Dave,

Here is an early draft of what pilot E Poll Books legislation might look like. You need only look at the last section, the yellow highlighted draft legislation starting on page 10 through page 16. I have left the other material in, just to keep track of what the affected laws are, a potential approach toward the laws, and how much more work has to be done before a draft is ready. (Quite a lot.)

As you can see, a lot of laws are affected. The two drafts I saw weren't much of a start, although I did try to address the issues raised. I have no idea yet whether a voter registration interface would be ready in time, but that seems far from clear. Unless I missed an email from Keval, PCC has yet to get back to us on the status of similar voter registration interfaces involving E poll books, particularly data from KnowInk. PCC seems OK with uploading voter history from voter intake lines, at least in principal.

The Standards Board will be in session throughout tomorrow and much of Friday, but feel free to call me. I will try to call you during a break. We are at the Sheraton Carlsbad Resort and Spa in Carlsbad, California. I am interested in what the legislators are looking for.

I am sharing this with Colleen, who has some ideas and input on the subject.
