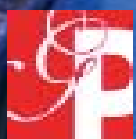

HAMILTON'S AMERICA

“Hamilton’s America” explodes on **Great Performances**. The documentary film brings history to vivid life through the lens of Lin-Manuel Miranda’s pop culture Broadway phenomenon *Hamilton*—winner of 11 Tony Awards® and the Pulitzer Prize. The story of Alexander Hamilton is most remembered for its dramatic conclusion, which saw Hamilton killed in a duel by Vice President Aaron Burr. But the full story of this political genius—a poor immigrant who built himself up from nothing to become one of the nation’s most vital architects—has largely been forgotten by history until now.

“Hamilton’s America” shows just how timeless the hot-button issues of today’s America are: immigration, States’ rights, debt, income inequality, and race relations. These were the same fights that defined Hamilton’s time, and they are the driving force of Miranda’s historic work. The film endeavors to brush the dust off American history (much as the musical does) and to provide a unique new way for us to view our national heritage and current political landscape.

For a unique window into the artistry and research involved in making the show, viewers witness Miranda at the White House in 2009, performing an early version of what would become “Alexander Hamilton,” the first number in the musical. They are also given an inside view of Miranda as he composes songs in Aaron Burr’s Manhattan bedroom.

“Hamilton’s America” delves deep into the creation of the show, revealing Miranda’s process of absorbing and then adapting Hamilton’s epic story into groundbreaking

musical theater. Included are trips to historic locations, such as Mt. Vernon and Valley Forge and a surprising range of interviews with prominent personalities, experts, politicians, and musicians, including President Barack Obama, President George W. Bush, Speaker of the House Paul Ryan, Senator Elizabeth Warren, Secretary Hank Paulson, Secretary Timothy Geithner, Jimmy Fallon, and Stephen Sondheim.

“Hamilton’s America” on **Great Performances** airs on 3-2 Friday, the 21st at 9:00 p.m. and Monday, the 24th at 8:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Saturday, the 22nd at 8:00 p.m./12:00 midnight.

MASTERPIECE

The Durrells in Corfu

Keeley Hawes stars as Louisa Durrell, an intrepid widow who decamps from dreary 1930s England to a sun-dappled Greek island with her four recalcitrant children, ages 11 to 21. A six-part adaptation on **Masterpiece**, “The Durrells in Corfu” is based on a true story as told by Gerald Durrell in *My Family and Other Animals* and its two sequels.

A tight budget and desperation—not holiday-making—originally drive the Durrells to sink their meager savings into boat fare to Corfu, where they hope to find a refuge more welcoming for their unconventional ways than the stuffy UK. They arrive on an island with no beach resorts, night clubs, tourist shops, or even electricity—for

this is 1935. What Corfu does have is endless opportunity for living, loving, shooting, and animal collecting—depending on one’s preferences.

Co-starring with Hawes are Josh O’Connor as her eldest son, Larry, the instigator of the family’s sudden move to Corfu and a budding writer on his way to becoming the famous novelist Lawrence Durrell; newcomer Callum Woodhouse as son number two, Leslie, an impulsive firearms enthusiast; Daisy Waterstone as daughter Margo, sixteen and man-crazy; and Milo Parker as eleven-year-old Gerry, who only has eyes for wildlife and grew up to be a world-renowned naturalist.

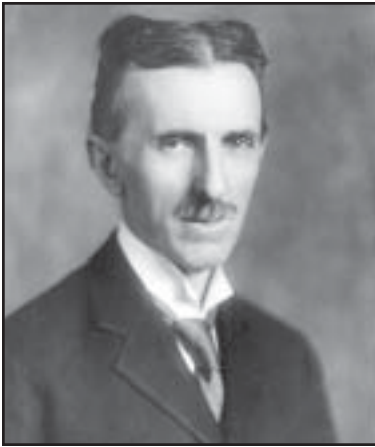

TESLA

The Visionary Genius Who Envisioned Our Wireless Age



Nikola Tesla has had electric cars, rock bands, a unit of measurement, a minor planet, and a lunar crater named after him. During his lifetime, he gained international fame for his invention of a system of alternating current that made possible the distribution of

electricity over vast distances and is the basis for the electrical grid that powers 21st century life. But the visionary Tesla imagined much more: robots, radio, radar, remote control, the wireless transmission of messages and pictures, and harnessing the wind and sun to provide free energy to all.

Tesla's fertile but undisciplined imagination was the source of his genius but also his downfall, as the image of Tesla as a "mad scientist" came to overshadow his reputation as a brilliant innovator. But it is his exhilarating sense of the future that has inspired renewed interest in the man, as his once scoffed-at vision of a world connected by wireless technology has become a reality. "Tesla" premieres on **American Experience** in October.

