Meet our Founder and Director

Christopher Allen grew up in a musical family in St. Louis,



Missouri and had studied a variety of instruments before discovering his true love of the double bass. When at the age of 12 he was introduced to jazz on the bass by his new music teacher and he was hooked! During his high school years he served as principal bassist with the celebrated St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra, under the direction of Leonard Slatkin, Gerhardt Zimmerman, and Catherine Comet. During college he

was winner of the 1983 St. Louis Symphony Scholarship Competition, and received his Bachelor of Music degree from Webster University in 1984. He has held positions, many as principle bassist, in a number of orchestras in cities around the country. His appearance in the Charleston Symphony 1994 Midwest tour of "Porgy and Bess." brought to him the Gershwin American jazz influence. He has also been featured as a guest soloist in St. Louis with the University City Symphony, The Gateway Festival Orchestra, and the Florissant Valley Symphony Orchestra. Most recently, he has appeared as feature soloist with the Marshall Symphony Orchestra and the Shreveport Summer Music Festival. Christopher moved to Shreveport, LA in 1998 in order to take a full-time position with the Shreveport Symphony Orchestra. Since then he has performed with many other regional orchestra's in the area. He has always been first call for jazz bass parts in these orchestra's playing with such names as Steve Lippia, Byron Strippling, Ray Charles and Michael Williams. He also served as the conductor of the Ark-La-Tex Youth Symphony for ten years, and led a group of double bass students called the "Bass Cats" Through the years he has kept his jazz playing active in nightclub gigs and shows. Presently he performs at various local venues on Wednesdays and Thursdays evenings at "2Johns Steak and Seafood" in Bossier City and on Sunday evenings at Chianti Italian Restaurant in Shreveport.
