Arthur & George

The Game Is On — for Real

Martin Clunes (Doc Martin) stars as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, the creator of Sherlock Holmes, in a real-life case that inspired the great author to put down his pen and turn detective. Tracing a string of notorious animal mutilations alleged to involve an attorney named George Edalji, **Arthur & George** airs in three gripping episodes on **Masterpiece**.

The Edalji case saw an improbable defendant, mild-mannered lawyer George Edalji, convicted for mutilating a pony and, by implication, a host of other farm animals. The anonymous misdeeds also included poison pen letters and intimidation aimed, oddly enough, at George's family. To Doyle, the whole affair suggested blatant racism, targeting a family viewed as outsiders by the local people and officials.

Arthur & George opens with the illness and death of Doyle's wife, Louisa. Wracked with guilt because he fears that Louisa suspected his attachment to another woman, Jean Leckie, Sir Arthur is at a low ebb—until he receives a letter from the recently paroled George, who wants the world-renowned author of Sherlock Holmes to help him clear his name so he can resume his legal career.

Doyle uncovers a rush to judgment against Edalji that provides plenty of suspects and even a connection to the real criminal mastermind who inspired Professor Moriarty.

Exasperated by the mounting twists and turns, the harried author exclaims at one point, "If this were a story, I'd change the beginning, I'd change the end, or I'd try something else!"

Arthur & George will be broadcast Sundays at 7:00 p.m. with a repeat at 10:30 p.m. beginning the 6th. On HD3-1, it airs Sundays at 10:30 p.m. beginning the 6th and repeats Mondays at 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon.

Indian Summers

The Raj, Romance, & Revolution

An international cast star in "Indian Summers," an epic of India on the cusp of change. In 1932 the height of privilege was to be British in India, and the high point was the summer season at the hard-partying colonial retreat of Simla in the Himalayan foothills.

Set during the twilight era of the British Raj, the meticulously recreated series airs in nine episodes on **Masterpiece**.

Framed by the beginning and end of the summer season, when India's British rulers left the hot plains for the cool slopes of Simla, "Indian Summers" centers on three brother-sister pairs. First is a private secretary to the British Viceroy of India, who is a politically ambitious bachelor hiding a checkered past. He is joined by his beautiful younger sister who appears suddenly from England with her little boy—and conspicuously without her husband.

Next there is an idealistic clerk in the elite Indian Civil Service, whose career is threatened by his sister who tirelessly agitates for national independence.

Then there are two adrift Americans: an expatriate architect from a wealthy Chicago family stricken with malaria, and his seductive sister who comes to care for him.

Pulling the strings that animate much of the action is Cynthia Coffin (Julie Walters), a manipulative military widow who presides like an empress over the Royal Simla Club, where the ruling class lounges in subtropical splendor, sipping gin and tonics, running the country, and dancing the night away...until rude reality intrudes on their spectacular paradise.

"Indian Summers" on **Masterpiece** will be broadcast Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 27th with a repeat Fridays at 10:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 27th and repeats Mondays at 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Pope Francis - The Sinner

Pope Francis – The Sinner looks at how an Argentinian Jesuit named Jorge Mario Bergoglio became the most powerful figure in Catholicism, and how he is working to modernize a church in crisis.

Since his election to the papacy in 2013, Pope Francis has been hailed as a revolutionary, but he faced a daunting task: to simultaneously reform the troubled Catholic Church and keep it from falling apart. In just two years, he has put Roman Catholicism back on the map as a faith that has something to offer a troubled world. He's beginning to revolutionize a church that was losing its way. His simplicity, down to earth style, and concern for those on the margins, have roused affection from believers and non believers alike.

Hearing from Argentinian Jesuits who lived with him, the program explores his reputation as a hard-line authoritarian. A self-proclaimed "sinner," Pope Francis was both loved and loathed by his fellow Jesuits according to friends, contemporaries, and students of Fr Bergoglio, who give their first hand experience of the man they knew.

THE CIVIL WAR

Epic series to air 25 years after original broadcast.

Abraham Lincoln—the first U.S. President to be assassinated—was shot by John Wilkes Booth on Good Friday, April 14th, 1865, and died the following morning, just six days after the Confederacy surrendered to the Union Army. As



the country marks the 150th anniversary of Abraham Lincoln's assassination and the end of the Civil War, PBS is rebroadcasting Ken Burns award-winning film, **The Civil War**. The broadcast coincides with the 25th anniversary of the 1990 original broadcast.

The Civil War series focuses not only on the grand sweep of armies, but on the daily

life of private soldiers, the hopes and fears of men and women at home, and the countless daily tragedies that made the war the family drama it was.

