The Battle of Chosin

On Thanksgiving Day 1950, American-led United Nations troops were on the march in North Korea. U.S. Marine and Air Force pilots distributed holiday meals, even to those on the front lines. Hopes were high that everyone would be home by Christmas.

Under the command of General Douglas MacArthur, American-led forces had turned back North Korea's aggression. MacArthur then set his sights on quickly pushing north to the Chinese border and reuniting the country under democratic rule. On the eve of MacArthur's final offensive, the First Marine Division was strung out on a single 78-mile-long supply route leading to the Chosin Reservoir.

With MacArthur's UN forces threatening his border, China's Mao ZeDong decided to act. By late November 1950, tens of thousands of Chinese soldiers had quietly infiltrated North Korea and surrounded MacArthur's forces. On the night of November 27th, Mao sprung his trap at the Chosin Reservoir.

Night after night, Mao's army swept down from the hills and attacked the vastly outnumbered American troops. Twelve thousand men of the First Marine Division, along with a few thousand Army soldiers, suddenly found themselves surrounded, outnumbered, and at risk of annihilation at the Chosin Reservoir, high in the mountains of North Korea. The only hope for the surrounded men was

to fight their way back to the coast, a perilous journey into the teeth of a subarctic winter, through tens of thousands of Chinese soldiers waiting in the high ground above the single road out.

The two-week battle that followed, fought in brutally cold temperatures, is one of the most celebrated in Marine Corps annals.

"The Battle of Chosin" on **American Experience** recounts this epic conflict through the heroic stories of the men who fought it.

The Chosin crisis brought about fundamental changes in American history— including the building of military bases abroad and the creation of a standing army for the first time in U.S. history— and helped set the course of American foreign policy in the Cold War and beyond.

A new 90-minute adaptation of **Anne of Green Gables**, Lucy Maud Montgomery's classic novel, tells the story of a young girl's life on Prince Edward Island.

Anne Shirley (Ella Ballentine) is a precocious young girl taken from an orphanage and placed in the care of the Marilla Cuthbert (Sara Botsford) and Matthew (Martin Sheen), her brother. The conservative Marilla has a profound effect on the adventurous Anne and creates a journey of learning and personal engagement that has resonated with generations since *Anne of Green Gables* was first published in 1908. Neither the adventurous Anne nor the conservative Marilla could anticipate the profound effect they'd have on each other's lives.

While the books' location was originally Vermont, the film's setting is the English countryside.

The First Official Thanksgiving

The First Official Thanksgiving tells the story of what some historians might call the first "official, English-speaking" Thanksgiving held in the Americas.

At a meeting in London in 1618, Sir William Throckmorton, George Thorpe, John Smyth, and Richard Berkeley gathered to form the Berkeley Company and discuss a land grant in the new world, given to them by King James I. The four Englishmen were to create a settlement in Virginia to be known as Berkeley Hundred. They chose Captain John Woodlief of Buckinghamshire, a ship's captain and a merchant trader who had been to the New World several times, to lead the expedition.



Under Woodlief's command, the good ship Margaret left England on September 16th, 1619 and reached the New World in two and a half months. On December 4th, 1619, after an arduous voyage, a group of 36 men came ashore on the banks of the James River in Virginia. The group's charter required that the day of arrival be observed yearly as a "day of thanksgiving" to Almighty God for their safe passage to the New World. On that first day—a year before the Pilgrims landed on Plymouth Rock—Captain John Woodlief held the religious service of Thanksgiving.

In 1931, Virginia history enthusiast Lyon Tyler (the fourth son of President John Tyler), accidentally discovered the Nibley Papers in the New York Public Library, which recorded the historic 1619 voyage to the New World and the settlers' first Thanksgiving prayer. Through dramatic re-enactment, **The First Official Thanksgiving** challenges the long-held belief that America's first Thanksgiving was held in Plymouth, Mass., and chronicles how the discovery of the Nibley Papers led to a friendly rivalry between Virginia and Massachusetts about who can rightfully lay claim to the birth of America's Thanksgiving holiday.

Storm of the Century: The Blizzard of '49

Storm of the Century: The Blizzard of '49 tells the story of a devastating series of storms in the Great Plains. Nebraska, Colorado, South Dakota, and Wyoming were hammered by blizzards lasting from January to April. Wyoming was one of the hardest hit states. But for all the tragedy and loss, suffering and death, there was also hope and heroism, unselfish sacrifice, and generosity.

It began quietly enough as Sunday, January 2nd, 1949 dawned under partly cloudy skies and a forecast for temperatures in the 20s and 30s with scattered snow showers. Later that day, it began to snow. By that evening a full raging blizzard was upon the eastern portion of the state. It didn't let up for three days.

Additional violent snow storms continued to sweep through the state for the next 45 days. The snow drifted 20 to 30 feet high in places. Within 24 hours of the beginning of the first storm, all bus, rail, and air traffic was effectively shut down. Entire communities were snowed in and immobilized. Ranches were cut off and isolated. Thirty-three hundred miles of state highways were



inundated. Thousands of motorists and rail passengers were stranded and Wyoming towns began to run out of food. People, livestock, and wildlife began to die.

The Air Force and Army were mobilized. Air Force Cargo planes dropped hay bales to starving livestock and food and medicine to isolated families. The U.S. Army mounted the largest bulldozer operation in history in an effort to clear roads and reach stranded cars. When it was over, the last of the monumental drifts left in its wake eventually melted in July.

The Voice of the Casals Cello

Long before Pete Seeger or Bono, Pablo Casals used the power of music and celebrity to advocate for freedom and peace. But in 1961, John F. Kennedy issued a request that made the 84-year-old Casals reconsider his decades-long vow never to perform in any country that recognized the dictatorship of Generalissimo Francisco Franco. November 13th, 2016, marks the 55th anniversary of Casals's White House concert. At age eighty-six, Casals played remarkably that

evening. Yet his most compelling recordings came decades earlier, as he re-introduced the Bach Cello Suites to the world, and made a legendary early recording of the signature Dvorak Cello Concerto.


The Voice of the Casals Cello is a music-rich special, with musical selections woven around personal storytelling. Casals' widow, 60 years younger than he, recounts tales of that historic White House concert as if it had happened yesterday. We hear vivid memories from Marta Casals Istomin (named a "living legend" by the Library of Congress for her work at The Kennedy Center and at the Manhattan School of Music) and from Amit Peled, a cellist born 100 years after Casals and in whose hands the instrument is having a revival. Peled punctuates his storytelling with demonstrations played on the Casals Cello. And we hear selections from a special concert Peled gave at Peabody, which replicated a program Casals had given there exactly a century earlier.

The Voice of the Casals Cello will be broadcast on the KENW Public Radio Network Saturday, the 12th at 2:00 p.m.


