TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with Susan Finch in Ruidoso, New Mexico, about the nonprofit organization COPE (Center of Protective Environment), which serves adults and children affected by domestic violence in Otero and Lincoln counties in southeastern New Mexico. COPE helps domestic violence victims and the children of victims and also works with perpetrators of domestic violence to provide counseling and education to prevent future domestic violence, and teaches people to create and live in more peaceful environments.

TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): In-depth interview with a meteorologist with the National Weather Service office in Albuquerque, NM, about the free NWS Training program called the Skywarn Spotter program. The NWS Skywarn Spotter program provides free training classes to educate people about severe weather and weather hazards so they can spot and report severe weather in their local communities and rural areas and so they can learn how to handle living through severe weather, especially severe weather common in the KENW listening region of New Mexico and West Texas, such as tornadoes, thunderstorms and flooding in the spring and summer.

NMHU offers a weeklong free series of programs and community outreach activities and events in rural northeastern New Mexico to provide information and resources to area families about how to learn more about their family ancestry and history and how to preserve and protect family documents, including the use of new technology, such as digital family records. The activities in northeastern New Mexico are designed to coordinate with similar activities nationwide as part of the Family Preservation Week the last week of April.

The regional Habitat for Humanity organization also helps area residents year-round through the "Brush With Kindness" program that provides assistance with minor restoration and repair construction projects at individual homes.

The county clerk discussed the early voting process and how to change voting party affiliation before the primary election in New Mexico. The county clerk provided additional information to educate the public about changes in the voting process, such as the ability of 17-year-old legal New Mexico residents to register to vote if they will be 18 years old by the time of the November 2016 general election.

Ramos discussed how her parents brought their family from Mexico to live in the United States and moved to Hereford, a small, rural, ranching and agriculture community in West Texas. Ramos graduated high school there and decided to pursue her dream of working in Spanish-language television broadcasting by enrolling in a four-year college education degree plan at Eastern New Mexico University in Portales, N.M. Ramos is becoming the first person in her family to graduate from college by obtaining a bachelor's degree in Communication-Broadcast Production and by working at KENW for four years as a student broadcaster on News 3 New Mexico, a student-produced, professional evening news broadcast on the KENW PBS-affiliate regional TV station.
