 609 ships in American waters and claimed over 5,000 American lives. More than three million tons of cargo was lost. In return, only a handful of U-boats would ever be sunk in American waters.

At the heart of the documentary is a fascinating science detective story surrounding the wreck of U-166, sunk in the summer of 1942 just 35 miles off the coast of Louisiana. Controversy surrounds the sinking of the sub shortly after the U-boat attacked a passenger ship, the S.S. Robert E. Lee. Twenty-five passengers were lost, but 404 survived, rescued by Captain Herbert G. Claudius, U.S. Navy commander of escort vessel PC 566. In addition to rescuing survivors, Claudius attacked the U-boat with depth charges and concluded that he had sunk or mortally wounded the sub. The Navy, however, ruled that he had missed U-166; his attack was graded "F," and he was relieved of command and sent back to school.

What Ballard and his team find during the expedition will throw the official history

off the rails, prove that Claudius did in fact sink U-166—and cause the U.S. Navy to reopen the case.

The film also touches on the innovations of Allied scientists and engineers, such as cracking the German Enigma code and developing the B-24 Liberator bomber, which ultimately turned the tide against the U-boats.

The FBI was unaccountable and untouchable until 1971, when a group of citizens uncovered its illegal domestic spying programs. On March 8th, 1971, a band of suburban parents, university professors, and community leaders broke into a small FBI field office in Media, Pennsylvania, just outside Philadelphia. Calling themselves the Citizens’ Commission to Investigate the FBI, the eight activists took hundreds of secret files and shared them anonymously with select members of Congress and the public. The heist yielded a trove of evidence proving that the FBI was deliberately working to intimidate civil rights activists and nonviolent Vietnam War protesters, among others. The most significant revelation was of a massive illegal domestic surveillance program overseen by FBI director J. Edgar Hoover.

Despite one of the largest investigations ever conducted, the FBI never solved the mystery of the break-in, and the identities of those responsible remained a secret—until now. For the first time, the members of the Citizens’ Commission have spoken out. “1971” on **Independent Lens** is their story.

Weaving together exclusive interviews with national news coverage of the burglary and dramatized scenes of the events, “1971” unfolds with the tension of a suspense thriller, with haunting echoes of today’s questions of privacy in a new era of government surveillance.

**Everyday Miracles:  
The Genius of Sofas,  
Stockings and Scanners**

In **Everyday Miracles: The Genius of Sofas, Stockings and Scanners**, a two-part series, Dr. Mark Miodownik reveals how the modern world has amassed a dazzling array of stuff—a collection of metals, plastics, liquid crystals, and ceramics—all assembled in very precise ways. Miodownik is a materials scientist with a Ph.D. in turbine jet engine alloys from Oxford, whose research areas include self-assembling materials, self-healing materials, and the psychophysical properties of materials.

Miodownik begins by focusing on items found in the “Home,” including razor blades, tights, plywood, and foam rubber, the last of which was discovered by mistake in the 1930s. When razor blades were invented by King Camp Gillette in 1901, Gillette claimed that he had saved the US economy \$4.5 million in time saved by not having to visit the barber’s shop. But he couldn’t have done it without a new mass production technique and an insight into how to harden steel.

“Away,” explores materials that have had a huge impact on our ability to get around. The program reveals the impact the advent of the bicycle had on the national gene pool, and how the concept of levitation provided the spiritually inclined to set out in search of their inner self. The bicycle was a dead loss until 1888 when the right materials arrived; namely, reliable steel production and the ability to make seamless steel tubing collided with pneumatic tires. For the first time, bicycles were light and comfortable and easy to use. In the lab, Miodownik demonstrates “Prince Rupert’s Drops,” and explains why we should be grateful for these droplets of exploding glass.