Born in 1856 to a Serbian family in Croatia, the tall, gangly, 28-year-old inventor arrived in New York in 1884, almost penniless but with a letter of introduction to his hero, Thomas Edison. Tesla was convinced that he had solved the problem that had plagued Edison's plans to electrify the world. Edison relied on direct current (DC) to transmit electricity, which was severely limiting. Tesla had found a way to do what had so far stumped everyone: invent a motor that could run on alternating current (AC), making the distribution of electricity across long distances possible.

Edison immediately hired Tesla, who abruptly quit just six months later, frustrated by Edison's refusal to adopt his idea. After a grim winter of digging ditches, his luck turned. The wealthy

entrepreneur George Westinghouse knew that the future—and immense profits—would be found in electricity and he quickly bought the young inventor's patents, making Tesla a rich man. But when Westinghouse became overextended, he revised Tesla's deal, stripping him of a royalty that would have made him one of the wealthiest men in the world. Nevertheless, Westinghouse's gamble on Tesla's ideas paid off; the company beat Edison for the contract to harness Niagara Falls to generate AC current, ending once and for all Edison's hopes for his now antiquated DC technology.

Tesla was now a celebrity, the *new* Edison. He moved into the luxurious Astor House and became a friend to the rich and famous. But he was plagued with a plethora of odd phobias that had followed him since childhood. Everything he did had to be divisible by three. He had a manic fear of germs and couldn't bear the sight of earrings or the touch of human hair.

Tesla managed to convince J. P. Morgan to invest in his next idea, the transmission of wireless messages. With Morgan's money, Tesla began building a transmission tower. But an Italian electrical engineer, Guglielmo Marconi, doomed his dream by sending the first wireless transmission across the Atlantic in 1901—based on Tesla's patents. The invention of wireless telegraphy—radio—would win Marconi a Nobel Prize and send Tesla into a downward spiral.

Tesla would spend the rest of his life imagining new inventions and searching for investors while his ideas became increasing bizarre and fantastical. His mind drifting, his money gone, he died alone in 1943 in the New Yorker Hotel.

Six months later, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that the patents to Marconi's wireless device belonged to Tesla, and that he, not Marconi, had launched the wireless world with the invention of radio.

In the summer of 1968, television news changed forever. Dead last in the ratings, ABC News hired two towering public intellectuals to debate each other during the Democratic and Republican national conventions. William F. Buckley Jr. was a leading light of the new conservative movement. Gore Vidal, a Democrat related to Jackie Onassis, was a leftist novelist and polemicist.

Armed with deep-seated distrust and enmity, Vidal and Buckley believed each other's political ideologies were dangerous for America. Like rounds in a heavyweight battle, they pummeled out policy and personal insult, their explosive exchanges devolving into vitriolic name-calling. Live and unscripted, they kept viewers riveted as Nixon became the Republican nominee in Mi-

ami and violence rocked the Democratic convention in Chicago. Ratings for ABC News skyrocketed and a new era in contentious public discourse was born.

"Best of Enemies" on **Independent Lens** spotlights the birth of the highbrow blood sport practiced by today's ever-present pundit television.

"In the focused light of the 1968 national television camera, the seeds were planted for our present media landscape, when the spectacle trumps the content of argument," says director Robert Gordon. "Each side today, like these two men, sees the other as malignant, promulgating views catastrophic for America; strident partisanship is understood as virile patriotism and compromise is castration. These Vidal-Buckley

Actor and comedian Bill Murray was born William J. Murray on September 21st, 1950, in Wilmette, Illinois. Murray eventually relocated to New York City, where he took his comedic talents to radio's *National Lampoon Hour* (1973-74) alongside Dan Aykroyd, Gilda Radner, and John Belushi. In 1977, producer Lorne Michaels tapped Murray to replace Chevy Chase on NBC's *Saturday Night Live* (SNL). Ironically insincere and yet somehow soft-hearted, Murray is the best-known star to emerge from the cast of *Saturday Night Live*.

Murray soon moved from the small screen to the big screen, and his first major film role was in the 1979 hit *Meatballs*. He then starred in two of the top-grossing comedies of the 1980s, *Caddyshack* (1980) and *Ghostbusters* (1984). Murray's comedy hits in the 1990s included *Groundhog Day*, *Kingpin*, *Mad Dog and Glory*, and *Rushmore*.

More recently, Murray earned rave reviews for his portrayal of Franklin D. Roosevelt in *Hyde Park on Hudson*, followed by *Moonrise Kingdom*, *The Great Budapest Hotel*, *St. Vincent*, and *The Jungle book*.


