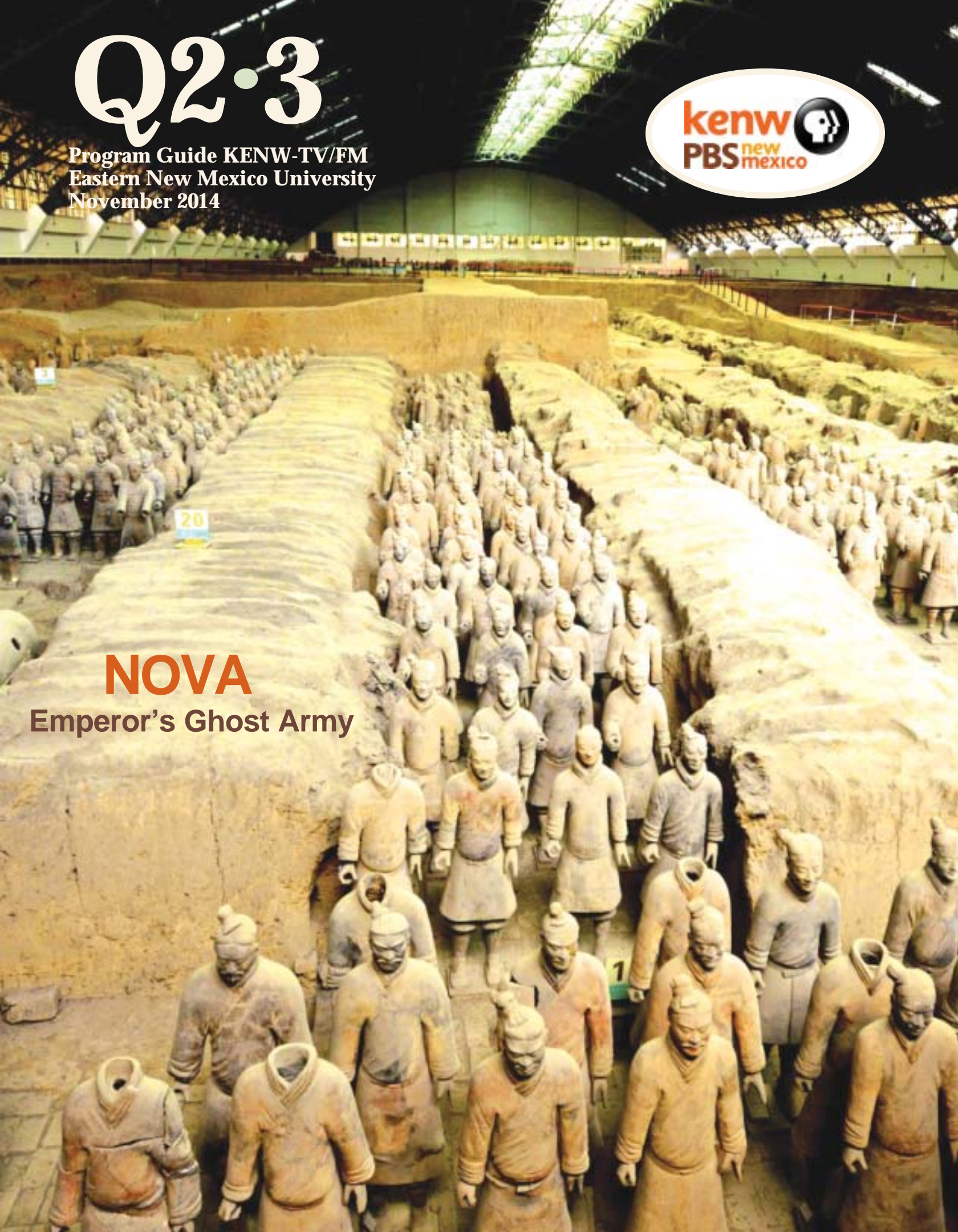

## Bigger Than T.rex

Almost a century ago, paleontologists found the first tantalizing hints of a monster even bigger than Tyrannosaurus Rex, perhaps the largest predator

ever to walk the Earth. But these spectacular fossil bones, from a dinosaur dubbed Spinosaurus, were completely destroyed during a World War II Allied bombing raid, leaving only drawings.

Now, the discovery of new bones in a Moroccan cliff face is reopening the investigation into this epic beast and bringing to life the lost world over which Spinosaurus reigned more than 65 million years ago.

“Bigger Than T.rex” on **Nova** follows paleontologists who are reconstructing this carnivore, revealing a 53-foot-long behemoth with a huge dorsal sail, scimitar-like claws, and superjaws, tapered toward the front like a crocodile, with an army of teeth.

Lost and forgotten for over 2,200 years, a new archaeo-

logical campaign is now probing the thousands of figures entombed in the mausoleum.

## Killer Landslides

At 10:37 a.m. on a sunny Saturday morning in March, residents in 30 homes along a bend in a beautiful river in the mountains of Washington state were enjoying their morning coffee, when a distant roar interrupted the routine—the terrifying sound of what would become the United States’ deadliest landslide in decades. The equivalent of three million dump truck loads of earth came plummeting down the valley, snapping trees and shattering houses along with everything inside. In less than two minutes, a one-square-mile field of debris, 20 feet deep, slammed into the neighborhood.