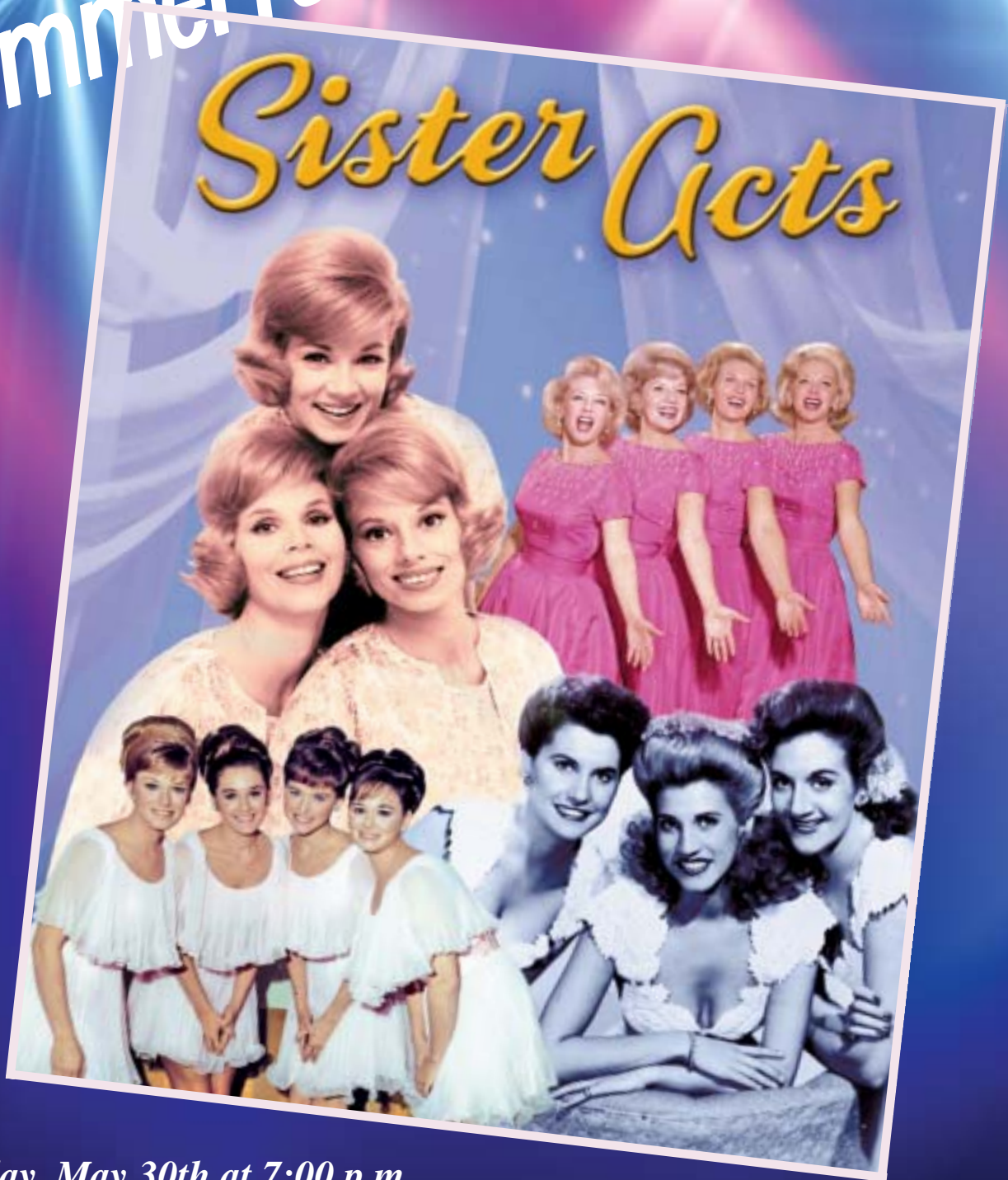

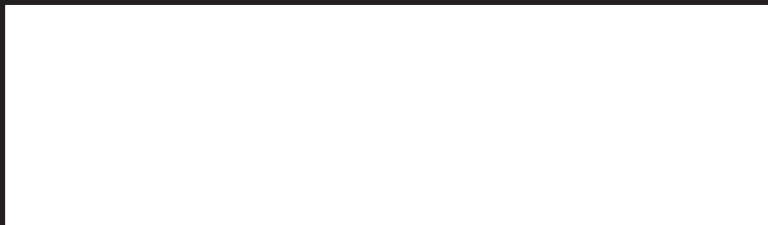
