CYBERWAR THREAT

NOVA Gains Unprecedented Access to Investigate NSA's Top Secret Cyber Weapons

The global cyberwar is heating up, and the stakes are no longer limited to the virtual world of computers. Now, sophisticated cyber weapons unleashed via the Internet can inflict physical damage—destroying control systems that regulate everything from food factories, gas pipelines, power plants, and chemical facilities to the elevators in our buildings.

It may seem farfetched that a computer program can wreak destruction from a distance. But the United States is investing billions of dollars in this new form of warfare—and we're not alone. Allies and enemies alike are rushing to develop these weapons. But what will this new arms race mean for our future? Will it make the U.S. more vulnerable to cyber attacks and retaliation? **Nova** pulls back the curtain on a top-secret world to examine a chilling new reality in "CyberWar Threat."

In this gripping new documentary, **Nova** gains unprecedented access to the entire collection of NSA (National Security Agency) top-secret archives taken by former cyber warrior, Edward Snowden, including hundreds of thousands of documents not yet released. They detail how the United States, its allies and its enemies are all searching for offensive cyber weapons and how America's quest for dominance may inadvertently be putting the US at risk.

Featuring a one-of-a-kind interview with Edward Snowden as well as former NSA employees, leading cyber-security specialists, defense experts and government officials, pioneers in cryptology, and investigative journalists who have probed the murky realm of criminal and strategic hacking, "CyberWar Threat" takes viewers around the globe to explore the invention of this new technology-driven mode of warfare and some of the actual cases in which it has been used to attack real targets. The film also reveals, through NSA's own documents, how cyber attacks may unfold and how difficult they will be to defend.

In the past, the world was largely dependent on an infrastructure of hardwires linking switches to equipment and devices. Then came the Internet, at first simply a new means of peaceful communication. Now the Internet has also become a massive industrial switch, enabling global critical infrastructures to be remotely controlled, modernizing everything from water purification systems to the national electrical grids. But those advances come with a risk: the possibility for anyone with a laptop, and the right set of instructions, to penetrate the porous web of signals that link these systems together.

"CyberWar Threat" outlines the growth of the cyber offensive in the United States. The public is already aware of controversial eavesdropping and surveillance abilities by the NSA and other government agencies. Today, the NSA—the country's largest, most powerful, and most secret intelligence agency—is also already using the Internet as a weapons delivery system for a new type of battle. From a series of leaks and a few unintended consequences, the once-hidden cyberwar being waged by the NSA is coming into full view.

The film explores the risks involved in using this new technology. In pursuit of dominance in the virtual battlefield, the United States is seen to have the overwhelming advantage—but that advantage could open the country up to attacks. In cyber warfare, the path of destruction can potentially lead right back to the country that

sent the "malware," or hidden computer viruses, and a virtual attack can often "blowback," resulting in either retaliation or infecting the attacker as well as the target.

In one case study on malicious software, **Nova** dissects the notorious Stuxnet software worm, originally developed by the CIA and implanted with Israel's assistance in an Iranian nuclear enrichment facility. Stuxnet was designed to destroy the Iranian centrifuges, and may have delayed Iran's bomb program and forestalled an Israeli attack. However, the self-replicating virus escaped and ended up infecting more than 100,000 computers worldwide. **Nova** meets with industrial control systems security expert Ralph Langner, who, with his team of cyber security researchers, was able to reverse engineer Stuxnet, determining that the virus was a military-grade cyber weapon, and unearthing clues tracing its provenance back to its creators, the U.S. government and Israel.

Because of the information revealed in documents leaked by Snowden, countries around the world now know the extent of the NSA's eavesdropping and secret planting of malware in their systems, and some are beginning to fight back. As the most Internet-connected country on earth, the United States is also the most vulnerable.

SECRET'S OF NOAH'S ARK



In 1948, a British pilot serving in Iraq acquired a clay tablet with an intriguing, 3,700 year-old inscription. The ancient writing tells the story of how the god Enki warns a Sumerian king named Atram-Hasis of a future flood that will destroy mankind; Enki gives him instructions for building a boat to save his family and livestock. If that sounds like a familiar tale, it's because this was one of several ancient flood traditions that, centuries later, would inspire the biblical story of Noah. But the tablet's inscription describes a boat very different from the traditional image of the Ark—it's said to be circular and made of reeds. Is this nothing more than a fanciful myth? Or could such a reed boat have carried Atram-Hasis' family of more than one hundred and his many animals?

Secrets of the Dead

The Real Trojan Horse

The tale of the Trojan Horse is one of the most captivating stories in Greek mythology. Immortalized in the literary blockbusters of *Homer* and *Virgil*, it features some of the most famous faces in Greek legend, from Helen of Troy to Aphrodite and Achilles. Since the 19th-century discovery of the site of Troy in modern-day Turkey, historians have searched tirelessly for evidence of a real Trojan War, Troy's demise, and the truth behind this world famous myth.

Now, archaeological evidence is mounting that suggests a Trojan War did indeed happen. What's more, the city's defenses were so impenetrable that some historians are asking whether the Trojan Horse—generally thought to have been a myth—could actually explain how the enemy got inside the walls.