As **Nova** reports in “Killer Landslides,” landslides and other ground failures around the globe cost more lives and money each year than all other natural disasters combined, and the number worldwide is expected to increase.

## Navy SEALs – Their Untold Story

Despite the widespread attention paid to the SEALs (Sea, Air and Land) since they eliminated Osama bin Laden, the story of how these clandestine commandoes evolved in response to changing threats—from WWII to the War on Terror—and how their extraordinary abilities shaped U.S. and world history, has remained untold. ## To Catch a Comet

After a 10-year, 4-billion-mile-journey, the Rosetta spacecraft entered orbit around the rubber-duck-shaped Comet 67P/Churyumov-Gerasimenko in August. Rosetta will spend about two years traveling alongside 67P and closely observing the comet. If all goes according to plan, the probe will also drop a small landing craft onto the comet’s icy surface in mid-November.

In **To Catch a Comet**, we learn that putting the lander down onto the comet’s surface will require precise calculations because the comet is soaring through space at 36,000 mph. Rosetta first has to catch up with the comet, fly at exactly the same speed, and then drop a lander (Philae) the size of a washing machine onto an area just over half a square mile. While the Mars Curiosity lander plummeted at about 13,000 mph, Philae will float down at a speed closer to 20 centimeters (7.8 inches) per second, like a piece of paper floating to the ground.

**To Catch a Comet** airs Wednesday, the 19th at 9:00 p.m. on both 3-2 and HD3-1. It repeats Sunday, the 23rd at 11:00 p.m. on 3-2.

## Bombs Away: LBJ, Goldwater and the 1964 Campaign

In **Bombs Away: LBJ, Goldwater and the 1964 Campaign that Changed It All**, a little girl is shown counting to 10, pulling petals from a daisy. A voice from mission control then counts down as the camera zooms into her dark pupil. An atomic blast and ensuing mushroom cloud consumes the TV screen as President Lyndon Johnson's voice proclaims "We must either love each other, or we must die." This political ad, "Peace Little Girl," aired only once or twice during the 1964 presidential campaign between Lyndon Johnson and Barry Goldwater, but it ushered in a new era of the television attack ad.

**Bombs Away** revisits the 1964 campaign that also reshaped the American political landscape. Johnson's "Great Society" and civil rights agendas pushed southern states toward the Republican Party and brought the northeast in line with the Democrats. Goldwater's rift with "the liberal Republican establishment" served as the basis for his landslide defeat, but also inspired future conservative offshoots, including the Tea Party.

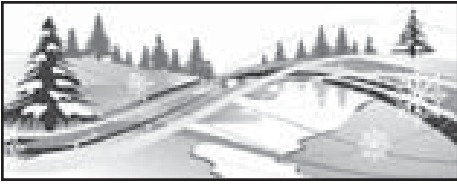

Narrated by actor Morgan Freeman, **The Editor and the Dragon: Horace Carter Fights the Klan** tells the story of Pulitzer Prize-winning publisher Horace Carter (1921-2009) and his bold reporting on the Ku Klux Klan in the pre-Civil Rights era, a dark chapter in American history.

Carter, the 29-year-old editor of the weekly *Tabor City Tribune*, stood against the Klan, risking life, livelihood, friendships, and his family's safety to protest the Klan's racist rhetoric and vigilantism. His courageous reports and the unwavering integrity of his weekly editorials helped lead to the first FBI investigation of the Klan during that era, and to the arrest and conviction of nearly 100 Klansmen.

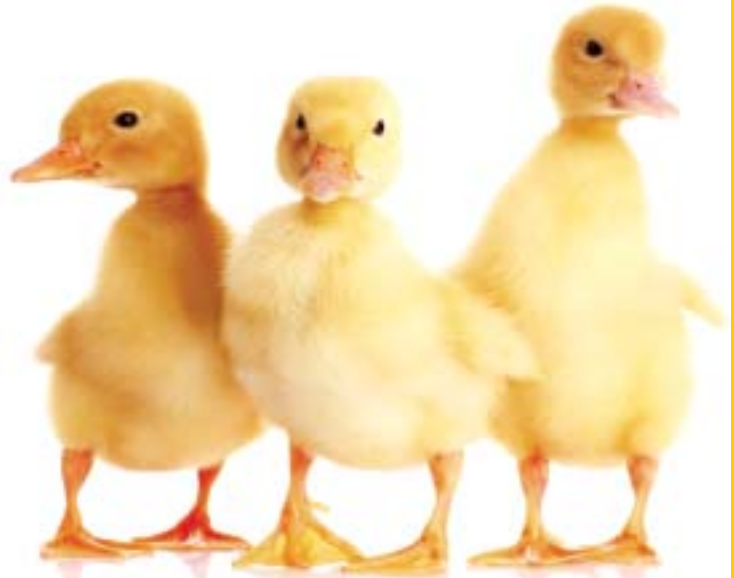
