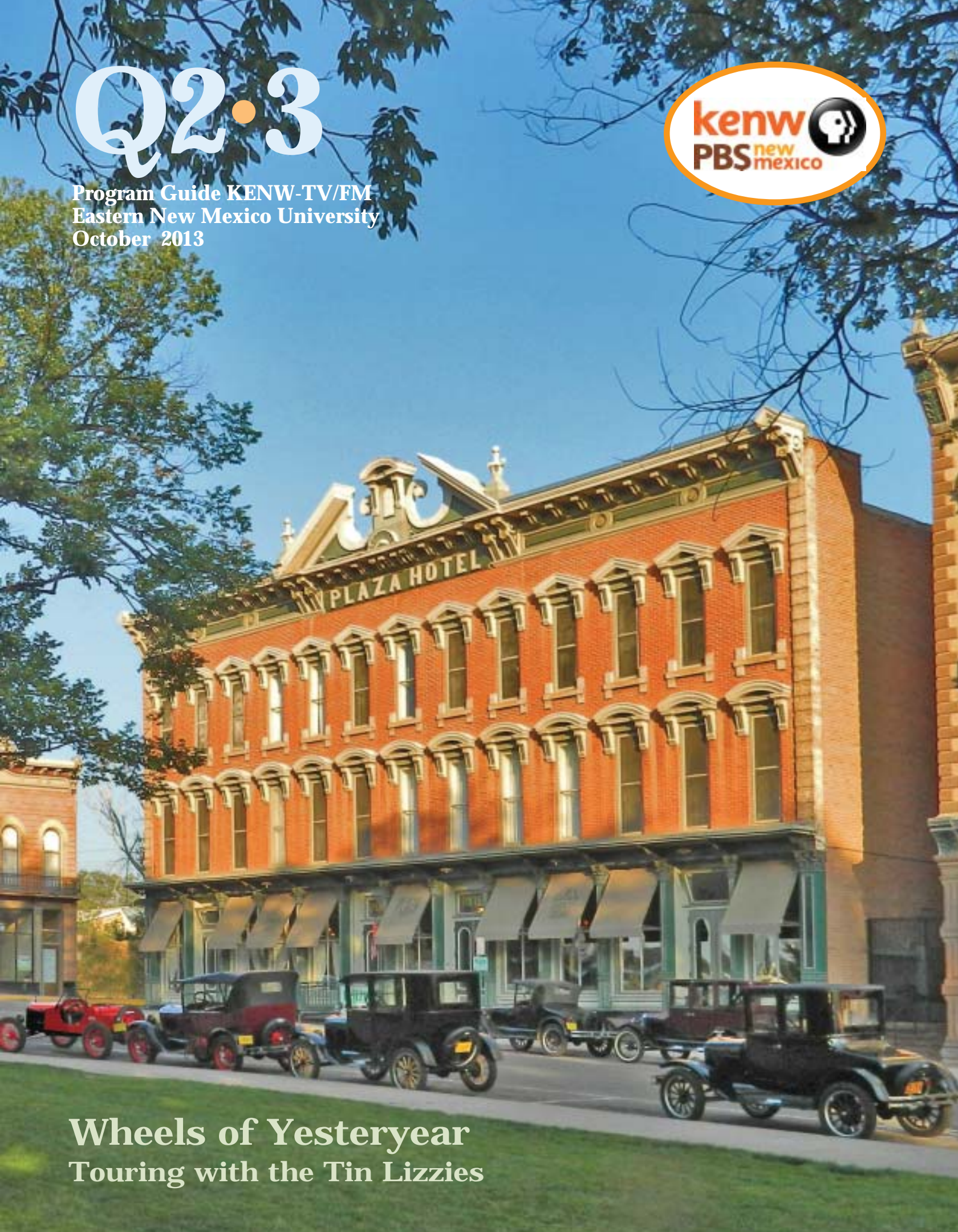

LEAGUE OF DENIAL

The NFL's Concussion Crisis

The National Football League, a multibillion-dollar commercial juggernaut, presides over America's indisputable national pastime. But the NFL is under assault as thousands of former players and a host of scientists claim the league has tried to cover up how football inflicted long-term brain injuries on many players.

