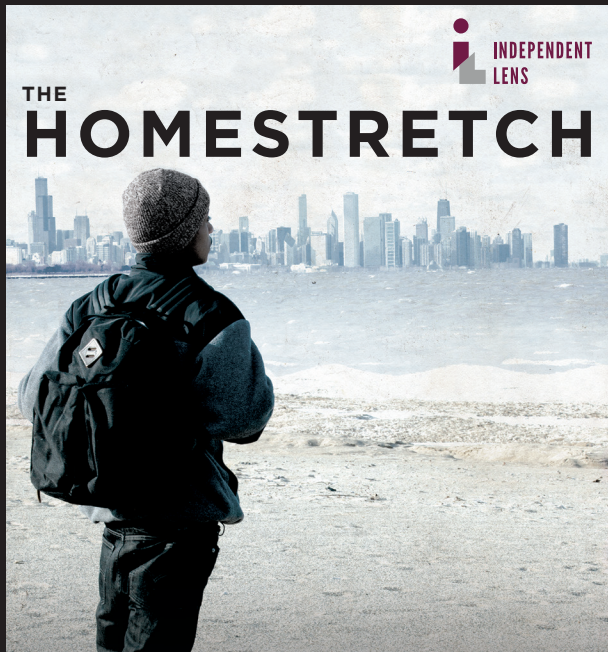


# COMMUNITY CINEMA FREE FILM SCREENINGS
