## PRESS RELEASE: UVM Administration Salary Growth

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While UVM's top administrators are warning faculty and staff to prepare for substantial program cuts and probable layoffs, their own ranks and salaries have been growing far faster than faculty and staff, at rates far outpacing changes in student enrollment.

United Academics, UVM's faculty union, has analyzed salary data for the last decade, 2003-2012. (See accompanying chart and graph.)
Across that period, the total spent on salaries for top-level administrators* more than doubled, growing $\mathbf{1 3 2 . 4 \%}$. This is an annualized growth rate of $\mathbf{9 . 8 2 \%}$.
The average salary of top administrators also increased significantly faster than faculty pay, a total of $\mathbf{5 3 \%}$ (vs. $\mathbf{3 9 \%}$ for faculty) over the past decade. The average administrator salary is now $\mathbf{\$ 2 1 0 , 8 5 1}$, or $\mathbf{2 . 6 5}$ times the average salary of a full-time faculty member.
The number of top-level administrative positions expanded over $\mathbf{5 2 \%}$ over this period, outpacing student enrollment (up $40 \%$ )** or the size of the full-time faculty, which grew only $10 \%$.
