Ground Zero Supertower

Nova kicks off the fall season with a return to Ground Zero to witness the final chapter in an epic story of engineering, innovation, and the perseverance of the human spirit: the completion of One World Trade Center. "Ground Zero Supertower" on **Nova** examines the new skyscraper rising up 104 stories and 1,776 feet from the site where the Twin Towers once stood.

In this update of **Nova**'s "Engineering Ground Zero," **Nova** goes inside the construction of the tower's final floors and the

installation of its soaring, 800-ton spire and beacon. The program also goes underground to see another engineering marvel taking shape here: the construction of a museum that will house artifacts from 9/11. The greatest test is still to come, though. Will the final product be a fitting site for national remembrance?

How did the Brotherhood lose control? Could the U.S. have done anything to alter the course of events in Egypt? With unique

access to the Brotherhood's leadership, **Frontline** follows the Islamist movement as it plots its next move.

A Landmark Six-Hour Series

Latino Americans is a landmark three-part, six-hour documentary series narrated by actor Benjamin Bratt. It is the first major documentary series for television to chronicle the rich and varied history and experiences of Latinos, who have for the past 500-plus years helped shape what is today the United States and have become, with more than 50 million people, the largest minority group in the U.S.

Latino Americans documents the evolution of a new "Latino American" identity from the 1500s to the present day, featuring interviews with close to 100 Latinos from the worlds of politics, business, and pop culture, as well as deeply personal portraits of lesser-known Latinos who lived through key chapters in American history.

Latino Americans vividly tells the stories of early settlement, conquest and immigration; of tradition and reinvention; of anguish and celebration; and of the creation of this new American identity with an influx of arrivals from Mexico, Spain, Puerto Rico, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, and countries in Central and South America.

Latino Americans begins as the first Spanish explorers enter North America, on through the 1880s as the U.S. expands into territories in the Southwest that had been home to Native Americans and English and Spanish colonies. From 1880 into the 1940s, an influx of Cubans, Mexicans, and Puerto Ricans begin arriving and start to build strong Latino-American communities.

The series moves into the World War II years and those that follow, as Latino Americans serve their new country by the hundreds of thousands. Into the early 1960s, the series details the creation of the proud "Chicano" identity.

Then the final hour takes viewers through the past 30 years, as hundreds of

thousands Salvadorans, Nicaraguans, and Guatemalans flee civil wars, death squads, and unrest to go north, transforming the U.S. along the way. The debate over undocumented immigrants flares up, with a backlash that eventually includes calls for tightened borders, English-only laws, and efforts to brand undocumented immigrants as felons. Simultaneously, the Latino influence is booming in music, sports, media, politics, and entertainment.

The largest and youngest growing sector of the American population, Latino Americans will determine the success of the United States in the 21st century.

Latino Americans will be broadcast Tuesdays at 7:00 p.m. (for three weeks) beginning September 17th on both 3-2 and HD3-1. The series repeats each night at 12:00 midnight on HD3-1 only.


Invisible Women: Forgotten Artists of Florence

Florence, Italy, the cradle of the Renaissance, gave rise to some of the world's most celebrated artists, and yet little is known of the city's trailblazing female artists. **Invisible Women: Forgotten Artists of Florence** sheds light on the lives and works of these largely forgotten Renaissance-era painters.

High-tech equipment assists in the removal of centuries of decay and brings pre-

cious pieces of art history—salvaged from storage facilities throughout Italy—back to life.

The program highlights the conservation of "Lamentation

Brains on Trial with Alan Alda

As brain scanning techniques advance, their influence in criminal cases is becoming critically important. An innovative two-part series, **Brains on Trial with Alan Alda**, explores how the growing ability to separate truth from lies, even decode people's thoughts and memories, may radically affect how criminal trials are conducted in the future.

Brains on Trial centers around the trial of a fictional crime: a robbery staged in a convenience store that has been filmed by the store's security cameras. A teenager stands accused of the attempted murder of the store clerk's wife who was shot during the crime. While the crime is fictional, the trial is conducted before a real federal judge and argued by real practicing attorneys. The program is divided into two-parts: the first hour examines the guilt phase of the trial, concluding with the jury's verdict; the second hour looks at the sentencing phase, when arguments for and against a severe sentence are heard.

As the trial unfolds, Alda visits with neuroscientists whose research has already influenced some Supreme Court decisions, as well as Duke University law professor Nita Farahany, a member of the Presidential Commission for the Study of Bioethical Issues. On these visits, neuroscientists show how functional MRIs and other brain scanning techniques are exploring lie detection, facial recognition, memory decoding, racial bias, brain maturity, intention, and even emotions. The research Alda discovers is at the center of a controversy as to how this rapidly expanding ability to peer into people's minds and decode their thoughts and feelings could—or should—affect trials like the one presented in the program.

Brains on Trial will be broadcast (Pt. 1) Wednesday, September 11th at 9:00 p.m. and (Pt. 2) Wednesday, September 18th at 9:00 p.m. on both 3-2 and HD3-1. It repeats Thursdays at 8:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. and Sundays at 3:00 p.m. on HD3-1 only.

NATURE Earthflight

What would it be like to see the world from a bird's perspective? State-of-the-art technology and sophisticated camera techniques have now made it possible to do just that and more as "Earthflight," a new six-part **Nature** presentation, takes viewers on a breath-taking aerial adventure over six

continents. Witness some of the world's greatest wildlife spectacles, struggles, migrations, and stunning landscapes from a bird's-eye view.

