Deputy Scanlan,

As you know from discussions with Representative Pat Long (BMA Chair) last week, the City of Manchester is exploring ways to improve election day performance while strengthening the integrity of the voting process. We are looking at electronic checklist technology currently used in the majority of states across the country that should significantly reduce voter wait times at the polls and, if implemented statewide, prevent the ability of a voter to vote in multiple precincts in New Hampshire. For the municipalities, this would also eliminate months of staff time performing post-election data entry and manual scanning of the checklists because the voter history and turnout is captured in real time on election day.

One of the products available represented by our current election vendor, LHS Associates, was presented to us in a demo last month. LHS Associates, along with representatives from KNOWiNK (manufacturer) and from Apple, will be here in Manchester on **Wednesday, March 30**th at **10:00 a.m.** in the **Aldermanic Chambers** for another demonstration and to answer any questions about the product. Mayor Gatsas and Chairman Long are closely involved in this process and would like to invite you, Secretary Gardner, and your team to attend the presentation to see if a solution like this would be viable statewide. Please feel free to forward this to whomever you feel might be interested in attending the demonstration. It is my understanding that you wanted to extend this invitation to Chairman Brad Cook of the Ballot Law Commission as well.
