On the 50th anniversary of the president's death—

American Experience presents “JFK,” a new four-hour, two-part special premiering in conjunction with the 50th anniversary of the president’s death.

JFK

Forever enshrined in myth by an assassin’s bullet, John F. Kennedy’s presidency has often defied objective appraisal. This new portrait offers a fresh assessment of the man, his accomplishments, and his unfulfilled promise.

“JFK” provides a fresh look at an enigmatic man who remains one of the nation’s most beloved and mourned leaders. Beginning with Kennedy’s childhood years as the privileged but sickly second son of one of the wealthiest men in America, the film explores his early political career as a lackluster congressman, his successful run for the U.S. Senate, and the game-changing presidential campaign that made him the youngest elected president in U.S. history. With the benefit of recently opened archives, the film recounts his struggles with life-threatening illnesses and his efforts to keep them hidden from the public.

“JFK” offers new perspectives on his complicated private life, including his relationship with his wife, his

close connection to his younger brother, Robert, and his complex bond with his powerful father. It also reevaluates Kennedy’s strengths and weaknesses in the Oval Office as he navigated some of the most explosive events of the 20th century: the disastrous failure at the Bay of Pigs, the urgent demands of an increasingly impatient civil rights movement, the Cuban Missile Crisis, and the escalating conflict in Southeast Asia.

“JFK” on **American Experience** (Pts. 1 & 2) will be broadcast Monday and Tuesday, November 11th and 12th at 8:00 p.m. They repeat two consecutive Sundays at 10:00 p.m., beginning November 17th. On HD3-1, the programs also air Monday and Tuesday, November 11th and 12th at 8:00 p.m. They repeat (Pt. 1) Tuesday, November 12th at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. and (Pt. 2) Wednesday, November 13th at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.



Secrets
of the Dead

JFK: One PM

Central Standard Time

“JFK: One PM Central Standard Time” on **Secrets of the Dead** tells the story of two men: one the President of the United States—shot in Dallas and rushed to Parkland hospital, his fate unknown—and the other respected CBS anchor Walter Cronkite, knowing he had to get the story right amid the uncertainties of that tragic day.

Narrated by George Clooney, **Secrets of the Dead** recounts the riveting story of the reporting from Dallas and the CBS Newsroom in New York from the moment President Kennedy was shot until Cronkite’s emotional pronouncement of his death at One PM Central Standard Time.

The program features rarely seen archives of President John F. Kennedy, Walter Cronkite, and moving memories from the producers, writers, and reporters who were there on the day.

NOVA Cold Case JFK

The 1963 assassination of President John F. Kennedy has fueled dark rumors of conspiracies for decades. Now, 50 years later, what can modern science tell us about the shooting in Dallas—and the investigations that followed? **Nova** and a team of foremost experts employ exclusive tests and sophisticated new technology to reconstruct and review the evidence in “Cold Case JFK.”

What should have been a homicide investigator’s best-case scenario—a crime that occurred in broad daylight in front of hundreds of witnesses—instead became a forensics nightmare in a case plagued by a mishandled crime scene, a controversial autopsy, and a prime suspect gunned down while in police custody.

Nova recreates the crime and the Warren Commission’s investigation—examining the shooting, the assassination scene, the medical information and wounds, and the evidence found on the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository.

For the first time since the original investigation by the FBI laboratory, forensic scientists trained and experienced in both firearms identification and shooting scene reconstruction review and evaluate the ballis-

tics evidence in the JFK assassination.

The most controversial aspect of the Warren Report is the “single bullet theory,” which says that one shot wounded both President John Kennedy and Governor John Connally, causing seven separate wounds in the two men. The bullet which the Warren Commission claimed did all this damage was discovered on a gurney at Parkland Hospital, looking virtually pristine, leading critics to deride it as “the magic bullet.” Yet the single bullet theory is essential to the Warren conclusion that Oswald acted alone.

To test the single bullet theory, **Nova** travels to a shooting range in New Mexico where experts in firearms and ballistics reconstruct the shooting. The Doppler radar used in this reconstruction is a technology so new and unique that even the FBI does not yet possess it.

“Cold Case JFK” on **Nova** airs Wednesday, November 13th at 8:00 p.m. It repeats Saturday, November 16th at 10:00 p.m. and Sunday, November 17th at 12:00 midnight. On HD3-1, it airs Wednesday, November 13th at 8:00 p.m., Thursday, November 14th at 8:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m., and Sunday, November 17th at 4:00 p.m.

Lincoln@Gettysburg

Lincoln@Gettysburg, to air on the 150th anniversary of the Gettysburg Address, describes a major turning point in American history: the rebirth of a nation and the dawn of the information age.

