THE EUGENICS CRUSADE

“The Eugenics Crusade” on **American Experience** tells the story of the unlikely—and largely unknown—project to breed a better American race, tracing the rise of a movement that turned a scientific theory of heredity into a powerful instrument of social control.

The word “eugenics” tends to conjure gruesome images of the millions of casualties from Hitler’s ruthless campaign for racial purity. Surprisingly, a similar effort to breed a “better” human race flourished in the United States in the decades prior to World War II—and that the manifestos written by the American movement’s proponents were a direct inspiration to the Führer.

American eugenics, however, was neither the work of fanatics nor the product of fringe science. The goal of the movement was simply to eradicate social ills by limiting the number of those considered to be genetically “unfit”—a group that included many immigrant groups, the poor, Jews, the mentally and physically disabled, and the “morally delinquent.” Its doctrines were not only popular and practiced, but codified by laws that severely restricted immigration and ultimately led to the institutionalization and sterilization of tens of thousands of American citizens.

Derived from the Greek words meaning “well” and “born,” the term *eugenics* was coined in 1883 by Sir Francis Galton—a British statistician and cousin of Charles Darwin’s—to name a new “science” through which human beings might take charge of their own evolution. Theorizing that all traits—everything from height and hair color to intelligence—were passed down from parents to their

offspring. Galton proposed that matings be regulated so as to enhance the breeding stock of the human race.

By the turn of the century, eugenics had found an advocate in the United States: a Harvard-educated biologist named Charles Davenport, who put forth the notion that a wide range of other conditions were also hereditary—not only physical traits, but also criminality, pauperism, and sexual deviance. His beliefs were fueled by the fear that the “right” sort of American was not having enough children, enabling the race as it existed to be diluted and polluted by the incoming waves of immigrants.

The eugenics doctrine was promulgated from pulpits and university lecture halls, and etched in legal codes that effectively barred entry to immigrants from most of the world and marked those at the margins of American society for planned extinction.

But as the 1920s came to a close, many scientists came to realize that some of their original suppositions about genetics and heredity were faulty. As the Great Depression proved that poverty and other social ills could befall even those from the best of families, the dogma of the eugenics movement rang ever more hollow. Although the craze was fleeting, the laws passed in the name of eugenics and the impulse that inspired them lingered on in American life even after the Nazis would link eugenics inextricably to genocide.

“The Eugenics Crusade,” a two-hour **American Experience**, can be seen on 3-2 Tuesday, the 16th at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, the 21st at 10:00 p.m. On 3-1, it will be broadcast Monday, the 22nd at 7:00 p.m.



“The Circus,” a two-part, four-hour documentary on **American Experience**, explores the colorful history of this popular and distinctly American form of entertainment, from the first one-ring show at the end of the 18th century to 1956, when the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey big top was pulled down for the last time.

For more than a century, the circus had brought daily life to a standstill. Parades clogged Main Street. Acres of billowing canvas appeared mirage-like on the outskirts of town. And then, when day broke, the miracle had vanished. Equestrians, sideshow performers, clowns, roustabouts, an enormous collection of curious beasts—all became just figments of a glorious dream.

Through the intertwined stories of several of the most innovative and influential impresarios of the late 19th century, including P.T. Barnum, James Bailey, and the five Ringling Brothers, the series explores how its “dangerous” and “exotic” attractions revealed the country’s notions about race and Western dominance, and shows how the circus subverted prevailing standards of “respectability” with its unconventional, titillating, and “freakish” entertainments.

Almost everywhere, the circus met the disapproval of the religious and puritanical. In a society that valued sobriety and hard work, a wide-eyed day peering at half-naked aerialists amid shifty circus workers was frowned upon. Soon, circuses began to add elaborate menageries of exotic animals, rebranding themselves as “educational” experiences to concerned communities.

In 1876, Bailey would take his circus—animal menagerie, per-

formers, tents and all—on a 76,000-mile tour around the world. Barnum soon realized he would do better with Bailey as a partner than as a nemesis, and in a wild publicity stunt involving a baby elephant, the two men made much of their merger.

