Even though students are hired part-time at our station, they are not necessarily part-time employees for an entire fiscal year. Although the number of part time employees increased during the fiscal year, the FTE did not have a drastic variance, as can be seen in the SABS report.

The white, non-Hispanic female professional category contains 2 employees for FY15, whereas FY14 only has one. An employee was hired to take the position of a retiring employee (as accounted for in section 1.5), so two people were classified as "full time" during the fiscal year, although each person only worked "full time" for half a fiscal year.