What did the NFL know, and when did it know it? What's the truth about the risks to players? What can be done?

In a special two-hour investigation, "League of Denial: The NFL's Concussion Crisis," **Frontline** and journalists Mark Fainaru-Wada and Steve Fainaru of ESPN reveal the hidden story of the NFL and brain injuries drawn from their forthcoming book, *League of Denial: The NFL, Concussions and the Battle for Truth*.

"League of Denial: The NFL's Concussion Crisis" investigates how, for years, the league worked to refute scientific evidence that the violent collisions at the heart of the game are linked to an alarming incidence of early-onset dementia, catastrophic brain damage, and other devastating consequences, even death.

The investigation draws on more than 200 interviews with scientists, doctors, and former players, including some of the NFL's all-time greats, as well as previously unpublished medical records, NFL memorandums and e-mails.

Hour one of "League of Denial" chronicles the discovery of a devastating neurological disease in the brain of the Pittsburgh Steelers legend Mike Webster, chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE), which was likely incurred during Webster's 17-year NFL career.

As **Frontline** reports, the response from the NFL to Webster's diagnosis was swift. The league demanded a retraction of the scientific paper explaining the diagnosis, insisted there was no evidence linking football to chronic brain disease, and used its own

heavily funded research arm to try to kill the findings and discredit the researchers behind them.

"For the most part, people didn't want to believe it's true," a former team physician for the Steelers tells **Frontline**. "They didn't want to admit to themselves or anybody else that our beloved sport, probably our most popular sport, could end up with brain damage."

The discovery of CTE in Mike Webster was only the beginning. Hour two investigates how the NFL responded to the growing body of scientific evidence that football was putting the brains of its players at risk. But professional, adult athletes aren't the only ones at risk. As **Frontline** reports, scientists are finding evidence of CTE in high school athletes, too.

The league recently settled a lawsuit by 4,200 former players who claimed football led to brain damage—avoiding both any admission of guilt and the scrutiny of a public trial. But questions about the link between football and brain damage aren't going away any time soon—and may threaten the very future of the game.

"If we believe that the violence that is inherent in football is setting off a sort of cascading neurological effect in your brain that may leave you prematurely brain-damaged, completely change you as a human being and even kill you, how many people are going to want to play it?" asks Steve Fainaru.

WAR OF THE WORLDS

We interrupt this program to bring you a special bulletin ...

On October 30th, 1938, just after 8:00 p.m. on the east coast, the millions of Americans tuned to CBS Radio were treated to an unusual dramatization of H.G. Wells's classic *The War of the Worlds*, performed by 23-year-old Orson Welles and his Mercury Theater on the Air.

Although most listeners understood that the program was a radio drama, perhaps a million or more were plunged into panic, convinced that America was under a deadly Martian attack. Timed to air in conjunction with the 75th anniversary of Welles's notorious radio broadcast, **American Experience** presents "War of the Worlds."

It took place on the night before Halloween, long known as Mischief Night. It began like any other Sunday evening, with millions of Americans tuned to their radios. But beneath the outward calm was a nation tense with worry and fear; the Great Depression refused to let up, and the threat of war in Europe loomed larger every day. Then, at 8:15 p.m., the voice of a panicked announcer broke into the dance music with a news bulletin reporting that Martians had landed in the tiny town of Grover's Mill, New Jersey.

Almost instantly, frantic listeners responded to the shocking news. Chicago newspapers were flooded with calls; in St. Louis, people gathered outside to discuss what to do about the "invaders"; in San Francisco, many feared that New Jersey had been laid to waste and that the Martians were heading west. Callers pleaded with the power company in Providence to shut off the lights so that the city would not be seen by the invaders. And in cities and towns across the country, people stopped a moment to pray—then grabbed their loved ones and fled into the night.