It took an "Earthflight" team four years to film more than 100 bird species in 40 different countries. Whether retracing the North American flight paths taken by thousands of migrating wild snow geese traveling to their Arctic breeding grounds or witnessing the

aerobatics of devil rays as they somersault and splash back into the sea, the goal was to show the world on the wings of birds.

To get remarkably close flying shots of wild vultures in South Africa, cameramen on paragliders piloted by biologists utilized the same updrafts and thermals as the birds they were there to film. And tiny HD cameras on the backs of trained birds captured amazing viewpoints that have never been seen before, such as a bald eagle soaring through the

Grand Canyon in search of food.

In Haiti, **The Adventists 2** examines the faith-based support given to victims after the devastating earthquake. In Brazil, young missionaries bring much-needed medical support to the most remote regions.

In Malawi, Africa, a hospital opened in

1902 as a leper center, today treats thousands with HIV-AIDS.

A stateof-the-art hospital in China exem-



plifies the collaboration between a conservative religion and a facility of a communist state. And in the Dominican Republic, volunteer doctors and nurses travel annually to a remote part of the world to perform operations and offer critical care.

The films—that chronicle a bloody tale of family, politics, and power—tell the rise and fall of three Kings and how their destiny shaped English history.

He is ultimately overthrown by his cousin Bolingbroke (Rory Kinnear), who ascends the throne as Henry IV (Jeremy Irons). Henry IV's reign is marred by his own guilt over Richard's death, civil war, and the gnawing fear that his son Hal (Tom Hiddleston) is a total wastrel unworthy of the throne. When Hal comes to the throne as Henry V, he is left to bury the ghosts of his father's past while fighting both the French forces and his own inner demons.

From Presidential progeny to felonious forebears, family secrets are uncovered in the surprise-filled new four-part series Genealogy Roadshow. Part detective story, part emotional journey, the series features participants who want to explore unverified genealogical claims passed down through family history, which may (or may not) connect them to an event or a historical figure.

Two Nashville participants have documents they believe make them distant cousins of a famous 19th Century frontiersman. In Austin, a Hispanic woman wants to learn whether or not she has a connection to the "Daughters of the Republic of Texas." In some cases, the series unites participants with family members they never knew existed.

Wings for Maggie **Ray** pays tribute to the remarkable life and legacy of Margaret "Maggie" Ringenberg (1921-2008), a U.S. Army Air Force WASP (Women's Air Service Pilot) and renowned



long-distance aviation racer. Although WASP pilots were not allowed to fly combat missions, they served grueling, often dangerous duties, such as ferrying, test flying, and target towing.

Maggie raced in every Powder Puff Derby from 1957 to 1977, every Air Race Classic since 1977, the Grand Prix, and many others, garnering over 150 trophies for her accomplishments. She completed the Round-the-World Air Race in 1994 at age 72, and in March 2001 at the age of 79, she flew in a race from London to Sydney.

American MASTERS **Billie Jean King**

For the first time, American Masters profiles a sports figure: Billie Jean King (born November 22nd, 1943), a determined woman who has been a major force in chang-

ing and democratizing the cultural landscape.

American Masters commemorates the

40th anniversaries of the Billie Jean King v. Bobby Riggs "The Battle of the Sexes" match in 1973 and the founding of the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) by King on June 20th of that year. This new film traces the incredible life of the single most important female athlete of the 20th century as her 70th birthday nears.

American Masters looks back to the 12-year-old Long Beach, California, girl who played tennis on public courts, observed disparity and, as she soared athletically, never stopped trying to remedy inequality. During her professional tennis career, King won 39 Grand Slam titles, founded the Women's Sports Foundation and Women's Sports magazine, and co-founded World TeamTennis (WTT). Her competitiveness on the circuit was matched by her efforts on behalf of women and the LGBT community, and her commitment to prove there is strength in diversity.

Skeletons of the Sahara

Skeletons of the Sahara tells the story of scientist Paul Sereno's amazing discovery of a prehistoric human burial ground 5,000 years older than the Egyptian pyramids in the middle of one of the world's most forbidding deserts.

Sereno, one of the world's leading experts in finding fossils of dinosaurs and ancient crocodiles, is on an expedition to Niger, in Saharan Africa. Six weeks into a three-month journey, Sereno's team makes an unexpected discovery. They find bones all right, but these bones don't belong to prehistoric beasts—they are human bones, the last remnants of a people who lived from 10,000 to 5,000 years ago when this now forbidding landscape was a thriving culture on the edge of a vast lake. Sereno's team counts the remains of dozens within a few minutes.

Skeletons of the Sahara tells the story of this find and what it reveals to us about two civilizations that once thrived, thousands of years apart.





Landscapes Through Time with David Dunlop

In Landscapes Through Time, art historian and artist David Dunlop travels to thirteen beautiful, iconic locations (seven in France and six in the U.S.) that were sources of inspiration for some of the world's master painters, such as Monet's water lily garden in Giverny, Van Gogh's asylum in Provence, and the Hudson River Painters' Kaaterskill Falls in New York.

David first presents the personal, artistic, and historic context in which the artists worked and examines the evolution of their artistic lives. He then places his easel at the exact locations where the artists set theirs and paints the same scenes, demonstrating

the individualized style and techniques of each painter while discussing artistic, technical, optical, and perceptual insights. He explains each step of the process, showing how they painted and revealing techniques and secrets of the masters.
