

Public radio stations WBGO in Newark and WHYI in Philadelphia are seeking candidates for a shared State House/New Jersey news reporter position. Both stations are NPR affiliates.

Reporter will file daily radio news spots and on-line reports as well as occasional radio features for both stations. Reporter will be involved in special coverage plans like elections and specialty shows and programs. Reporter will occasionally file reports or features for NPR. Reporter will have daily discussions with news directors/editors to plan coverage assignments. While "home base" for the reporter would be at our bureau office at the State House in Trenton, reporter will be expected to cover big stories away from the capital.

Candidates must have knowledge of how state government works and two years of public radio reporting experience.

Candidates must have expertise in digital editing and work with multimedia platforms.

Candidates must be able to meet deadlines and work quickly and efficiently on time sensitive reports and projects.

Candidates must be flexible with hours and adaptable to coverage requirements.

Candidates must be willing to travel within New Jersey on a daily basis.

Candidates must have a commitment to excellence and be willing to work with colleagues and supervisors.