Seventy-five years later, "War of the Worlds" explores this legendary but misunderstood event. With the CBS radio broadcast serving as its narrative spine, the film examines the elements that came together to create one of the biggest mass hysteria events in U.S. history: our longtime fascination with life on Mars; the emergence of radio as a powerful, pervasive medium; the shocking Hindenburg explosion of 1937, the first disaster to broadcast live; and the brilliant *enfant terrible* Orson Welles, the director of the drama and mischief maker supreme.

"War of the Worlds" on **American Experience** can be seen Tuesday, October 29th at 8:00 p.m. on both 3-2 and HD3-1. The program repeats on HD3-1 Wednesday, October 30th at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

The Paradise

Where Ladies Find Heaven!

Romance is always in stock at “The Paradise,” **Masterpiece Classic**’s bewitching drama set in a spectacular Victorian-era department store, where ladies shop for suits and suitors. The seven-part series is inspired by *Au Bonheur des dames* (*The Ladies’ Paradise*), Émile Zola’s story of the transformative powers of capitalism. Published in 1883, the novel describes an exciting innovation of the era: the modern department store, an engine of commerce that was ushering in a glorious new consumer age.

A love story, mystery, social comedy, and fairy tale all in one, the lavish costume drama stars Joanna Vanderham as Denise Lovett, a poor country girl who finds a job in a glittering retail palace called The Paradise. Emun Elliott co-stars as John Moray, the handsome, enigmatic owner of the establishment, which is driving smaller shops out of business, including one run by Denise’s uncle. Naturally, complications abound—including the darkly hinted fate of Moray’s first wife, whose portrait hangs like a shrine in his office, and Denise’s own secrets.

The story opens with Denise’s arrival in a northern English city to help out her uncle, only to discover that he has no work for her. She lands a job across the street at The Paradise, thanks to a snap judgment by Moray that this modest young woman has retail potential—plus other interesting qualities.

“The Paradise” on **Masterpiece Classic** airs Sundays at 8:00 p.m. for seven weeks beginning October 6th. The series repeats Fridays at various times (See AtoZ on page 2). On HD3-1, “The Paradise” airs Sundays at 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight beginning October 6th, and then repeats Mondays at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. beginning October 7th.

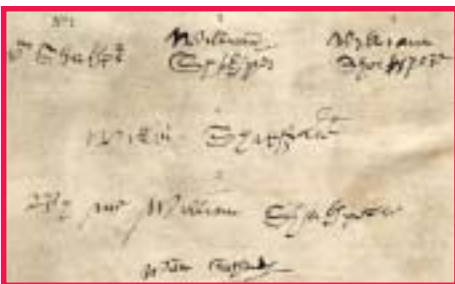

It’s a great literary mystery: who wrote the works of William Shakespeare? Hunting the Nightmare Bacteria

"Nightmare bacteria." That's how the CDC describes a frightening new threat spreading quickly in hospitals, communities, and across the globe. In "Hunting the Nightmare Bacteria," **Frontline** investigates the alarming rise of untreatable infections: from a young girl thrust onto life support in an Arizona hospital, to a young American infected in India who comes home to Seattle, and an uncontrollable outbreak at the nation's most prestigious hospital, where 18 patients were mysteriously infected and six died, despite frantic efforts to contain the killer bacteria.

Fueled by decades of antibiotic overuse, the crisis has deepened as major drug companies, squeezed by Wall Street expectations, have abandoned the development of new antibiotics. Without swift action, the miracle age of antibiotics could be coming to an end.

More than 50 years later, playwright Bruce Norris created *Clybourne Park*, a sardonic Pulitzer Prize-winning prequel and sequel.

Inspired by Hansberry's original and Norris' follow-up, Kwame Kwei-Armah, artistic director of Baltimore's Center Stage, penned a third play, *Beneatha's Place*, which follows two of the *Raisin* characters to Nigeria and its post-colonial struggles.

