Friday, July 5

DEPART U.S.

Depart the U.S. on your overnight flight to Stockholm, Sweden.

Saturday, July 6

ARRIVE STOCKHOLM, TRANSFER TO SHIP

Arrive in Stockholm, where you will transfer by private coach to the port to board the *Star Flyer*. Board the ship and settle into your cabin before gathering for the Captain's Reception and Welcome Dinner. In the evening sail for Visby, Sweden. **D**

Sunday, July 7

ARRIVE IN VISBY (GOTLAND, SWEDEN)

Visby can trace its history to the early Vikings. The prominent powder tower of Kruttomet is Visby's oldest structure. A walk tracing the 13th-century city walls, the Visby Ringwall, leads to the Maiden's Tower and the historic ruins of Dalmasnporten's many medieval churches. Explore the interesting shops in Wisbystrovet and St. Hans. *B/L/D*



Monday, July 8

AT SEA

You will have a chance to relax and enjoy the *Star Flyer's* ambience and amenities and talk with your fellow passengers as you cruise in the Baltic Sea and the Gulf of Finland. Today, and on next Wednesday you'll have time to explore this modern clipper ship that combines the romance of sailing ships with contemporary comforts and amenities. Winds permitting, you might climb (with a safety harness!) to the crow's nest for a panoramic view of the coast and the sea. Enjoy the pools, the Belle Époque library, the spa and the convivial Piano Bar. *B/L/D*

ARRIVE IN TALLINN, ESTONIA


The ship will anchor for the day in the port of Tallinn, a remarkably well-preserved medieval city. Its defensive walls are studded with the distinctive fairytale pepper-pot towers. The city's many historic sites including the elaborate Kadriorg Place, built by Peter the Great for his wife, the Rotermann Quarter's restored factories and new buildings provide a contemporary view of Tallinn. St. Catherine's Passage is a charming lane in the Old Town where local artisans sell their crafts. *B/L/D*

Thursday, July 11 & Friday, July 12

ST. PETERSBURG, RUSSIA

There are two days to sample some of St. Petersburg's magnificent sights and treasures. The city was conceived and built by Peter the Great. The vast collections in the Hermitage Museum, the former Winter Palace, include important works by Italian Renaissance artists, Rembrandt, Matisse and Picasso. The Peterhof Palace, inspired by Versaille, allows you to enjoy lavish fountains culminating in the splendor of the Grand Cascade. Perhaps visit the suburb of Pushin and the onion-domed Catherine's Palace at Tsarskoe Selo or Marinsky Theatre, formerly the Kirov Ballet. *B/L/D*

Saturday, July 13

HELSINKI, FINLAND

Finland's compact capital city is an attractive melding of the old and new. Helsinki is the World Design Capital for 2012 and the Design Museum displays the best of contemporary Finnish products. Contrasting with the modern are the grand neo-classical style buildings around Senate Square. Suomenlinna fortress is one of the largest sea fortresses in the world, built in 1748 and now a prime residential area with around 900 inhabitants, cafes and restaurants. Helsinki also has ample green spaces, including parkland, gardens and old wooden villas around Toolo Bay. *B/L/D*

Sunday, July 14

HANKO, FINLAND

Hanko, a pretty seaside town with a beach, sits on a peninsula and is a popular sailing destination for leisure craft exploring its archipelago. Pine trees and a spectacular re-brick water tower dominate the skyline. It was once a popular spa town and restored wooden villas, some of them now restaurants, can be found in the Spa Park. Hanko has the tallest lighthouse in the Nordic countries, which can be visited along with its café and museum on the uninhabited island of Bengtskar. *B/L/D*

Monday, July 15

MARIEHAMN, FINLAND

The Aland Islands nestle between Finland's west coast and Sweden, and Mariehamn is their capital. You may choose to visit the museum ship, Pommern, a four-masted barque built in Glasgow in 1903 with exhibits of photos of her journeys around the world. Other interesting sites include the 13th-century castle of Kastelholm, the historic farmstead of Jan Karlsgarden, plus numerous small medieval churches. *B/L/D*

Tuesday, July 16

STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN

Disembark in Stockholm this morning and transfer to the Stockholm Arlanda Airport for the first leg of your flight home. **B**



NOTE: In the event of unsatisfactory weather or wind conditions, *Star Flyer* reserves the right to proceed under motor power in order to meet itinerary requirements.













Main Deck

RESERVATION, DEPOSIT REQUIREMENT & FINAL PAYMENT SCHEDULE

The quickest and best way to make a reservation is to call us at 1-800-491-1148 between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday through Friday. You may also request a reservation online at www.ccjourneys.com or www.smallshiptravel.com. Early registration is strongly recommended for the following reasons: Group size is limited (24 on Cultural and Family Journeys; 20 on President's programs; we use small-ship cruise lines with a small number of cabins—choice cabins ALWAYS sell out quickly; single accommodations are subject to availability; some trips require additional preparation time and airlines restrict seat inventory.