The war was fought in 10,000 places, from Valverde, New Mexico, and Tullahoma, Tennessee to St. Albans, Vermont and Fernandina on the Florida coast. More than three million Americans fought in it and over 600,000 men, two percent of the population, died in it.

The 12-1/2-hour **Civil War** is the most ambitious, comprehensive, and definitive history of the War ever put on film.

The Civil War airs over five consecutive nights, Monday through Friday, the 7th–11th at 8:00 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs the same five evenings beginning at 7:00 p.m.

AMERICA'S RIFLE: THE M1 GARAND

America's Rifle: The M1 Garand served the US Armed Forces from 1936 to 1957 and beyond. It was the standard issue infantry rifle of WWII and it was a masterpiece of genius and simplicity. It was one of the most widely produced rifles in American history, totaling five and a half million.

The M1 Garand was a groundbreaking rifle—an 8-shot semi-auto that combined ingenuity, industrial mass production, and firepower into a single, solidly built infantry weapon. At 9-1/2 pounds of wood and steel, the M1 Garand helped turn the United States into a superpower.

America's Rifle: The M1 Garand airs Tuesday, the 8th at 10:30 p.m. On HD3-1, it airs Thursday, the 17th at 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

FRONTLINE

My Brother's Bomber



For some 25 years, **Frontline** producer Ken Dornstein has been haunted by the bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 over Lockerbie, Scotland—the terrorist act that killed 270 people, including his older brother David. Now, in "My Brother's Bomber" on **Frontline**, a suspenseful three-part serial, Dornstein sets out to find the men responsible for one of the worst attacks on Americans before 9/11.

From the ruins and chaos of post-Qaddafi Libya, Dornstein hunts for clues to the identities and whereabouts of the suspects, whom he tracks for almost five years across the Middle East and Europe. With each episode, Dornstein encounters new witnesses and unearths fresh evidence that brings him closer to the truth.

This rare, real-life spy thriller is also a timely reflection on the legacy of America's long war on terror and a meditation on loss, love, revenge, and the nature of obsession.

Wilson's work on ant communication led to his remarkable studies of advanced social behavior throughout the animal world.

When his studies turned to human behavior, the new and controversial discipline of sociobiology was founded, creating an uproar in the scientific community.

Wilson was also embroiled in a debate about the theory of evolution, which brought him into conflict with biologists who fiercely oppose his theory of "group selection."

E.O. Wilson culminates with his work in Gorongosa, the great National Park of Mozambique, which brings together the great themes of his life and work: nature and humanity's place in it.

Gorongosa Park – Rebirth of Paradise, a four-hour series which also airs this month, joins conservationists on one of the largest wilderness projects ever attempted: the restoration of populations of magnificent creatures to a million war-damaged acres.

Art and Craft

The jig is up for art forger Mark Landis.



Mark Landis could be described as a genuine work of art. His Southern accent and genteel manner recall Truman Capote at his grandest. Landis occasionally masquerades as a priest, sips brandy from a Phillips' Milk of Magnesia bottle, and has dedicated much of his life's work to a non-existent sister.

He is also one of the preeminent art forgers of our era and the subject of "Art and Craft," a captivating, compassionate, and often humorous documentary on **POV**.

Over the course of 30 years, Landis successfully presented his fakes as originals. His paintings hang in galleries across the country alongside those of Matisse, Monet, Picasso, and many others. All told, he has donated hundreds of works over the years to a staggering list of institutions across the United States.

Unlike most art forgers, Landis was never in it for the money. He gave away his forgeries. One of his primary motivations: he wanted acceptance and respect. "Art and Craft" will likely earn him both, and perhaps confer cult status on the mild-mannered 59-year-old.

Preventing Teen Pregnancy

He was 15. So, we both had this mentality, you know, nothing's going to happen to us. We never really had that talk about like, what could happen, the consequences. So I became pregnant at the age of 14. I was in the 8th grade.

According to a recent study by The National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy, 39% of teens say they have never thought about what their life would be like if they were to get pregnant or cause a pregnancy.

Pregnant: Preventing Teen Pregnancy, a one-hour special produced in New Mexico, is designed to help youth, parents, and community leaders throughout the state combat one of the highest teen pregnancy rates in the country.

A series of 'think tanks' with youth and adult experts reveals that, according to producer/director Chris Schueler of Albuquerque, "Surprisingly, lots of youth are using contraception, but it's the wrong kind or not used correctly."

The other important issue that comes to light is how awkward it is for youth and even adults to talk frankly about the issue. Even though we think that parents should be involved in the sex education of their children, very few children want to talk to their parents about sex at anytime throughout their lives.