A Raisin in the Sun Revisited: The Raisin Cycle at Center Stage follows the process of mounting both *Clybourne Park* and *Beneatha's Place* at the same time, from the backstage challenges and first rehearsals through to the openings of both plays. THE AFRICAN AMERICANS

Many Rivers to Cross

This fall, noted Harvard scholar Henry Louis Gates, Jr. recounts the full trajectory of African-American history in his groundbreaking new series, **The African Americans: Many Rivers to Cross**. The six-hour series explores the evolution of the African-American people, as well as the multiplicity of cultural institutions, political strategies, and religious and social perspectives they developed—forging their own history, culture, and society against unimaginable odds.

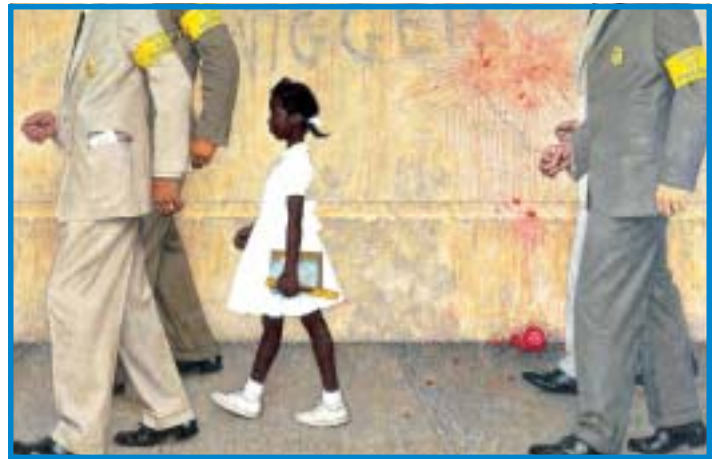
Commencing with the origins of slavery in Africa, the series moves through five centuries of remarkable historic events right up to the present—from slavery to freedom, and from the plantation to the White House.

Episode One: **The Black Atlantic (1500–1800)** Beginning a full century before the first documented slaves who arrived at Jamestown, Virginia, this episode portrays the earliest Africans, both slave and free, who arrived on these shores.

Episode Two: **The Age of Slavery (1800–1860)** illustrates how black lives changed dramatically in the aftermath of the American Revolution. As slavery intensified, so did resistance. Courageous individuals, such as Harriet Tubman and Frederick Douglass, played a crucial role in forcing the issue of slavery to the forefront of national politics.

Episode Three: **Into the Fire (1861–1896)** examines the most tumultuous and consequential period in African-American history: the Civil War and the end of slavery, and Reconstruction’s thrilling but tragically brief “moment in the sun.”

Episode Four: **Making a Way Out of No Way (1897–1940)** portrays the Jim Crow era, when African Americans struggled to build their own worlds within the harsh, narrow confines of segregation.



“**The Problem We All Live With**” is a 1964 painting by Norman Rockwell. An iconic image of the civil rights movement in the United States, it depicts Ruby Bridges, a six-year-old African-American girl, on her way into an all-white public school in New Orleans on November 14th, 1960, during the process of racial desegregation. Because of threats and violence against her, she is escorted by four US Deputy Marshals.

Episode Five: **Rise! (1940–1968)** examines the long road to civil rights, when the deep contradictions in American society finally became unsustainable.

Episode Six: **It’s Nation Time (1968–2013)** As hundreds of African Americans won political office across the country and the black middle class made unprecedented progress, larger economic and political forces isolated the black urban poor in the inner cities, vulnerable to new social ills and an epidemic of incarceration. Now we ask: How will African Americans help redefine the United States in the years to come?

The African Americans: Many Rivers to Cross with Henry Louis Gates, Jr. will be broadcast Tuesdays at 7:00 p.m. for six weeks beginning October 22nd on both 3-2 and HD3-1. On HD3-1, the series repeats Wednesdays at 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon beginning October 23rd.