Bailey returned to the U. S. in 1903 and died three years later. Soon after, the Ringling Brothers bought Barnum & Bailey. For a while, they ran the two shows separately, but, in 1918, after several tough seasons during World War I, the Brothers combined their circuses into one mammoth outfit: the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus, a moving town of more than 1100 people, 735 horses, nearly 1000 other animals and 28 tents.

The circus limped through the Great Depression, facing new competition from radio, sporting events, and the movies. A modernized circus that borrowed from the aesthetic of Broadway and Hollywood was revived for a while, but a catastrophic fire in 1944 made a massive traveling tented show unviable. In 1956, the circus folded before the end of the season, never again to perform under a big top.

DARK MONEY

Pinpoints How Smear Campaigns Function in an Election



P.O.V.'s "Dark Money," a political thriller, examines one of the greatest present threats to American democracy: the influence of untraceable corporate money on our elections and elected officials. The film takes viewers to Montana, a frontline in the fight to preserve fair elections nationwide. It draws parallels between the local influence of dark money in Montana and the effects of corporate political spending on a national scale. Through this gripping story, P.O.V. uncovers the shocking and vital truth of how American elections are bought and sold.

"Dark Money" follows local Montana journalist John S. Adams, who is determined to uncover the truth about funding in his state's elections. Over the course of three election cycles, he solves the increasingly complicated, blurred, and mysterious financing behind our elections. The film offers numerous perspectives on dark money donations—the unlimited campaign contributions from undisclosed donors, individuals, and corporations, that have been allowed since the 2010 Supreme Court ruling on Citizens United.

Adams notes that when campaigns can receive unlimited sums from anonymous donors, hidden from public scrutiny, the consequences are clear: "Then it's not the people controlling the government, it's the government controlled by a corporation controlling the people...and it's happening."

In Montana, many of the voices against dark money are Republican. Debra Bonogofsky, a small business owner, is running for the Montana State House of Representatives on a campaign that promotes "fiscal responsibility" and small government. Bonogofsky considers resisting dark money groups a matter of integrity: "If you don't vote the way they want you to vote in the legislature, they will target you the next primary," she says, "even if you're a conservative Republican."

"Dark Money" not only offers a glimpse into what many of the most powerful people and groups don't want you to see, it also gives voice to the many pioneers on both sides of the aisle in the crusade against unlimited, anonymous campaign contributions. As Americans approach another pivotal election season, this film examines some of the most crucial pillars of our democracy.

"Dark Money" on P.O.V. airs on 3-2 Monday, the 1st at 9:00 p.m., Sunday, the 7th at 9:00 p.m., and Sunday, the 14th at 12:30 p.m. On 3-1, it airs Sunday, the 7th at 9:00 p.m.

Why three seconds? That's how long it takes to drive the length of a football field, send a message, or choose a song.

Secrets of the Dead follows forensic experts and a team of historians and scientists as they investigate this woman's story and the time in which she lived, revealing a vivid picture of what life was like for free African American people in the North.

Taking viewers back to 1619, on the edge of the breathtaking but untamed Virginian wilderness sits the English colony of Jamestown. The settlement barely survived its first decade, but is on the brink of

change summoned by the arrival of a new governor and 90 so-called "maids to make brides" — a bid to establish the town as a prosperous place for all.

Their descendants roam free on the island today.

Ownership of the herd now belongs to the volunteer fire company on nearby Chincoteague Island. To keep the population in check, the firemen hold an annual auction and sell the foals. Buyers come from across the country and Canada for a chance to bid on a Chincoteague pony.

The Wild Ponies of Chincoteague follows the annual Chincoteague wild pony swim and auction, as well as one teenager's journey to buy her first foal. Sabrina Dobbins, a teenager who has struggled with depression, is attending the auction this year to find a pony to help with her recovery.

For nearly four months, Bishop survived on apples and rain water, waiting for God to save her, during one of the coldest winters on record.

Bishop's experience raises questions about society's treatment of people with mental health conditions and those who are displaced, exposing systemic failures to protect those who cannot protect themselves.
