### Answers to Frequently Asked Questions:

**How long does it take for my withdrawals to start?**

It takes approximately one month from the time we receive your authorization form for your first payment to be transferred from your bank/credit union account or charged to your credit card.

**How can I increase my installment amount?**

You can upgrade your Sustaining Membership financial commitment at any time by calling Membership Services at 800 227-9668. You can also authorize the inflation guard option when you sign up for your Sustaining Membership, which will automatically increase your annual contribution by 10% each year. For example your \$10 per month contribution would automatically increase to \$11 per month the following year. You will also have the opportunity to upgrade your contribution amount each year when you receive your membership anniversary letter.

**Is my contribution still tax deductible?**

Yes! We will send you a tax receipt every January stating your total contributions from the previous year and the fair market value of any thank-you gifts you received during that calendar year.

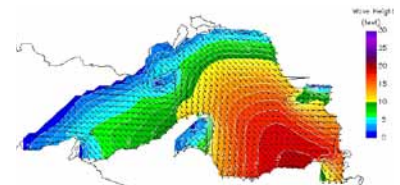

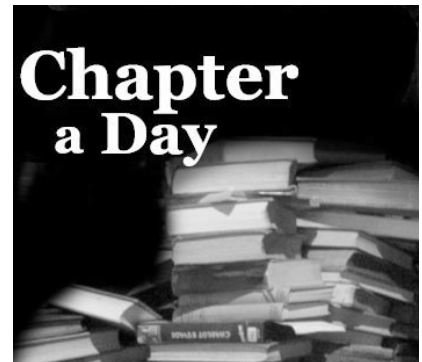

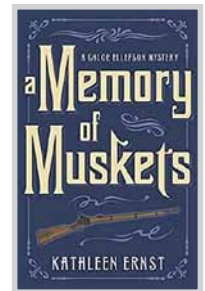