RAW TO READY

Raw to Ready, a new four-part series, explores the science, innovation, and sheer genius it takes to transform the most basic ingredients into powerhouse machines. From aircraft to big rigs to earth movers, the series ventures deep inside factories to witness the hard work and craftsmanship necessary to build these incredible machines.

To extract precious metals found beneath the earth requires a massive 232-ton, two-story-tall dump truck with a load capacity of 320 tons—a giant earth mover like the Komatsu 930-E. Five essential raw ingredients—coal, chromium, mineral oil, latex rubber, and sulphuric acid—make this amazing engineering achievement possible.

It’s a century-old obsession to find the right raw materials to build a car that is fit for both king and race car driver—perfectly luxurious and perfectly fast. Episode two visits The Bentley Motor Company, which has built common raw ingredients into their signature Mulsanne, an engineering achievement made possible by aluminum, leather, iron, wood, and pigment.

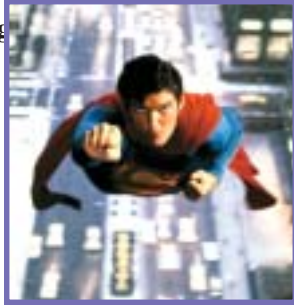
A Never-Ending Battle

Superheroes: A Never-Ending Battle, a three-part series, is the first documentary to examine the dawn of the comic book genre and its powerful legacy, as well as the evolution of the characters who leapt from the pages over the last 75 years and their ongoing worldwide cultural impact.

These “disposable diversions” were created in large part by the children of immigrants whose fierce loyalty to a new homeland laid the foundation of a multi-billion-dollar industry that became an influential part of our national identity.

The three episodes in **Superheroes** are: “**Truth, Justice, and the American Way**” (1938-1958) During the Depression, the popularity of dozens of superhero characters opens the door for a new generation of artists and writers. World War II creates a patriotic fervor for star-spangled adventurers to represent the American spirit at war and on the home front, but in the 1950s, superheroes are caught in the fire of government scrutiny and regulation.

“**Great Power, Great Responsibility**” (1959-1977) A new breed of superhero emerges in the 1960s, inspired by the age of atomic energy and space travel. The pop art movement draws heavily on comic books, with superhero images appearing in the works of Andy Warhol and Roy



Lichtenstein. Civil rights in America and other social issues make their way

onto the page as black superheroes emerge with powerhouses such as the Black Panther and Luke Cage.

“**A Hero Can Be Anyone**” (1978-Present) The final hour captures the enthusiasm for superheroes as they are embraced in all forms of media and by all demographics, beginning with the historic “Superman” movie featuring Christopher Reeve (above) as the Man of Steel. In 1986, Batman is overhauled as The Dark Knight to reflect the nocturnal underside of his character and later, the Watchman illuminates a more violent and politicized world.

All three hours of **Superheroes: A Never-Ending-Battle** will be broadcast Tuesday, October 15th beginning at 7:00 p.m. The series repeats Sundays at 11:00 p.m. beginning October 20th (one hour per week). On HD3-1, **Superheroes** can be seen Tuesday, October 15th (all three hours) and repeats Wednesdays at 6:00 a.m. beginning October 16th (one hour per week).

Saving Otter 501

“Saving Otter 501” on **Nature** is the story of the Monterey Bay Aquarium’s 501st attempt to save a stranded orphan otter. From her discovery as a newborn pup crying on the beach, through her rehabilitation in secret roof tanks atop the Monterey Bay Aquarium, follow Otter 501 as she learns how to survive in the wild. Watch as she is introduced to her surrogate mother and follow as she struggles to learn how to dive, hunt, eat, and fend for herself.

The story of 501 reveals a previously unseen world of otter behavior and also acts to illuminate one of the most difficult ecological questions of our time: Do we have a responsibility to save species that hover on the edge?

