KRWG-TV is the PBS station located in Las Cruces, New Mexico. We are licensed by New Mexico State University and our offices are located on NMSU's Las Cruces campus. KRWG-TV is proud to be the only television station in southern New Mexico. We also provide unique services in the El Paso, Texas/Las Cruces, New Mexico service area.

Through meetings with citizens and community leaders, partnerships with area newspapers and other organizations, and extensive production of news and public affairs programming, the staff of KRWG-TV has determined the following issues are of primary importance to our coverage area:

Health/Welfare/Safety – While the over-all crime rate is no higher than the national average, poverty and a higher than average teenage population contribute to a gang and crime problem. Poverty also results in health and welfare issues including an above average social services caseload and a high number of welfare cases handled by the local hospital.

Culture – The mix of Hispanic/Native American/ and Anglo cultures provide many positive attributes to life in southern New Mexico. Cultural and historical understanding is of great importance.

Business - With an above-average unemployment rate and a below-average income level, the status of the business/agricultural community in southern New Mexico is crucial. Concern over the constant issue of defense spending at the federal level is ongoing in this area due to the presence of several military and NASA installations. Dona Ana County is also actively seeking new businesses and a strong infrastructure exists near the Santa Teresa Border Crossing to boost border trade.

Politics/Public Affairs – Southern New Mexico and the United States have a wide variety of contentious political issues that are of constant interest to the citizens of the involved communities.

Education – With a constantly growing population of children, many of whom use Spanish as their primary language, the school systems in the KRWG-TV viewing area are constantly trying to provide facilities and teachers to meet this growing school age population with limited funds. New Mexico is one of the poorest per-capita states in the nation, which results in a chronic shortage of funds for local education.

Water/Environment – KRWG-TV is located in a desert with two major sources of water: the Rio Grande River and an aquifer that supplies

drinking water to Las Cruces and surrounding areas in the Mesilla Valley. Water is the lifeblood of the region and conflicts are escalating over the requirements of a growing urban population and agriculture.

Last week thousands of people across the country turned out for March for Our Lives rallies to call on elected officials to address gun violence and school shootings, including here in New Mexico. Producer Sarah Gustavus sits down this week with some of the Albuquerque student organizers to talk about the change they hope to see in their schools and communities.

Correspondent Megan Kamerick sits down with Lt. Col. Cindi Feldwisch, who was one of the “First Five,” the first group of women to become part of the Air Force Honor Guard. Feldwisch, who retired from the Air Force after 34 years, talks about breaking barriers and her dedication to service.

NMiF host Gene Grant and the Line opinion panelists look at how New Mexico cities miss out on tax the state collects from Amazon, and debate the federal government’s seizure of a bank account with \$10.1 million in gambling revenue from Pojoaque Pueblo.

Suicide prevention is especially important in New Mexico, which has one of the highest suicide rates in the nation. Producer Sarah Gustavus sits down with Wendy Linebrink-Allison, program manager for a crisis support line, to learn more about resources that are available for people who want to reach out for assistance for a loved one or themselves.

NMiF host Gene Grant and the Line opinion panelists discuss the Albuquerque City Council’s 5-4 vote to reduce the penalties for possessing small amounts of cannabis. They also debate how the financial mess in the University of New Mexico athletics department may jeopardize funding for the whole university, and look at a recent report from the Alzheimer’s Association that says New Mexico has the nation’s fourth-highest growth rate of the disease.

This week on *New Mexico in Focus*, correspondent Antonia Gonzales sits down with academics from UNM's Native American Studies and Chicana/Chicano Studies to learn why graduate degrees in these programs are important and what the future might look like for scholars in their departments.

Correspondent Khalil Ekulona and members of the Albuquerque Sol Football Club discuss the growing popularity of professional soccer in the United States, and how the team intends to raise its profile in New Mexico.

And *NMiF* host Gene Grant and the Line opinion panelists look at Attorney General Hector Balderas' threat of possible legal action against the University of New Mexico over the AG office's investigation into the institution and debate a federal judge's decision to toss out a lawsuit over Chaco-area drilling. The Line also discusses how the clash between federal and state laws affects a young preschooler who is currently prohibited from receiving her seizure-preventing medical cannabis on school grounds.
