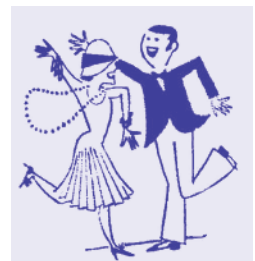
In addition to music, the Blues Fest offers workshops, a wide selection of food vendors and a beer and wine tent featuring some Upper Michigan's finest microbrews and more!

## Enamored by Budapest and Prague

Come with us to the Imperial Cities of Prague, Vienna and Budapest and view some of the most intriguing attractions in Europe. Here are two that I'm especially looking forward to. – Kurt Hauswirth

### The Fisherman's Bastion in Budapest



This is one of the top Budapest attractions, without a doubt. The lovely present-day towers and decorative fortifications of Fisherman's Bastion (Halászbastya)

were built in the 19th century to serve as a lookout tower. Now they offer the best panoramic views in Budapest, Hungary. Today's Fisherman's Bastion structure has never served as an actual fortification, but where there used to be real castle walls, tourists now gather to take fantastic photos.



*Quick facts about the Fisherman's Bastion:*

- Built from 1895 to 1902
- Looks like the logo of Walt Disney films (only nicer and older)
- Open all year round, day and night
- Entrance fees: free for the balconies and some towers, with a fee for the top turrets
- The 7 turrets to represent the 7 Hungarian tribes who founded the present-day country in 895
- Food: there is a cafe on the terrace
- Protected by the guild of the fishermen during the Middle Ages, hence the name

### The Lapidarium in Prague



While in Prague, consider taking a detour to the Lapidarium, a museum located in a summer palace on the Prague Exhibition Grounds (Výstaviště.)

The museum has a collection of around 2000 artifacts, 420 of which are on permanent display in eight halls of approximative area of 1500 square meters.

Part of the National Museum, the Lapidarium houses many of the Czech Republic's most valuable stone sculptures from the 11th to the 20th century.

In the eight exhibition halls one can admire the works of famous Czech sculptors among which are the original exemplars of the statues from The Charles Bridge, the sculptures from Loreto Church or statues that once stood in Vysehrad.