According to a recent poll, nearly half of all Americans say they believe in ghosts—the spirit of a human being or an animal that can physically manifest as an orb, apparition, dark shadow, or some form of energy. And more than one in five Americans claim to have seen a ghost or felt the presence of one.

In Kansas, the heart of the Great Plains, these spiritual interactions—ranging from playful to menacing—seem to happen with great frequency. The events and tragedies surrounding the state’s settlement, anti- and pro-slavery conflicts, disputes with the Native population, and Prohibition may have helped set the stage for these hauntings.

Based upon Beth Cooper’s book, *Ghosts of Kansas*, **PlainSpirits**, a half-hour documentary, features the first-hand paranormal experiences of dozens of Kansans. The interviewees de-



scribe their encounters with inexplicable spiritual activity, ranging from mysterious shadow figures and stirrings in the attic to phantom cigar smoke and baffling piano music to tiny handprints that appear on clear window panes at an old train depot. They detail the impact of these encounters.

The program reveals the real truth that lies beneath many of these fanciful and mysterious tales while longtime residents and business owners explain the historical significance of each haunted venue, which include former funeral parlors, hotels, a secret hidden world that lies beneath the town, a fraternity house, and a former governor’s mansion. It’s history with a twist.

OUR TIME IS NOW

Life through the lens of rural New Mexican high school students.

Our Time Is Now follows six New Mexican teens through their last year in high school as they struggle with societal pressures and personal problems to graduate, get into college, and move away. The documentary highlights the unique issues that life in the rural outposts of this vast state present—where getting to school can be as big a challenge as staying in school, and where you are the first in your family to contemplate moving away, much less attempt college.

Juan (Portales High School) comes from a single parent home, a mother who doesn't speak English, and a younger brother that needs a father figure. He struggles to keep his small family together while fighting everything from cultural stereotypes to poverty to low expectations.

Jimmy (Piedra Visa High School) struggles to stay in school. His grades are slipping, his family life is fractured, and he's one argument with his dad away from being homeless. But he knows that the only ticket out of this vicious cycle is to graduate and go to college. A talented musician, Jimmy dreams of Julliard, but hopes he can even make it to a community college.

Waylon (Cuba High School) lives so far out on the Navajo Reservation that it takes hours out of his day to get to and from school.

And that's when the weather even allows for it. He is a talented sketch artist and wants to make a life in the art world in an age when computer access and experience in the digital world is key. He lives in a home with little access to electricity and running water.

Vicky and Tiqua (Deming High School students) have been best friends for years. Tiqua comes from a stable farming family that has the resources to get her into college. Vicky's mom died and she is being raised by her older sister. Vicky works a job, plays in marching band, and keeps her grades up, but she leans heavily on Tiqua as one of the few stable influences in her life.

Mitch (Laguna Acoma High School) comes from a traditional way of life in one of the oldest Native American communities in the nation. Tradition and home are everything, yet she knows that she needs to leave to succeed. Even with a supportive family and good examples in her life, Mitch struggles with the concept of leaving everything she knows.

These kids have few opportunities to succeed, but they understand that success hinges on that first step—graduating from high school. For some of us the desire is enough. For these kids, desire is only one small requirement.

"The Graduates/Los Graduados," a new two-part special on **Independent Lens**, explores the many roots of the Latino dropout crisis through the eyes of six inspiring young students from across the United States who are part of an on-going effort to increase graduation rates for a growing Latino population. A Spanish version is available online at PBS.org and on the Spanish-language channel V-me.

Much more than a survey of contemporary policy debates, the student profiles in "The Graduates" offer a first-hand perspective on the challenges facing many Latino high school students, including over-crowded schools, crime-ridden neighborhoods, teen pregnancy, and pressure to contribute to the family finances. The documentary is an eye-opening introduction to many of the determined and resilient young people who will shape America's future.

Each episode of "The Graduates" profiles three students who were in danger of dropping out of high school. The first hour of the series tells the stories of three young women who, through a combination of educational and community resources, as well as supportive families, are able to surmount the obstacles that might have prevented them from completing their education.

