Discussed the educational benefits of travel and the importance of conservation and learning about anthropology and archaeology to better understand people and cultures around the world. O'Donnell presented information about his experiences travelling and living around the world in more than 40 countries, including a 1,500 mile walk he did over five months talking with people in Denmark and the book he wrote based on that experience. O'Donnell also studied and worked in natural resources and land conservation in the Southwest, including being a founding member of the New Mexico Wilderness Alliance. Discussion about O'Donnell's current guest lectureship in creative writing at Eastern New Mexico University in Portales, NM, and educational opportunities available for area community residents.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Shippen Salas, program director for the nonprofit Ski Apache Adaptive Sports program at the Ski Apache Ski Resort in the Sacramento Mountains of southeastern New Mexico, about how the program provides skiing and snowboarding opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds with physical and/or cognitive disabilities and impairments. Discussion concerning the therapeutic benefits of the adaptive sports program, which provides both exciting and calming experiences outdoors in the mountains. The Ski Apache Adaptive Sports program began in 1976 as a rehabilitation outreach for Vietnam Veterans stationed at Fort Bliss in West Texas, especially veterans experiencing PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) and TBI (Traumatic Brain Injury). The program now works with a variety of active duty military personnel and military veterans and their families, including providing a winter retreat.

Discussion about dispelling myths about bone marrow donation and educational information to help the public better understand the process of donating bone marrow and how it saves lives. Bone marrow donation can help save lives for people suffering from leukemia and other blood cancers, as well as about 70 other diseases. The residential program at the children’s home offers children from troubled family environments a chance to live in cottages with house parents in rural eastern New Mexico, attend public schools in the region and take part in a variety of community programs such as raising animals through 4-H and sports activities. The program’s goal is to help children have hope and realize their potential in life. The single parent program provides safe, secure apartments and support for single parents where they can raise their children while pursuing an education at nearby colleges and universities and/or job training so they can be empowered on a path to greater independence.
