Spring is here!

The tulips and daffodils have broken ground, the animals are out of hibernation, and the folks here at WAMC are finally emerging from the studios to let the sun shine on their faces. So what better way to brighten our month than to highlight some of our WAMC produced programs? They're shows that we know many of you already love, but maybe you've moved away from them, or have forgotten when they're on. So let's get this show on the road!

Did you know that *51% the Women's Perspective* is the only weekly syndicated show in the nation devoted entirely to women's issues? With Susan Barnett at the helm, the show has been revamped and in recent shows she's spoken with Food Tank co-founder Danielle Nierenberg. This new think tank, devoted to the issues surrounding food, hopes to highlight how hunger, obesity, climate change, unemployment, and other problems can be solved by more research and investment in agriculture. On *51%* we've heard about how the United States is one of the only countries in the world that doesn't offer paid parental leave and we've looked at estimates from Women for Women International showing that seventy percent of the world's poor are women. You can hear *51%* Thursdays at 8PM, and repeated Wednesdays at 3PM.

Now think about it, who isn't concerned with their health or the health of a loved one? *The Health Show* looks at the newest studies and examines new perspectives on the long-standing ones. Just

family, just as you are part of our family. By getting to know each and every one of us, we grow our community. The names and faces are familiar.

In addition to the age issue, research which we are privy to shows that our most popular program is Morning Edition from NPR. When we assemble a panel to discuss the regional perspective on the very news our listeners have just heard, people tend to stick around. It's a great transition between the hard news and Joe's interviews and community conversations which so many people (including me) look forward to. We are including social media in the mix and often the conversations extend long after the program has ended. We still have Vox Pop every day at 2 PM which gives people a chance to call in and express their opinions, or use social media to make contact. I hope that everyone will give the new format a chance. Frankly, I love it. I think Joe does a masterful job of moving things along and keeping the discussions lively and interesting.

Another matter is the one thing that matters most to me and that is civility. I hear from so many of you who love and appreciate the radio station. I also occasionally hear from people who are frustrated that they can't have their book or memoir featured on the station. A lot of people listen to this station. Most people understand that we do what we can but occasionally there are people who are very, very rude. The other day I had a screamer on the phone that you would not have believed. When I do the Vox Pop program I insist on civility. Every once in a while we get someone who thinks it's fun to start screaming. That's why we have a "dump button." I have only had to use it a few times but one really wonders how some people's mothers raised them.

Despite my carping about misbehavior, I really have to tell you that almost everyone I speak with tells me how much they love and treasure the radio station. Five hundred people can tell you how much they appreciate WAMC but if one goes for your jugular, it is upsetting. But hey, you know that. - Alan

Make sure you're up on the latest in health and medicine Thursdays at 3PM and Sundays at 6:30PM.

When you're at a dinner party and the question 'What are you reading?' comes up, you want to have a little more to contribute than just the book's title. You want to be in the know on the author's thoughts when they created a character or decided to kill someone off. *The Book Show* will get you there. Host Joe Donahue delves into the minds of authors like Juno Diaz, Stephen King, Jodi Picoult, Margaret Atwood, and so many more. So get the skinny on the newest and most important books Tuesdays at 3PM and Thursdays at 8:30PM.

And of course you can get your daily dose of awesomeness with our nationally syndicated modules. Each day you're treated to the latest in academic research from universities and colleges from around the world with *The Academic Minute*. That's right, around the world! We've had professors submit their work from Israel, Australia, England, and Demark, and talk about research on how scientists are looking at the regenerative properties of animals to help human amputees; how penicillin changed the sexual revolution; how even the smallest light can disturb your sleep; and the creation of a material with the ability to heal itself. At 7:33AM & 3:56PM each day you can have you're a-ah! moment.

On the ecological side, listeners have been captivated by *Earth Wise*. This daily module looks at our changing environment by tackling issues like alternative energy, fossil fuels; the carbon sequestration in soils and forests; the history and future of mass extinctions; and a frankenbug. It's your daily dose of environmental news weekdays at 11:10AM and 4:04PM.

So that's just sample of the great shows we produce in house, and we'll take a look at more as the months go on.

Tax break resurrected for IRA-based charitable giving

If you're taking a required minimum distribution (RMD) from an IRA in 2013 and want to help a favorite nonprofit institution, there's good news. You can get a tax break on that RMD on the portion that you pass on as a charitable contribution, thanks to legislation passed in the wake of the fiscal cliff.

If you're just reaching the age (70.5) that you have to start taking RMDs, you may not be familiar with this concept. It's called a Qualified Charitable Distribution, and it's had an odd history of being an on-again, off-again option since Congress first authorized QCDs for the 2006 tax year. For all of 2012, the QCD option wasn't available, although many were expecting it to be returned to the IRS rule book by Congress at some point.

The law gave taxpayers a very narrow window of taking advantage of the tax break for their 2012 taxes – letting those who took an RMD in December 2012 designate some of it to a charitable institution by Feb. 1, 2013. For most taxpayers, what's important is that you can use the tax break with any RMD you take during the 2013 calendar year to trim the taxes you'll owe on your 2013 taxes.

Who should consider a Qualified Charitable Distribution?

Consider this tax strategy if you:

- Don't need all of the income from your RMDs
- Make charitable gifts, but don't itemize deductions (usually, charitable donations only benefit taxpayers who itemize)
- Make large charitable gifts, but can't deduct them all because of adjusted gross income limitations
- Want to avoid being taxed on your RMDs

Be mindful of these limitations

- You must be at least 70.5 when the gift is transferred
- Total gifts cannot exceed \$100,000 per year per IRA owner or beneficiary (married taxpayers with separate IRAs can give up to \$200,000 total per year, but no more than \$100,000 can come from each spouse's IRA)
- The gift must go directly from your IRA to a public charity – not to a private foundation, a supporting organization, or a donor-advised fund
- The gifts must be outright, not part of an annuity or charitable remainder trust.
- Transfers must come from the IRAs directly to the charity. Assets in a 401(k) or 403(b), for example, need to be rolled into an IRA, and then make the transfer from the IRA directly to the charity.
- SEP-IRAs, SIMPLE IRAs and Roth IRAs don't qualify for this tax treatment

If you're thinking this sounds like a good option for you, take advantage of it now. As of this writing, it is not clear if this tax break will be offered in 2014 or later.