In the second hour, we meet three young men who have struggled with challenges such as immigration status, brushes with the law, and bullying. With a combination of community and family support, each student is able to find a program that helps him to remain in school, further his education, and get involved in his community.

"The Graduates" on **Independent Lens** will be broadcast Mondays at 9:00 p.m. for two weeks beginning October 28th on both 3-2 and HD3-1. On HD3-1, the programs repeat Tuesdays at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. beginning October 29th.

To catch up academically and graduate, she enrolled herself in a program for at-risk students in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and her son in a Head Start program. Now both are working towards graduation day and beyond.

October is National Disability Awareness Month

Out On A Limb explores the evolution of prosthetics and the exciting advances being made at the intersection of neuroscience, engineering, and robotics. From Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Johns Hopkins Applied Physics Lab, and other leading universities, to the Amputee Coalition's camp for kids, what was once futuristic is occurring now and changing what it means to lose a limb.

Advances in prosthetics always coincide with wars, but recent conflicts have spurred unprecedented funding. At the same time, breakthroughs in neuro-engineering, such as Targeted Muscle Innervation, allow amputees to control these prosthetics with their thoughts alone.

Soldiers receive the most media attention and the most advanced prosthetics, but they are a fraction of the many millions who have lost limbs to diabetes, other diseases, landmines, and natural disasters. In fact amputees are all around us.

Sometimes advances in the field come from amputees themselves. One of them is Van Phillips. Years ago he threw away his own first prosthetic foot as well as the conventional dogma of the day that a prosthetic foot should look like a foot. Studying how animals run and the dynamics of motion, he invented the Flex-Foot,

a simple shape made of carbon graphite that revolutionized prosthetic foot design. His "Cheetah foot" caused controversy, when some claimed it would give Oscar Pistorius, the first amputee to run in the Olympics, an advantage over normal limbed runners.

Van recalls that when he was a boy, he thought all amputees must be homeless men because they were the only ones he ever saw—with their rolled up pants and peg legs. Now many amputees have come out of hiding, in large part due to the new technology.

A generation that grew up on Play-stations and computers operates these newer prosthetics easily and proudly and is ready for what's coming next. **Out On A Limb** reveals just what that is—what's on the horizon and what's beyond.

A science story and a human story, this documentary shows the impact of this transformative science, as revolutionary prosthetics move from the lab to the bodies of amputees, and particularly to children with limb loss, who stand to benefit the most.

In **Sea of Change**, Cody Unser, the 24 year-old paralyzed daughter and granddaughter of Indy 500 car racing greats, and nine war veterans living in wheelchairs themselves, are finally released from their chairs with no worry of high curbs or large steps getting in the way.

Narrated by Montel Williams, **Sea of Change** is the story of freedom through weightless movement and of self-renewal based on an experience they never believed they could have—on a reef 60 feet below the surface of the sea.

Cody, the war vets, and a research team from John Hopkins travel to the Cayman Islands to examine a surprising question: Can scuba diving positively impact the paralysis these vets and Cody deal with every day? The study explored changes that might occur physically and psychologically by experiencing the pressure and weightlessness of ocean scuba diving.

Sea of Change follows the vets as they break out of their chairs and explore the ocean reef free from the constraints of gravity, suspended like all other divers, in an undersea world.

What researchers saw in the water strongly suggested that there is some scuba-facilitated restoration of neurological and psychological function in paraplegics.

"We saw dramatic changes in a matter of days in people with spinal cord injury who went scuba diving," said Dr. Daniel Becker, M.D. "This is just a pilot study, but to see such a restoration of neurological function and significant improvement in PTSD symptoms over such a short period of time was unprecedented." Dr. Daniel Becker is Head of Pediatric Restoration Therapy, International Center for Spinal Cord Injury, Kennedy Krieger Institute.

The amazing results from the Cayman Islands experiment could forever change the way paralysis and PTSD are treated and the way those in wheelchairs live their lives.