"The Real Trojan Horse" on **Secrets of the Dead** explores how discoveries of charred bones and arrowheads point toward



a violent showdown around 1200 BC. It exposes the true scale of Troy's defenses and supplies, and examines evidence that discounts theories of an earthquake or siege machine weakening Troy's defenses. The film also explores the real possibility that a Trojan Horse could have been used to take Troy.

Historical engineers, using ancient records as a guide, rebuild a scientifically-sound Trojan Horse through stunning computer modeling—examining just how it might have tricked Troy into defeat.

Vampire Legend

Bram Stoker penned his gothic horror "Dracula" in 1887 and popularized the modern vampire myth—but evidence now points to those myths originating in England, not Eastern Europe as many believe. Unexplained burials, identified as "deviant" and "cursed" by their contemporaries, were detailed in Stoker's original research notes and drafts, discovered by his great-grandson in the family archive.

In "Vampire Legend" on **Secrets of the Dead**, Oxford professor John Blair follows clues in medieval burials in England that may offer insight into physiological reasons for the formation of the myths. The cases hint at a deeply-held belief that the dead could rise and bring fear to the living, a belief that predates the Eastern European legend and is forcing a reexamination of modern vampire lore.

"Vampire Legend" on **Secrets of the Dead** will be broadcast Tuesday, the 27th at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, Nov. 1st at 6:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it can be seen Saturday, the 31st at 9:00 p.m.

MASTERPIECE HOME FIRES

At the heart of a rural English village on the verge of the Second World War, a diverse group of women with personal struggles, conflicting views, and a shared mission forge a community that will inspire their finest hour. Separated from husbands, fathers, sons, and brothers for years at a time—some permanently—they find themselves under extraordinary

pressures in a rapidly fragmenting world. Samantha Bond (*Downton Abbey*) stars in the moving wartime drama "Home Fires," which airs in six inspiring episodes on **Masterpiece**. The series is based on *Jambusters*, Julie Summers' history of Britain's Women's Institute.

In August 1939, war with Germany is all but certain. While citizens of the isolated village of Great Paxford each face the prospect of war in their own way, all agree that they must do everything they can to hold their village—and their nation—together. But when the value of the largely social group, The Women's Institute, is called into question, forward-thinking Frances Barden (Bond) and snobbish Joyce Cameron (Francesca Annis) clash over the fate of the Institute and the roles its members can play, far from the front.

Big Birds Can't Fly

Sir David Attenborough explores the evolution of why "Big Birds Can't Fly" on **Nature**. When most people think of birds, what common attributes typically come to mind? Many will cite a bird's ability to fly,

sing, and use its feathered wings to take flight. So it may seem a bit strange that included in the more than 10,000 species of birds in the world today is a group that literally cannot fly or sing, and whose wings are more fluff than feather. These are the ratites: the ostrich, emu, rhea, kiwi, and cassowary. How and why these birds abandoned flight has puzzled scientists since Darwin's time, but as this program shows, DNA and dedicated research are helping to solve these mysteries.

Attenborough explains how birds evolved and continue to survive despite their inability to soar. He calls ratites the "Flintstones of the bird world" because their lineage can be traced back to the age of the dinosaur. Surprisingly, DNA from the bones of extinct ratites compared with that of today's flightless birds shows their common ancestors actually could fly. But when dinosaurs became extinct 66 million years ago, these ancient birds no longer needed to take flight from predators.

With newly unimpeded access to food, their size increased — their legs grew long and strong, their bodies large and fat. Eventually, they became excellent walkers and runners, but they'd also become too heavy to fly. Each of them evolved to this state completely independent of one other, on entirely different continents in the southern hemisphere.

School Sleuth:

The Case of the Wired Classroom

While technology and the Internet changed the rest of our world a long time ago, America's schools have lagged behind. Now, federal and state governments are spending billions to get our classrooms up to speed, and teachers everywhere are wrestling with this new challenge. With trillions of dollars to be made in the education industry, it's difficult to separate the hype from reality. Are tablets, laptops, smart phones, virtual teachers, and cyber schools actually translating into greater success for students?

That's the question PBS education correspondent John Merrow sets out to answer in **School Sleuth: The Case of the Wired Classroom**. Going inside schools in California, Arizona, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, and elsewhere reveals the mixed results students and teachers are experiencing across the country. Merrow learns that our 'digital divide' is growing wider; more surprising, he discovers that even the advantaged are at a disadvantage, because more than 75 percent of students do not have access to high-speed Internet in school, and most teachers have not been trained in how to use the technology they already have.

Merrow visits so-called "cyber schools," where more than 300,000 kids take all their classes online at home. One of the most common problems for these students is just getting the technology to work. He also takes viewers inside a school where students spend half their day on the computer, raising every parent's question, "How much screen time is too much?"

It is noted that 70 percent of students go to for-profit charter schools, backed by companies like K12, whose online schools often rank at the very bottom compared to brick-and-mortar and other virtual schools. As the film shows students participating in their online classes by entering questions and answers in a chat box in the corner of their computer screens, one teacher comments that most of her students did not graduate last year.

Merrow also takes time to highlight many schools and online programs that have integrated technology into the classroom with amazing and inspiring results.