In 1863, Abraham Lincoln proved himself a master of a new frontier with his “high-tech” command center—the War Department Telegraph Office. The telegraph, the internet of the 19th century, gave Lincoln the power to re-invent leadership, wield control across distant battlefields, and have his finger on the pulse of the nation. This flow of communication led to some of the most dramatic moments of the Civil War, and shaped the words that Lincoln would use to reunite a shattered country at Gettysburg.

Lincoln@Gettysburg highlights the significance of several elements: the battle and

its aftermath; the last-minute invitation for Lincoln to speak; the president’s daylong “special” train from Washington; the assembly of thousands of spectators in the little town in the hills of southern Pennsylvania; and the ceremony itself—crowned by the 272 words with which our 16th president reaffirmed the meaning and purpose of American democracy, and made his case that preserving the union was the only end that could justify the horrors of the war and the slaughter of 10,000 men in the fields and forests surrounding Gettysburg.

The Gettysburg Story

Over three days in 1863, war-weary Union and Confederate soldiers met at a backwater Pennsylvania crossroads to decide the fate of the nation.

The Gettysburg Story tells the epic tale of the bloodiest battle ever fought on American soil and the greatest man-made disaster in American history. The film recounts the pivotal events from the iconic Civil War battle immortalized in Lincoln’s “Gettysburg Address” and reveals the grand scale of the 6,000-acre battlefield, including the legendary sites of Little Round Top, The Railroad Cut, and Cemetery Ridge.

The Gettysburg Story can be seen Tuesday, November 12th at 10:00 p.m. and Sunday, November 24th at 7:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Wednesday, November 20th at 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.



Secrets of Scotland Yard

From Dickens to Sherlock Holmes, Agatha Christie to James Bond—no police institution in the world has caught the public imagination in the same way as Scotland Yard. The name has become synonymous with London’s police force, but actually comes from the location of the original police headquarters building. Comet Encounter

Traditionally seen as harbingers of doom, comets have fascinated, even terrified us for thousands of years. Right now Comet ISON, somewhere between one and 10 kilometers in diameter, is just beyond the orbit of Jupiter. As it races past us toward the sun, it should develop a tail that will light up the skies brighter than a full moon. Then the comet will slingshot around the back of the sun and could emerge brighter than ever, treating the entire northern hemisphere to an unforgettable sight. It could even be visible in daylight. Simultaneously, astronomers will be able to glean vital clues on the origins of our solar system.

But there is jeopardy too. The comet could evaporate completely or the sun's massive gravity could tear it apart. If the latter happens, it will produce a so-called "string of pearls," several much smaller comets arching right across the night sky.

Einstein's prediction that humanity would perish four years after the last honey bee dies could be put to the test... unless things change soon for our threatened little apiarian friends. Longtime beekeeper Jerry Dunbar believes the answer lies in an organic, natural approach and he introduces his methods in **Natural Beekeeping**.

Bees, responsible for pollinating one third of our crops (and bringing us that healthy, tasty, antibacterial substance we call honey), are disappearing in mass waves, dying and losing the way back to their hives. Current theories assign blame to a combination of chemicals, genetically modified crops, antibiotics, pests, pesticides, and other factors.

After 40 years of watching this problem develop, Dunbar sees part of the solution in



an elimination of all artificial intrusion into the bee's life; in letting its natural biology and immune system build up strength, restoring balance.

He envisions a future in which people around the world discover and take up apiculture, building a network of healthy small-scale beekeeping operations, creating a buffer against Colony Collapse Disorder. Dunbar shows the life cycle of a healthy colony of bees and encourages urban and suburban beekeeping: "The pesticides and monoculture in farmlands are not good for the bees and their honey," he notes. "In cities, they at least have a choice of blossoms and can skip the ones with chemicals."



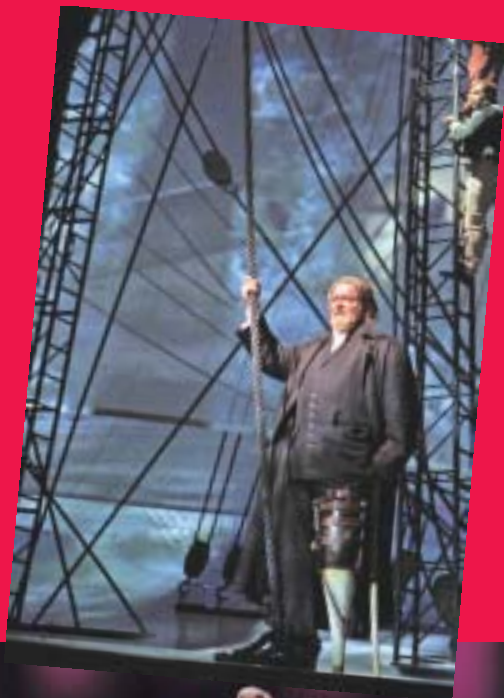