In a discussion about how to break through the awkwardness and begin a discussion about healthy relationships and sex, 'think tank' members suggested that such a conversation needs to have humor so that it's not completely serious and scary. Thus, the program includes clips from a 1953 Sex Education film narrated by a very young Lorne Greene (before he was "Pa" on *Bonanza*).

Pregnant also highlights expert views on various statewide programs that are making a difference in New Mexico, including the GRADS program, TOP program, Plain Talk, Young Fathers of Santa Fe, Birds and Bees Texting Service, School Based Health Centers, and others.

Swiss endurance athlete Serge Roetheli's desire to raise money and awareness for children suffering across the globe propelled him to run a distance equal to the earth's circumference. Along with his wife Nicole, who drove a motorcycle with their supplies, they executed the journey of a lifetime.

Leaving from Sion, Switzerland in 2000, they returned five years later having traversed six continents and 35 countries. Alone in the world's most unforgiving landscapes, they confronted challenges that threatened to push them beyond their physical and emotional limits—extreme weather, civil unrest, deadly disease, horrific poverty, and a variety of other life-threatening events.

Their Run For Kids raised approximately \$400,000 to support children's centers in many of the countries they visited.

On Two Fronts: Latinos & Vietnam

On Two Fronts: Latinos & Vietnam captures a complex aspect of the Vietnam War: the legacy of Latino veterans and their families during the conflict. The 90-minute program examines the Latino experience during a war that placed its heaviest burden on working-class youth and deeply affected Latino communities.



These six marines were from Morenci, a small Arizona town with a population of about 1,800.

The film conveys the rich heritage of military service, a deeply rooted part of Latino cultural identity in the U.S. The film also explores the changing attitudes amid the growing Chicano anti-war movement within a community reeling over disproportionate rates of participation and mortality.

In communities where there were few alternatives to service, the war exacted a heavy toll among Latinos. For many, the

price of service was too high. Latino veterans still suffer post-traumatic stress disorder in higher percentages than black and white American veterans. Many of the Latinos who went to war returned ill prepared for college and to the same limited career options they had before leaving home. If one reason Latinos fought for their country was to trade service for career benefits, then Vietnam's legacy did not always fulfill that promise.

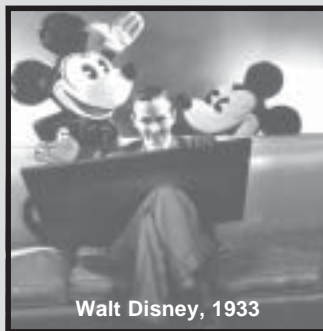
In 1966, the year Walt Disney died, 240 million people saw a Disney movie, 100 million tuned in to a Disney television program, 80 million bought Disney merchandise, and close to seven million visited Disneyland. Few creative figures before or since have held such a long-lasting place in American life and popular culture.

American Experience offers an unprecedented look at the life and legacy of one of America's most influential storytellers in "Walt Disney," a two-part, four-hour film.

As Disney rose to prominence and gained financial security, his work became increasingly celebratory of the American way of life that made his unlikely success possible. Yet despite the success he achieved, he was a demanding perfectionist on whom decades of relentless work and chain-smoking would take their toll. His attention to detail and quest for innovation frequently meant delays and cost overruns.

Though a polarizing figure, his true believers vastly outnumbered his critics and Disney's achievements remain indisputable.

Guerrero: A Photographer's Journey" showcases an in-depth, exclusive interview with Guerrero alongside his photography to explore his collaborations with three of the most iconic American artists of the 20th century: architect Frank Lloyd Wright and sculptors Alexander Calder and Louise Nevelson.

Using his outsider's eye to produce insightful portraits of important modernist architecture, Guerrero became one of the most sought-after photographers of the "Mad Men" era, yet his story is largely unknown.

HARD TO BELIEVE

Hard To Believe is essentially a murder mystery. Murder seems to have been committed, perhaps tens of thousands of murders. The mystery is why so few people seem to be paying attention.

Hard To Believe examines allegations that political prisoners in China have been killed for their organs. The issue comes alive through compelling testimonials: a refugee doctor who removed the organs from a living person; an Israeli surgeon who campaigned to end transplant tourism; a crusading human rights lawyer; and a journalist who conducted a 7-year investigation.

The persecution of a Buddhist based spiritual practice, Falun Gong, is integral to the story. At the same time that hundreds of thousands of Falun Gong practitioners were placed in labor camps by the Chinese government, Chinese hospitals launched a full out marketing campaign to attract transplant tourists. An independent investigation estimated that 65,000 prisoners of conscience were killed for their organs over a six-year period, and the practice may be continuing.

Just as in a murder mystery, you do not see a crime committed. The **Hard To Believe** documentary presents the evidence, letting viewers decide.
