TYPE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM (Format, participants, content, etc.): Portales police officer was punched in the head and face numerous times before the scuffle with a criminal suspect resulted in the officer being shot, officer Laurenz was hospitalized in Lubbock with non-life threatening injury. Anthony Ortega 28 of Portales was charged with aggravated battery, disarming a peace officer and resisting and evading an officer, he is being held without bond in Roosevelt detention center.