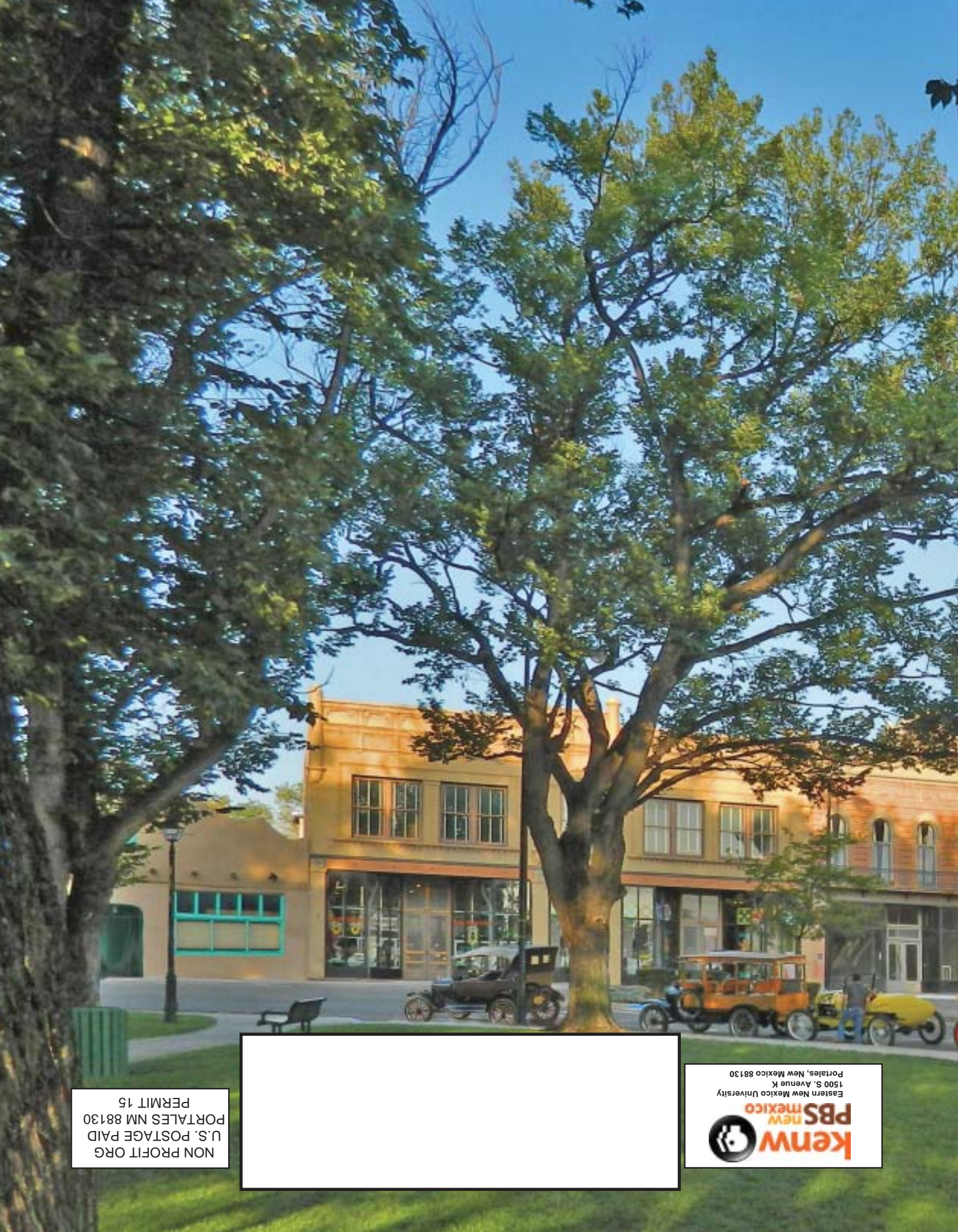
